It's super easy to cut buns from burgers and sandwiches. It's easy to cut most potatoes, but once in a while I really want a french fry. So I overcome by eating one of the fries my wife ordered.

I'm not a real sweet tooth, but you do certainly notice not having a bite of chocolate or a full-test Coca-Cola after a while. I do drink diet soda, which people say is bad because it gives you cravings, but I assure you, the cravings are there regardless, so if I can have a shot of sweet relief without sugar or carbs I'm taking it, even if I curb it. I had to give up Arnold Palmers in lieu of iced tea, but I like iced tea so all is well. I'm not much of an alcohol drinker, so I have not had to figure out what to do there yet, but I assume a little whiskey will work just fine with that Diet Coke.

I do enjoy a nice big burger with lots of great stuff on it, without a bun. That's a meal and I turn to it a lot. Same can go for a grilled chicken sandwich. I gotta say, the other day, in a bout of starving desperation, I had one of the new "gourmet" burgers at McDonalds. I ordered it without a bun and it



came in a salad tray on a nice bed of large leaf lettuce. It was shocked at the presentation, and it tasted pretty damn good. Add it to the "ok" list!

So once you get sick of eating the same things a lot, you start to get creative. Can I make things that normally have carbs without carbs? There is a multi-billion dollar industry out there dedicated to this. But I don't want to start eating low carb pasta or sugar-alcohol candies, it's just a slippery slope. But I can make chicken fingers or boom boom shrimp at home using almond flour. It's amazing how much better a salad can be when you cover it in crispy, spicy jumbo, low-carb fried shrimp. I can live like this!

It is hard to sit next to someone eating popcorn or fried cheese curds and not want to shove them all in my face. I call that secondhand carbs. Then again, stealing one fry or one curd to give my fat boy old-self the reward it needs to go on. I think it's like letting my wife go into Target and just take a deep breath and leave again. I just need to be able to stop at one, and so far, I can. I think I can because I know the end game. I'm doing this for me and I'm not going to ruin a great day or week of diligent smart eating with a weak moment of stupidity.

If I am taking a day off, it's going to count. I'm not cheating with a stupid sandwich or bowl of mashed potatoes. I'm having a happy Joe's Pizza or and Uno's Pizza in Platteville. And I feel less bad if I cheat with something like sushi. I think the generally healthy nature of a couple spicy tuna rolls is a decent trade for the rice carbs. That and I freakin' love sushi. Just gotta walk the dog longer that day.

Finally, amending my snacks are what keeps me from freaking out. Cheese, nuts and jerky are my go-tos, but I also try to do carrots and celery when I can, but celery needs peanut butter because, you know... celery. There is a brand of jerky called Kickass Beef Jerky and it's just better than anything you get at the store. I have to order it online, but when you have fewer outlets for food joy, you maximum the joy of what you can enjoy.

And just let me say thank God for chicken wings. ■


FREUD'S LAST SESSION







Often these portraits are done from photos. The person is trying to save face because they have been accused of something heinous. Some of them are men who abuse their power, some are archetypes of masculinity defending their honor. They have constructed themselves to be something that they are not and they are falling apart. Removing the picture of someone is not the same as actually removing them, these men remain in our lives much like the paint remains on the canvas. We do not want to see them, collectively and individually we want to forget that this exists, so this process changes how we see people trying to hide behind



this mask of identity. It points to the collapse of the white masculine identity as it has been currently constructed. If we can see them changed, but not gone, then we might begin to construct something new out of what remains.





Initially known as Loud Fast Rules, the band's raucous live sets and early releases on the hometown indie label Twin/Tone, including the albums *Say What You Will*, *Made to Be Broken*, and *While You Were Out*, earned them a loyal fan base. Soul Asylum's indie success led to the band entering the major-label mainstream with 1988's *Hang Time* and its 1990 follow-up *And the Horse They Rode In On*. The band garnered multi-platinum success with their commercial breakthrough albums, 1992's *Grave Dancers Union* and 1995's *Let Your Dim Light Shine*. *Grave Dancers Union* featured the international hit "Runaway Train," which won a 1994 Grammy as Best Rock Song while *Let Your Dim Light Shine* spawned the hit "Misery."

The band went on hiatus after 1998's *Candy from a Stranger*, during which time founding singer/guitarist Dave Pirner released his first solo effort, *Faces & Names*.

Soul Asylum returned to action in 2006 with *The Silver Lining* and released *Delayed Reaction* six years later. Three and half decades down the road from the band's indie-punk origins, *Change of Fortune* came in 2016, co-produced by the band and longtime studio collaborator John Fields.

Soul Asylum's current lineup teams Pirner with guitarist Ryan Smith, bassist Winston Royce and drummer Michael Bland.



ARGOSY'S FOOD FOR THOUGHT DOG HOUSE LOUNGE

ORIGINALLY RUN ON NOVEMBER 3, 2016

Every husband knows or should know there is a primary rule of marriage that states: no man should ever interfere with his wife's hair styling appointment. So imagine my chagrin when I caused Margie to be late for her hair appointment with Molly Lynch at J. Van Natta's Salon. For this transgression I was immediately banished to the dog house.

So how's this for a coincidence? The very next day I received an E-mail from Sandi Hough who suggested I should check out the Dog House Lounge on Asbury Road in Dubuque. She said the food is really good. What she didn't say was her husband, Sam, runs the place. But that's ok, though, because she was right about the food, it is really good!

I quickly discovered if I had to be in the Dog House this one was at least very comfortable and friendly! The drinks are reasonably priced, there is free Wi-Fi and I can play pool, darts and even golf on the Golden Tee Electronic Golf Game.

There has been a bar in this location for almost 50 years. A long time ago it was called John Henry. Then Bob Klauer purchased it and brought in his brother, Jim, to run it. They decided to change the bar's name so Jim went to Chicago to see if he could find an appropriate name at a used outdoor sign dealer. He discovered the Dog House sign in their lot, purchased it and brought it back to Dubuque. For the next 15 years or so he operated the Dog House Lounge. Then Robert "Bub" Leytem came to Dubuque and offered to buy it from the two

brothers. Now Bub was no stranger to the bar business. He was a native of Cascade, Iowa and started running a bar called the Cellar Door when he was only 22 years old. Later, he managed the Rose Garden and operated La Bamba both of which were in nearby Maquoketa.

After Bub took over the Dog House it quickly became his pride and joy. He nurtured it and slowly built a loyal group of regular customers. Many of these regulars belong to Dog House Pool, Dart, Bowling and Softball Leagues. The Dog House also sponsors a volley ball team and a dragon boat team.

Bub ran the Dog House for 28 years and during that time he bought out adjoining businesses and added on to the premises which now includes a cozy pool room and a nice private party room that comfortably accommodates 50 guests. In July 2012 Bub passed away at age 56; way too soon after a courageous battle with cancer.

Today Dog House Lounge is owed by Bub's widow, Sheri. She handles all the administrative duties and she sometimes comes in to work behind the bar.

That's an easy part of the job for her. She has been doing it for almost 32 years! Her brother, Sam Hough (pronounced Huff), has been here for 30 years and is also chief cook.

Sam and Sheri are lucky to have some very experienced and friendly people on their staff who have been with them for many years. These include daytime bar maids Molly Weidenbacher and Robin Arthofer and night time bartender Tony Knopp.

There are four beers on tap: Bud Light, Miller Lite, Blue Moon and Amber Bock. Old Milwaukee, Pabst and Old Style beer are available in cans. All other beers are served in bottles. Surely they have a beer you like, there are over 25 choices!

There is a nice assortment of appetizers to munch on. The Chicken Fingers are good but if you want to try something a little different I recommend the Peppered Chicken Fingers. These have a crunchier coating seasoned with black pepper. The Cheese Nuggets are deep fried cheese curds. The Hot Wings and Chicken Drum-



mies are really good too. The Hot Wings are spicy and include both wings and drumsticks. The Drummies are honey battered drumsticks. When I feel like nibbling on something I prefer the variety of a Combo Basket. The basket usually includes Chicken Fingers, Mushrooms, Onion Rings, French Fries and Munchers. These are potato rounds filled with cheese. You can request substitutions so you can customize your Combo Basket.

When I visit the Dog House now I always try to remember to order soup. Now that the cold weather is back there are usually two to choose from. One is always Chicken Tortilla which is delicious and the other changes from day to day. For example, you might find Bacon Potato, Tomato Dill, Chicken Enchilada or if it's your lucky day Lasagna Soup. This is an excellent combination of everything you get in a lasagna: noodles and ground beef in a tomato base. It is served with a wonderful slice of garlic toast. Chili is served all year so order some in a bowl or on top of a great all beef Quarter Pound Hot Dog.

Food is served all day at the Dog House. Deep Fried choices are the Chicken Sandwich, Fish Sandwich, Shrimp Basket with Fries and Pork Fritter Sandwich. Margie's favorite is this last one. It is a quarter pound pork tenderloin sandwich to which she adds lettuce and tomato. Margie has also gone back with me two more times just to have the Tuna Salad Sandwich. It is made fresh daily and is prepared with relish and mayonnaise.



The Ham-burgers are all outstanding. They are 1/3 pound or you can order a half pounder when you are really hungry. The beef is supplied by Cremer's Grocery in Dubuque. Cremer's specializes in hand-cut-to-order meats, sausages and turkey and dressing.

APPLES TO APPLES

WHEN SHOPPING FOR APPLES, LARGER MAY NOT ALWAYS BE BETTER.

BY HY-VEE NUTRITIONISTS MEGAN HORSTMAN (ASBURY) AND AMY CORDINGLEY (LOCUST)

Apples come in a variety of shapes and colors. And I'm sure you've noticed the range in sizes as well. To give you an idea, smaller apples are about the size of a tennis ball; larger ones are closer to softball-sized. In fact, some large apples can yield 2 cups of apple slices—that's nearly 60 percent more fruit than a small apple. This can be a good thing for baking or cooking, but snacking might be a different story.

SO WHY ARE SOME APPLES SO BIG?

According to Purdue University researcher and professor Peter Hirst, there are three main things that affect apple growth: the size and number of cells in the apple

(which can depend on the variety), crop load of the tree, and environmental factors, such as temperature and light. Growers can help control fruit size of certain varieties by using techniques such as thinning and making sure the soil is of good quality. Even still, some apples will naturally grow smaller or larger than others.

WHAT'S THE SERVING SIZE?

As a general rule, one small apple is considered a one-cup serving size of fruit. Although, there's certainly no shame in eating a large apple (after all, larger apples have nearly twice the fiber). But if you need to pack a snack for a child or monitor serving sizes to help manage diabetes, buying smaller apples can help control portions and prevent half-eaten apples from winding up in the trash.

Pro Tip: If you're having trouble finding small apples, Stemilt Growers sells 3-pound bags of small apples—conventional or organic—called Lil Snap-pers®. They come in different varieties like Fuji, Pink Lady, Granny Smith, and of course, Honeycrisp.

HOW DO APPLES KEEP THE DOCTOR AWAY?

In addition to being an excellent source of vitamin C—a powerful natural antioxidant that protects your cells from damage—one small apple has about 4 grams of fiber and no fat, sodium, or cholesterol. ■



PLANET OF THE APES THIS AIN'T

Jo Walton might not be a household name but it is a name you should remember and a name you should put on top of your "To Read" list. Her latest effort is a Trilogy called *Thessaly*. In order, the books are *The Just City*, *The Philosopher Kings* and *Necessity*. The good news is you can buy them all collected together in one volume. The paperback costs in the vicinity of \$10. It will be the best \$10 you'll ever spend. *Thessaly* is astounding. It warps every genre in the instruction manual with the possible exception of cook-books and romance novels. It is a stunning success.

The trilogy concerns itself with an idea as big as Mount Olympus. Athena is the daughter of Zeus, the god of gods and of all beings in the universe. She has decided to apply herself to a mighty project that has never been equaled. She will attempt to duplicate The Just City as it is laid down in Plato's monumentally influential book, *The Republic*.

Athena commandeers an island in the eastern Mediterranean. It is the island of Kallisti, which was also called Thera, Santorini and much later and for much longer called Atlantis. She gathers the best teachers, whom she names Masters, to create the real manifestation of Plato's supreme idea.

There were over 300 Masters: Boccaccio, Cicero, Boethius, Pico, and Ficino, just to name a few. No one, however, could come within a Mt. Olympus mile of the absolute center of that intellectual cache than the man who taught Plato everything. The same man who

taught Aristotle everything, the man who mentored his student, Aristotle, when he was chosen to educate a boy by the young man's parents. The boy would later be called Alexander the Great. This teacher changed the whole world and there he was sitting in the middle of The Just City. There he was, in the flesh, Socrates.

It's important that you understand you don't have to have read *The Republic* to understand the trilogy. Ms. Walton has done an admirable job of keeping the reader informed. In fact she gives us useful hints along the way. The most helpful comment by Ms. Walton, unfortunately for me, was not until the last two sentences in the whole trilogy. But I'm going to put you on the fast track. Here they are: "I ended the first volume with a moral, and the second with a deus ex machina. This third and final volume ends with hope, always the last thing to come out of the box."

As Ms. Walton indicates, part one ends with a fierce debate about the whole idea of The Just City. The debate, of course, features Socrates on one side and Athena on the other. It's riveting. However, if you ever find yourself in a debate with a powerful goddess, I have a piece of advice you might want to remember...LET HER WIN. Socrates summoned all his powers and he did beat Athena in a fair fight. But Athena was in a snit after losing to a human and got immeasurably angry. She turned Socrates into a fly. (He eventually makes a comeback.)

Part two ends with Zeus finding out what his daughter has done. Subsequently, Zeus also finds out that


Apollo, his favorite son, has become a human with no godly powers, living incognito in The Just City with his family. If you don't keep an eye on your kids there's no telling what they'll do. Zeus is livid. Uh oh!

Zeus will not allow people from the future living in the past teaching the leaders of tomorrow. It will alter the future in ways that are dangerous for the universe. He has a solution. He wants to make everyone and everything in The Just City, including the buildings, disappear from history like they never existed in the first place. Time for a conference at which an accommodation is reached that will allow all to live and The Just City to continue, including the buildings. It is a solution that is wacky, wild, unexpected, successful and it's breathtaking: a perfect deus ex machina.

Nope, I am not revealing the end. Let us surmise that there might be a few Philosopher Kings roaming the world as a result of Athena's little experiment.

Apollo is a stand out in this tale. He becomes human to better understand his godly role in their lives, giving up his powers. He lives a long and fruitful life as a human. Not to worry though, he ends up back on Mt. Olympus.

It took all three of *Thessaly's* books to get Apollo back to Olympus as a god. Maybe Jo Walton was getting a little payback on the occasional thugs who lived on Mount Olympus. Here's a warning to Miss Walton: let them win or else there could be a fly in your future. ■






