MIDWEST SPRING JAM

BONE THUGS-N-HARMONY, TWISTA, AND DO OR DIE

SATURDAY, MARCH 14 8 PM @ FIVE FLAGS ARENA

Hip-hop legends Bone Thugs-N-Harmony will be joined by guests Twista and Do or Die for the "Midwest Spring Jam." The show will take place on Saturday, March 14 at 8 p.m. at the Five Flags Arena.

Bone Thugs-N-Harmony has been ranked among the greatest rap groups of all time. The Cleveland-based quintet debuted in 1994, shortly after Eazy-E had signed them. The following year, they released their breakout album, E. 1999 Eternal, which topped the Billboard albums chart. The album contained the hits "1st of tha Month," "East 1999," and "Tha Crossroads," which would become the group's best-performing single. It topped Billboard's Hot 100, Rap, and R&B charts in the summer of 1996. All told, Bone Thugs-N-Harmony have tallied more than a dozen Top 40 hits, the most recent coming just two years ago, when their track "Fantasy" reached #13. Throughout their career, the group has collaborated with a veritable "who's who" of music, including Mariah Carey, Tupac Shakur, Notorious B.I.G., Phil Collins, and Tom Morello (of Rage Against the Machine).

Twista has been one of the preeminent names in the Chicago hip-hop scene for more than a quarter-century. His breakout came in 2004 with the release of his album Kamikaze. The disc's lead single, "Slow Jamz," was a collaboration with Kanye West and Jamie Foxx that hit the top spot on the Billboard Hot 100 and was the first No. 1 for all three artists. Twista followed "Slow Jamz" up with his second Top 10 hit, "Overnight



Celebrity," which earned him a Grammy nomination for Best Solo Rap Performance. Twista is known for his rapid-fire delivery and was even certified as the world's Fastest Rapper by Guinness World Records. He recently appeared as a guest judge on the Netflix hip-hop competition show Rhythm + Flow.

Fellow Chicagoans Do or Die are also longtime veterans of the city's hip-hop landscape. Their first mainstream success came in 1996, when their debut single "Po Pimp" reached #22 on the Billboard Hot 100 while topping the publication's Rap chart.

Local rapper Lyric will be one of the openers.

The "Midwest Spring Jam" follows the success of last summer's Nelly concert at Five Flags, the venue's first foray into hiphop in many years. Approximately 3,400 tickets were sold for that show, one of the venue's highest-attended event of 2019.

COLE SWINDELL DOWN TO EARTH TOUR

THURSDAY, MARCH 26 7 PM @ FIVE FLAGS ARENA

Country music chart-topper Cole Swindell will bring his *Down to Earth* tour to Five Flags Center on Thursday, March 26 at 7 p.m., marking the Georgia native's first visit to Dubuque. The show features special guests Hardy and Trea Landon.

Swindell began his music career as a songwriter, penning hits for Luke Bryan, Thomas Rhett, Scotty McCreery, and Florida Georgia Line. He stepped out on his own in 2013, when he independently released his debut single "Chillin' It," a crossover hit, not only topping Billboard's Hot Country Songs chart, but also reaching the Top 30 of the publication's pop chart.

Swindell followed up that success with the release of his self-titled debut LP in early 2014. The disc was pushed to platinum certification by a string of additional hit singles, including two Country Airplay chart-toppers: "Hope You Get Lonely Tonight" and "Ain't Worth the Whiskey."

Swindell's subsequent releases have also found their way to the top of the charts, with nine of his singles reaching



the No. 1 or No. 2 position on Billboard's Country Airplay chart. Swindell was also named the New Artist of the Year by the Academy of Country Music at its annual awards in 2015, and received a nomination for a similar award from the County Music Association.

Swindell will be joined a pair of rising country singers. Hardy released his debut album, Hixtape, Vol. 1, this past September and his debut single, "Rednecker," has already moved into the Top 30 of both Billboard's Country and Country Airplay charts. Additionally, Hardy just nominated for the Academy of Country Music Songwriter of the Year award. Meanwhile, Trea Landon is currently developing a following online and through his live shows. He's toured with the likes of Luke Combs and Riley Green and has more than 200,000 monthly listeners on Spotify, where he's been featured on the "New Boots" and "New Music Nashville" playlists.

AIR SUPPLY

FRIDAY, MARCH 27 7:30 PM @ FIVE FLAGS ARENA

For the first time in nearly 38 years, legendary pop group Air Supply will return to the Five Flags Center. They take the arena stage on Friday, March 27 at 7:30 p.m.

Air Supply formed in 1975 when Graham Russell and Russell Hitchcock met during rehearsals for a stage production of *Jesus Christ Superstar* in Australia. After mild success in Australia in the late 1970s, the group broke out in the United States in 1980 with the release of their album *Lost in Love*, which sold more than three million copies. They followed that up with two more platinum albums—1981's *The One That You Love* and 1982's *Now and Forever*—plus their gold-certified self-titled effort in 1985.

Air Supply was one of the most successful groups of the early 1980s

on the singles charts. They hit No. 1 in 1981 with "The One That You Love" and reached the Billboard Top 10 more than a half-dozen other times with signature songs like "All Out of Love," "Lost in Love," "Even the Nights are Better," and "Making Love Out of Nothing At All." In addition, the group reached the Top 40 of the Adult Contemporary chart 15 times, most recently in 2010 with both "Dance with Me" and "Faith in Love."

Air Supply last graced the Five Flags stage in July of 1982, while supporting *The One That You Love*. That show followed another Five Flags performance just 10 months earlier. The two shows drew a combined crowd of more than 6,600 people.



CRAWDAD PRINCIPLE



One of our favorite summer activities is catching crawdads. We call them crawdads; you might know them as crawfish or crayfish. Growing up across from the Catfish Creek, our 8- and 10-year-old boys will spend hours trying to catch those quick little lobster looking guys.

The boys quickly learned that a crawdad's skeleton is their shell on the outside and when they grow too big for it, they go through the molting process. The only way crawdads continue to grow is to shed their entire exoskeleton. They must loosen and literally jump or crawl out of their old shell. As you might imagine, it takes enormous effort to do this, and, I'm guessing the process is probably painful too.

Once a crawdad has broken out of its shell, it is particularly vulnerable. If the crawdad survives long enough, without being crushed or eaten, the exterior of its body slowly hardens as a new, roomier shell is formed. Molting doesn't happen just once but throughout a crawdad's life. If it continues to grow, it must molt.

Our boys aren't much different than the crawdaddies they catch. They needed more protection from me when they were younger. If I continued to protect them the same today as I did when they were 4 and 6 years old, that protection would be a constraint preventing them from growing and being able to take care of themselves. What once protected them and allowed them to grow would be holding them back.

As the boys grow and shed their old shells, it leaves them exposed and vulnerable. At 4 and 6, I would have never let them go to the creek by themselves. Now, I let them go if they have their lifejackets. When they grow, they are vulnerable, and the results are surprising and sometimes unpleasant.

The process of molting requires you to extract yourself from the familiar and the comforting. This isn't easy and can be downright painful. HOLMES & WATSON

Every once in a while I get a chance to write about my favorite literary characters. Sherlock Holmes and Dr. Watson rank near the top of my favorites list: Professor James Moriarty, not so much.

Anthony Horowitz, the only writer sanctioned by the Conan Doyle estate to write Sherlock Holmes adventures since Conan Doyle died in 1930, has written an original SH short story. It runs 27 pages long and, in my humble opinion, goes by much too quickly. It's entitled *The Three Monarchs*.

SH, since the beginning of his consulting detective career, has had an abusively low opinion of the Detective Inspectors who work for Scotland Yard. There is a smidgen of discovery here that SH doesn't dismiss, out of hand, everyone who works for Scotland Yard.

One morning a knock on the door at 221B Baker Street revealed Inspector Athelney Jones of Scotland Yard seeking a consultation with Holmes and Watson. The good Inspector was introduced to Watson as "our friend." Jones was completely confabulated by a burglary where the thief was killed in media res. He called on Holmes to ask for his help with the case. As mentioned Holmes liked Inspector Jones so he agreed to help and Dr. Watson followed along.

The third house the burglar broke into was occupied. The lady of the house ran and got her husband who came armed with a pistol and he shot the burglar in the face killing him.

First, Holmes and Watson went to the morgue to visit the corpse of the thief whose identity was still unknown. Second, they interviewed the people who were burgled. Third, they had the victims' inventory of what they lost and all of them lost a china statue of the Queen commemorating her Jubilee, hence, the three monarchs. Holmes pondered that. They lost a statue of almost no value. Who was this dumb burglar? Holmes thought that perhaps the burglary happened after the killing.

Another thought passed through Holmes' mind: "When you have eliminated the impossible, whatever remains, however improbable, must be the truth." However, it didn't seem to be working that way. Holmes needed to dig a little further. He started interviewing the neighbors, and he got seemingly unrelated information that held the solution to the case. He went back to question the gunman. Everything fell into place.

The Three Monarchs by Anthony Horowitz is short but mighty sweet. You'll waste about 45 minutes reading it, and it will be time well spent.

An American writer, Anna Castle, has tried to tackle one of the paragons of British literature, Sherlock Holmes in a three book series. The first book in the series is Moriarty Meets His Match. To an adjunct member of the Baker Street Irregulars, me, Moriarty Meets His Match is a silly little experiment that crashed and burned. She upturns every aspect of the Sherlock Holmes stories that made them timeless. She seems to have forgotten you don't tug on Superman's cape, you don't spit into the wind, you don't pull the mask off that old Lone Ranger, and you don't mess around with Arthur Conan Doyle.

This is a murder mystery that the brilliant genius and former mathematics professor James Moriarty starts to investigate there at the scene where he was present until the Johnnycome-lately, the arrogant,
