

I saw a post on Facebook yesterday and my heart dropped into my gut. And then I think someone ripped it out of my gut a stomped on it with a big dirty boot.

Ryan and Gwen are writers for me here at 365ink. They are two of the most wryly humorous and self-deprecatingly hilarious people in the world. Following their relationship on Facebook, if you didn't know them, you'd think they hated each other. But instead, it's love wrapped up in tongue-in-cheek mocking scorn that is pure joy to read. That humor carries over to our advice and horoscope columns.

As two creative types, musically and beyond, they spent their early 20s being, well, young and self-destructive. When the crowd they ran with moved to the land of legal weed a couple of years ago, they stayed here, got married, bought a little house in a small town around Dubuque and most importantly for Gwen, got sober. She's not shy about talking about it on Facebook. It's a terribly hard thing to do to get clean, especially when there are depression issues involved. Ryan can look like the most chill rock and roll dude on social media, but you know the guy is a rock for her as she continues to win her fight everyday.

A year ago, just as I "rescued" my own little ball of fur, Ryan and Gwen rescued a big, dumb idiot of a love-filled German Shepherd that they named Terry Funk. Yes, named after the wrestler/actor from the '80s. Online, it was clear that Gwen was in love in about five seconds and spent the next year posting photos and video of Terry being a big lovable idiot in the best ways. A lot of people post photos of their dogs, but few do as good a job of expressing their unbridled joy and the goofy love they have for their dog as Gwen did.

She would write about singing Terry songs she wrote for him on the fly, like "Doggy, dog dog dog, Dog da dog dog dog dog dog!" Which is ridiculous. Not because it's a bad song but because I clearly wrote that song for my dog first! He was just the right medicine at just the right time for a girl who needed some big furry Terry Funk in her life as she healed from other scars.

So when I read Ryan's post yesterday, the depths to which my heart broke were many-layered.

"We just got back from putting our dog down. This morning at around 8 AM, Terry was snuggling with Gwen and, when she kissed him like she always did. He bit her in the face. She ran to the bathroom and said, 'We need to go to the hospital.' We spent the entirety of our morning getting her pieced back together: stitches on her eyelid and chin, a couple dozen stitches to reattach her bottom lip, which was barely hanging on."

There's a lot more, but that's enough for you to understand. The next hundred thoughts in my head came all at once. Terry had reacted badly with people who were not Ryan and Gwen in the past but no one had thought too much about the aggression at the time. But in light of the vicious attack on Gwen, Ryan said the signs

were all there. They just didn't want to see them. Who knows what Terry went through before they adopted him, but he has serious aggression issues. So with the consultation of their vet, they made the hardest decision anyone can make, to put down the lovable pooch that has completely stolen their hearts, especially Gwen's. In this small space that sounds like a knee-jerk reaction, but trust me when I tell you there's a lot more to it, and this was the only sensible call to make for everyone's safety.

To have to put down a pet is bad enough. I've done it. It destroyed me. I can't even begin to imagine having to do that to my sidekick when he's not sick or already dying. It's gut-wrenching and heartbreaking. As much as my dog is my constant companion, I'm very lucky that I don't have to deal with issues like depression or addiction (aside from bacon). but I can only assume that the support I get from his simple presence in my life is multiplied ten-fold for Gwen. The creature she poured all of her love into for a vear mauled her. How does that affect a person's mindset in light of the insecurities they already have, which she has been brave enough to share publicly? You would think it could break you. You'd think she might not want to trust and love anymore.


But what happened later that same day gave me hope for the future and people in general, despite its infinite sadness.
Reading about it crushed me and I started crying immediately, but it also saved me. After a long morning in the hospital being stitched back together, Gwen was still there, at Terry's side, as he had to be put down. She was rubbing his ears and telling him what a good boy he was. After all that happened to her, she didn't blame him for a minute. He's just a big dumb lovable dog whose instinctual actions were triggered... by what we will never know.

Today Gwen's Facebook is a stream of love pouring out for her lost love. "I hope you could all see how much I loved him." I promise you we can Gwen and always could.


Being the fantastic writers that the are, Ryan summed it up pretty wonderfully,

"All I can say is that we gave him a year of living like a king: run of the house, never kenneled, treats and scraps daily, peanut butter Kongs, endless scratches and rubs, and plenty of time out running on the farm with his buddies. He made Gwen so happy that any accident in the basement or misplaced step to the midsection early in the morning was worth it and then some. I wouldn't trade how that year went for anything. I'm not the one to explain how dogs work, I'm just here to look into their big dumb faces and feel better. Hug your dog tonight for me and Gwen, people. Terry was our sweet buddy and always will be."

Gwen looks pretty bruised today, but she is going to be fine and will heal completely. She may have a scar to show for it, one to match the scar on her heart. But who among us has lost a companion and not had a scar on their heart to show for it? Not all scars are bad.







#### **BEER BREWING WORKSHOP**

### DETECTING AND CORRECTING OFF FLAVORS

**TUESDAYS: JULY 24 AND 26** 

6-9 PM @ CLARKE UNIVERSITY FOOD SCIENCE LABORATORY (1550 CLARKE DR)

Clarke University will host a two-part brewing workshop in July to help home brewers take their beer to the next level.

The workshop is entitled "Detecting and Correcting Off Flavors" and will be held from 6 to 9 p.m. both Tuesday, July 24, and Thursday, July 26. The two-session workshop will be led by Clarke University chemistry faculty and will take place in the Clarke University's Food Science Laboratory in Catherine Byrne Hall (CBH 330). Snacks will be provided. Free parking is available in any campus lot or along Clarke Drive.

The workshops will cover the underlying fundamentals of the most commonly used methods used to ensure consistency and quality in craft beer.

With a hands-on approach, attendees will have the opportunity to practice quality analysis methods using use state-of-the-art lab equipment. Pilsner provided by 7 Hills Brewing Co., which is co-owned by Clarke alumni Keith '03 & Abby (Peckham) Gutierrez '04.

"Participants will learn the science behind brewing as well as valuable tips and tricks to identify and fix off flavors," said Sunil Malapati, Professor of Chemistry at Clarke.

With the 65<sup>th</sup> Annual Dubuque County Fair fast approaching, we through it was time to catch up with fair manager Kevin Kotz to see what's been happening since he took the reigns before last year's fair. It was a trial by fire. But now he's had a full year to get ready, and ready he is.

"This is my second year as a fair manager during a fair. It's nice I got that first full year under my belt. Last year I came in later, so they had a lot of that pre-planning done for me, and this year it was from scratch."

"We started on this year's fair the day after the fair last year. I was that guy who got up on stage and asked 'How'd I do?' and it got a smattering of applause. And I asked them 'Can I do better?' and I got a whole bunch of cheers and jeers. And then I made the mistake of asking 'Who do you want to see next year, here is my e-mail.' I left here at 2 a.m. that night and didn't have much, but by the time I got to my house, my e-mail went crazy. I ended up with close to 4,000 emails within two or three weeks. We got a lot of good ideas, and that's how we got the acts this year. We broke it down to who we could afford, who they wanted, and we stepped up our budget to get into some different acts. Halestorm was No. 2 from people's voting from those bands within our budget. We then sent narrowed lists to local DJs in town and gave them the list of possibles from our agent. They picked their top ten by genre, and we narrowed down that way. Then we put it back to them from the finalists and asked for top 5 and that's how we got Halestorm and Jake Owen. So we got what the people wanted and what the pros thought was best. If you ask me, I'm a Gordon Lightfoot and Jim Croce fan, and they're dead or retired and I can't afford Bruno Mars, so...

But they fair did get Ted Vigil who is a John Denver tribute artist that is so uncannily accurate, it will freak you out. That's as close as Kevin is getting to Jim Croce. But you're going to love it!

"We're getting calls from all over the country, 'What time does Ted play?"" He's putting on two shows a day, but he can only be here on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday because he's opening for a big country act elsewhere on the weekend.'

"The two ticketed main stage shows are going fantastic. We're like five or six times what we had last year at the end already. People are showing interest, tickets are going everyday."

But Kevin realizes that as good as the big concerts are, not everyone comes to the fair for the concerts—and they still want their money's worth.

"People want to see good acts for their \$10, and that's not the main stage concerts. What else did you bring for me for my gate admission? Last year we had the tigers, and they were huge hit. This year we added Extreme Raptors. It's kind of like what you see at Busch Gardens. He's got bald eagles, hawks, falcons, and owls. They're on display all the time with shows three times a day."

"Hypnotist Jim Wand will be doing nightly shows and strolling through the day. We'll have a lot more strolling acts. So Jim and his apprentices for example, will walk through buildings and hypnotize people on the spot with short six minutes shows and get the people to come to the big show later at 6 p.m. at the big top tent to be part of that show too, pre-warmed up."

"Dupaco is sponsoring our DuSpace again. This Science Safari was a huge hit last year. The kids come in there for 15 different hands-on science projects to try out. We have the bubble tower again. It's like a 15-foothigh bubble making machine that puts out 10,000 bubbles an hours. He lets kids walk on stilts to pop bubbles. I had a 78-year-old lady challenge me last year to get up on stilts and pop bubbles with her. She took the tall stilts, I took the short ones and failed miserably. She did great. We're having Scott's Crazy Magic show as a strolling act and a stage show which is a fun close-up magic show."



There are fun ways to get involved in the fair beyond just walking the grounds. A couple of those ways are through sports. Mud volleyball returns on Sunday, and you can sign up a team online. They only have so many team slots available, so sign-up now to get in. Saturday is the Barnyard Charge which features two race choices for people 16 years old and above. The Chicken Run is 1.5 muddy miles of obstacles, and the Sloppy Pig is 3 miles of even muddier mayhem, starting at 8:45 a.m. From hay bales and car to a 15-20 foot fence, this is a real challenge for the adventurous types. You can sign-up day of, but if you go online in advance, you'll be guaranteed a shirt.

"The BBQ Cook-Off is moving to the front of the Fairground this year. It has previously been off in a different part of the grounds, but this year we are lining the cooks up to the front fence line with 12 amazing BBQ pros competing for judge's pick and people's choice awards. You can buy tickets for tasting, of course."

"New this year is our strongman contest. They'll be pulling a Humvee for example, both guys and girls of all ages in national competition. They're expecting a lot of people starting at 9 a.m. on Saturday."

Kevin's goals for 2018 were not just to make the fair bigger and better, but to make it run better and also to fill the fairgrounds the other 359 days of the year.

"We've stepped up our social media marketing. You'll be able to sign up for text message alerts for the fair while you are here. And there's a lot more signage on the grounds to help you find all the amenities and golf cart shuttles driven by our queens for people with mobility issues to still get to their favorites parts of the fairgrounds.











My big goal this year is to fill up the grounds. The fair is only six days. Torquefest is a wildly popular weekend in the spring, and we've also added bingo every Monday night. We have the Hot Summer Nights Car Shows here on the first Tuesday of every month and all the other events. Excitement breeds excitement. I want people to see our fairgrounds and see that we're more than just a fair, but it all culminates with the fair."

"We want to show off those 4-H kids showing off their prized animals. There's nothing better than being a kid, 50 pounds soaking wet, showing off a 1,500 pound steer. The pride on their faces. It takes a lot of work to get that far, and this is their way to show off their talent, just like a student athlete would do on the field. I think that's very important."

"We have races on Tuesday, Wednesday and Sunday, and there's nothing better than the demolition derby on Sunday afternoon. Demo derby, fairs and corn dogs all go together and it's not quite right until you've had them all."

"We've got new food vendors this year. T&M Concessions is here, and back by popular demand is Steve's Meat World. And most importantly we still have the Knights of Columbus here, the Lions, the 4-H Food Stand, Y Men's Lemonade. What's the fair without a Y's lemonade? We've got a neat soda vendor coming. It'll look like an old world saloon, and those of us old enough will remember lemon lime and grape sodas. Fourteen different kinds of classic cola flavors you don't see much anymore. If you get a certain glass, you get free refills all day."

"The commerce building is completely full this year, no spots available, so that shows the support of the business community. Outside we've got more vendors than in the past. Car dealers and tractors on display. It's going to be an exciting fair. I'm in the process of adding something right now. Someone gave me an idea last night, and we're looking into it still this close to the event. If I can make it come true, we're going to do it."

Don't worry too much about the road construction on Highway 20 going to the fair. Coming out will be

fine, but leaving you may have to take the route out the back of the fair and take Chavenelle Dr. to the Arterial. So it's only a minute or two added to your route.

"We're ready, and I'm so looking forward to my first full year in this position. I'm going to try to get my rest in advance because I know I won't get any that week."



#### HAPPI HIBACHI

If Dubuque has a most recognizable celebrity chef, Reza Bheldy might be it. You likely don't know the name, but you've probably seen his face if you've ever been to a hibachi restaurant in Dubuque. That's because almost as long as that style of



cooking has been popular in the area, Reza has been a featured hibachi chef at the restaurants that serve it. After a few years honing his skills at Benihana in Minneapolis, MN, Reza came to Dubuque to work at Taiko Japanese Steakhouse & Sushi Bar in Key West, IA for five years followed by another five years at Ichiban Steakhouse and Sushi Bar on University Ave.


So as you can imagine, at this point Reza can probably do hibachi in his sleep—and he probably does. Putting his skills to work behind his very own restaurant has been a dream of Reza's for a few years now, and it was about five years ago that he started working toward that goal. In 2017, with the enthusiastic support of his partner both in life and this new career endeavor, Lindsey Wallace, and Lindsey's parents, Dan and Barb Wallace, who put their faith and support behind them couple undertaking this dream, they took the next step towards their goal.

And even as they just begin this journey, Reza admits that his end goal one day would be to have his own permanent restaurant. With that in mind, I mentioned how another local food truck, Beauty and the Beef, had worked their success into a permanent restaurant called American Bombshell, located in the Roshek Building Lobby. Reza and Lindsey then told us that the very cool ladies at American Bombshell actually served as mentors for them as they embarked on their food truck dreams. Lindsey met with them very early in the process where they gave her tips and tricks involved in successfully running this kind of business, giving them lots of credit for a smooth start, stating emphatically that "They were awesome!" As of Memorial Day 2018, this has been Reza's full time gig, with Lindsey and a support crew helping as needed.

So the couple found a used food truck in Davenport and remodeled it, though it did not need a lot of work as it was basically ready to roll as it was. It just needed a fresh, fun paint job to tell the world that Happi Hibachi has arrived in Dubuque. In fact, it is, to their knowledge, the only hibachi food truck in Iowa.

Hibachi is a traditional Japanese heating device, modified in America to be a metal hot plate (called teppan in Japanese), so you might hear the word teppanyaki used as well.

If you have been to a hibachi restaurant in the past, you will already have a decent idea of what to expect from Happi Hibachi. The meat and potatoes of try operation, if you will, is a fried rice base featuring chicken, steak, shrimp or a combination of those as well as a selection



At most events, they will also offer a selection of appetizers or side dishes to accompany your hibachi bowl. At our event both gyoza, also know as pot stickers, were available as were fried spring rolls. There are many other additional side options, and we'll get to those in a bit.

On board the truck, the duo, along with their hard working team, have the biggest portable rice cooker we've ever seen. They say they always have two massive batches of fresh rice ready for every event and will start more batches if the level of traffic looks to garner the need for more. Fifty-five cups of rice at a time takes 45 minutes. So you can make more as you need it, but you need to be able to look almost an hour ahead to predict that need.

They use fresh ribeye steaks in their meals; in fact, everything starts fresh each day the truck sets out. Reza painstakingly prepares all of the ingredients from scratch to get the flavor he's happy with. It's a lot of work. Starting early in the morning Reza cuts all of the vegetables for the day, never relying on precut packaged veggies. He admits that the morning prep is the hardest part of the day. And that is saying something considering how hard I saw the whole crew working when I visited the truck at the Jule Intermodal Center's recent Food Truck Friday event. After two hours of cramped cooking in a confined space with

five bodies on a hot day, Reza didn't even look hot or tired. He looked like he was having a good time.

In addition to fresh meats, one thing that sets Reza apart from other hibachi restaurants is that he very proudly makes his own sauces for use in the truck. They don't buy pre-made teriyaki sauce from suppliers. Lindsey pointed out that she was surprised to learn that there were fresh roasted apples in teriyaki sauce. This is part of the hard prep work you never see when you are enjoying the fruits (and vegetables) of their labor.

I wondered how one plans for an event when you have to have so much fresh material ready in advance. How do they plan ahead for a crowd? For the event we visited, they had prepared about 50 pounds of chicken, for example, in addition to all of the steak, shrimp and cut veggies that were on hand. The answer is that you take a good guess, and you can always make more rice in the fly.

While they do have this big cool truck, there is another aspect of Happi Hibachi that should get many of you house party lovers and business owners excited. Reza and crew will come to your house, office or special event and cook for you right in front of your guests, teppanaki-style. They have a flat-top grill like you see in the restaurants, but this one is on wheels. So in addition to the great food, you and your guests can also still get the show which includes things like the onion fire volcano, juggling the spatulas and generally turning the cooking process into a skilled vaudeville act, which is always fun for the crowd.

In fact, on the day we visited, they had another private event the same night for 30 people in Peosta.

Smaller events do not require the truck, so the cooking and presentation can be much more low key, right in your back yard if you like. To get them to your private event, there is a base charge of about \$125 to show up, where they supply all of the plates and napkins and such and set up the portable hibachi on site to woo your guests. From there, the cost depends on what you want to serve. If you go with lowest cost, like chicken fried rice, it's about \$10 per person. But like their event later this day, there are a lot of options you can add to your experience, and not we're not just talking about adding shrimp and ribeye. You might serve an appetizer like chicken satay with all three meat options, vegetables and fried rice for closer to \$20 per person.

Additional offerings at this point include dishes such as chicken satay, chicken tempura, beef yakiniku (Japanese term that literally means "grilled meat" or as many think of it, Japanese Barbecue), bang bang shrimp, scallops, crab legs, lobster and more. Basically, if there's something special you want, just ask them and they'll probably be able to add it to the menu for your event. Reza has not yet started offering sushi, but it is on his "to-do" list.

The massive crowd-pleasing success of the truck at Jule's Food Truck Friday has been typical of the responses that the Happi Hibachi truck has been getting so far: big lines and happy customers. Lindsey says that at Fireworks on the River, the line wrapped around all over like crazy.

So far this spring and summer, Happi Hibachi has jumped right into the festival scene in Dubuque with a host of outdoor public events already lined up to feature their flavors. Upcoming events for them include: Dubuque... All the Jazz!, July's Millwork Night Market, and Asbury Music in the Park.

"I've got the best crew ever," says Lindsey as she looks over at the somewhat weary staff resting behind the truck following a 2+ hour onslaught of hungry Dubuquers testing their meddle.

From graduations to rehearsal dinners. they'll do it all. If it's over 50 people, they bring the whole truck not just the portable grill.

To try it for yourself without having to hire the whole crew to your house, check their Facebook page for a weekly schedule (Facebook.com/HappiHibachi). The "happy" problem so far is that demand has been so high out of the gate, they don't even have open dates just to set-up in random spots.

"For July, we didn't reach out to anyone to set up service because we have every lunch booked all month long," shared Lindsey. "So that's a nice problem to have. They're calling us."

Should they have open lunch dates, you'll be able to find out where they will be serving to the public that day by following them on social media.

The only thing better than finally chasing your dream is seeing it work out for you. And the Happi Hibachi team is firing on all burners.

"We're awesome; we've got a Hibachi truck!"






# GUT REACTIONS FIVE THINGS EVERYONE SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PREBIOTICS AND PROBIOTICS

Trillions. That's how many microorganisms are inhabiting your gut right now, which is mostly a good thing. These bacteria play a vital role in digestion and health, but it's important to help keep them in balance. Enter prebiotics and probiotics. You may have heard of them or even seen supplements for them, but who are they and what do they do? Here's the short version.

#### PREBIOTICS ARE THE FOOD FOR PROBIOTICS

You may have heard of probiotics, but what about prebiotics? These non-digestible carbohydrates come from food or supplements and help fuel probiotics. They're found naturally in foods such as asparagus, bananas, onions, garlic, apple skins, and beans, to name a few. When prebiotics reach the large colon, they start to ferment, thereby feeding all the good bacteria (probitoics) in your gut. That's why you might hear experts say prebiotics are the food for probiotics.

#### PROBIOTICS ARE THE LIVE BENEFICIAL BACTERIA

Probiotics are the live bacteria—the good guys—that naturally occur in some fermented foods and drinks, like yogurt, kimchi, kombucha, kefir, and fresh sauer-kraut (not canned) and can be taken as supplements,

such as Regular Girl. When ingested, they can help balance gut flora and may even boost immunity.

#### PREBIOTICS AND PROBIOTICS RELY ON EACH OTHER

Since prebiotics are the fuel for probiotics to thrive, you can see how they work together. Let's take a banana with yogurt, for example. The prebiotics in a banana ferment in your colon to feed the beneficial bacteria from the yogurt.

#### SUPPLEMENTS MAY BE AN OPTION FOR SOME

Products that contain both prebiotics and probiotics are called synbiotics. A serving of Regular Girl, for example, contains 5 grams of prebiotic fiber to help feed the eight billion active probiotics in the supplement. These types of supplements may be beneficial for people who do not consume enough prebiotic and probiotic foods. However, it's important to consult a registered dietitian or physician before taking supplements.

#### **RESEARCH LOOKS PROMISING**

With trillions of microorganisms inhabiting our gut, you can bet that research into their behavior will be an ongoing effort. And so far, the outcomes have been



promising. Potential benefits of probiotics include the prevention of: diarrhea, irritable bowel syndrome, Crohn's disease, urinary tract infections, and the recurrence of bladder cancer. Prebiotics, in addition to feeding the probiotics, may also help with calcium absorption.

#### **HIGH-LOW-BUFFALO**

Getting kids to open and share about their day is one of the biggest challenges of parenting. After all, most of us, as parents, want to be actively involved. We want to hear about the ups and downs, the triumphs and the failures, to be there to cheer on the successes, and to wipe the tears away when they fall. But how are we supposed to do that when they won't talk?

The statistics about family dinnertimes are staggering. According to the Journal of Adolescent Health, kids and teens who share family dinners three or more times per week are less likely to be overweight; more likely to eat healthy foods; get better grades; are less likely to do drugs, drink, or become sexually active; have better relationships with their parents; fewer emotional and behavioral problems; greater emotional well-being; more trusting and helpful behaviors towards others; and higher life satisfaction.

Last month at one of my speaking programs, an audience member shared a simple dinnertime game with me that is making a difference for our family. His family uses a game called High-Low. The concept is simple—everyone takes turns sharing their best and worst moments of the day. We added one category into the game—buffalo. In addition to a high and a low of the day, each person can share their buffalo (anything they want), just like the buffalo on Papa and Grandma Nama's farm.

Research has shown, again and again, that the families who talk and get to know each other on a regular basis are happier and ultimately more successful. Get the conversation going and you just never know where it might lead! This simple game has changed our conversations. Our boys, and Mom and Dad, are learning to pay more attention to the world around us.

What better way to connect and get to know each other than to listen? I know it makes me feel good when they listen. Not only to the important parts of my day but also to the crappy parts. Isn't that what each day is made of? Good stuff, crappy stuff and WTF stuff. It's a good reminder that nobody can have a happy face all the time which is often expected when your dad is a motivational speaker. The lows have been one of the most insightful parts of our conversations. It allows any of us, me included, to say out loud the things that are bothering or troublesome. It is important to talk about your day and all the good things but also to be real and acknowledge that life has highs, lows and buffalos.

#### SUMMER HEAT

While it is perfectly okay to be plant-

ing this time of year, it's safe to say that it can take a toll on both you and the plant if you're not careful. Here are some ways to keep cool this summer in the garden:

Mulch! Nothing helps retain existing moisture levels like mulch can. There are many different options of materials all ultimately doing the same thing-helping to keep the soil cool. If you haven't already mulched your garden now is the time. In a vegetable garden consider straw from a reputable source or leaf clippings from a lawn that is chemical free. Around your trees and shrubs I like double ground wood mulch, preferably in a dark brown tone.

Water early. In order to not completely waste water through evaporation. I encourage you to water your gardens early in the morning and ideally through the use of soaker hoses. These hoses sweat water right at the base of the plant, slowly allowing it to absorb. Watering early in the day also prevents scalding to the foliage due to water droplets sitting on the

leaves ultimately boiling them. I also encourage my kiddos to play in the sprinkler versus a swimming pool. That way they can cool down, have a great time and I can water my yard, all at the same time!

#### **Consider shade cloth** in a vegetable garden.

Many vegetables can benefit from a little shade during the summer heat. Consider using shade cloth or even landscape fabric to screen some of the sun's intense heat.

Mow less! You didn't want to be sitting on that hot mower anyway, did you?! Mow less or mow at a height of at least 3" if not greater, and the shade from the leaf blades will help prevent your lawn from drying up and burning out.

Add a water feature. That is the landscape designer in me coming out... nothing (besides shade!) helps



you enjoy your garden in the hot summer sun like a water features sound can. Add a concrete fountain or a pondless waterfall and enjoy the soothing sound of water when you crave it most!

Consider a shade structure. If you are like many of my clients and lack shade in vour garden, consider adding a structure like a pergola or a sun sail to your yard to create a shady cool area to enjoy. These are becoming more and more available and can not only be functional but also add a fun element to your garden's style.



#### FULL HOUSE: KINGS AND QUEENS

I have about a half a dozen friends, book buddies if you will, with whom I discuss what's hot and what's not in the world of literature. Two of my buddies are confirmed fans of the historical novel.

I got reading suggestions from them and acquired an interest in reading more in the genre. Then, I found a copy of *The Wild Irish: A Novel of Elizabeth I and the Pirate O'Malley* by Robin Maxwell. Grace O'Malley is, by light years, my favorite Irish person of all time. I was a pile of iron filings and the genre, historical novels, was a big ole' magnet.

So, I was loaded and charged up when *The Plantagenet Vendetta* by John Paul Davis came to my attention. This is an historical novel with quite a bit of added spice. It has a large dose of "thriller" sprinkled all over it. The historical and fictional elements are blended together so well I started checking myself on things I absolutely knew were true. Here are some background highlights, true and otherwise.

The chaos surrounding the heir to the throne of England ran into an immense speed bump in 1485. Richard III had reigned for two years. After a long series of civil wars known as the War of the Roses, Richard III was killed in battle and Henry VII captured the throne.

The House of York lost the throne with the death of Richard III. They secretly created an organization called the Sons of York whose mandate was to kill the offspring of every murderer complicit in the death of Richard III in order to retake the throne.

By the 1600s their seething passion for revenge cooled and the Sons of York went dormant. Since then, they strive to take control of the UK, rid England of the monarchy, and replace it with a democratic form of government. I assume this would include the peaceful dissolution of Parliament, achieving, without explosions, that which Guy Fawkes attempted in 1605 with 30 casks of gunpowder in the basement of the building housing Parliament. In addition, the Sons of York would like to gain control of the EU.

Skipping ahead to the present, the current monarch, James III, drops dead under baffling circumstances. Turning up dead as well are two of his ministers found in a burning car. Rising to the



investigative challenge is one Thomas Winchester, youngest nephew to the new King Edward and, as it happens, one of MI5's best agents. (MI5 is the sister espionage division to James Bond's MI6.)

Elsewhere, in the sleepy village of Wooton-on-the-Moor, a beautiful teenage girl, Debra Harrison, goes missing and is never found. About a week after her disappearance, a disturbed teenage boy, Luke Rankin, who had feelings for Debra, is found hanging from a railroad bridge in what the police consider a suicide. Although there is no proof, most people believe Luke killed Debra and then himself. Since Debra's body was never found there is no proof of anything.

Wooton-on-the-Moor is a hotbed of Yorkists. Walking right into the middle of all this one year later is a TV reporter from London, Jennifer Farrelly. She is there to do background checks on the one year anniversary of the story in advance of the TV crew showing up to do interviews. Nobody in the village wants any of this revisited under any circumstances. Jennifer develops a friendship with one of Debra's friends and they go snooping around an old York castle and ancient church, the catacombs of which prove to be awfully interesting and also especially dangerous.

Thomas Winchester shows up, joins forces with Jennifer, and things start to get interesting. It looks as if everyone is out to kill them whether or not they deserve it. They, however, manage to kill quite a few lads who do deserve it. It seems the Sons of York are going to astonishing lengths to keep something secret and that secret appears to be in the ruins of the York castle and church.

The Plantagenet Vendetta by John Paul Davis is a humdinger, and I don't use that word lightly. And, if you like this one, you'll absolutely lose sleep reading his first novel, The Templar Agenda. It's a rocket on a roller coaster. John Paul Davis owns the historical thriller. He is as good as it gets.
