JULIEN DUBUQUE INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL APRIL 24-28



APRIL 24–28 DOWNTOWN DUBUQUE

The Julien Dubuque International Film Festival, set for April 24–28, has extended the festivities to cover five days. More than 20 features, 20 documentaries and 70 shorts were named Official Selections this year and will be screened at 10 venues in downtown Dubuque. There were more than 700 submissions from over 50 countries, including Germany, the United Kingdom, Japan, Cuba, and New Zealand.

The eighth annual festival begins Wednesday with a full day of film screenings and a welcome mingle event from 6 to 8 p.m. at Five Flags Center. Thursday is again Runde Auto Group Free Day, so all film screenings are free that day.

On Thursday the festival will welcome the Canadian Consulate for its Celebrate Canada night from 7:30 to 9:30 p.m. at Five Flags Theater. There will be a Canada-sponsored film and a Q&A with the filmmakers. The after party will be at 9:30 p.m. at Hotel Julien Dubuque's Riverboat Lounge and will feature live music by The Lonely Goats.

Friday will include two special screenings from Shoreline Entertainment including *Innocent Kiss*, which stars Burt Reynolds, and *Elijah & the Rock Creatures*, a science fiction film from Canada. Friday evening's activities have been dubbed Flick, Block & Bowl, and will begin with a red carpet screening of *When Jeff Tried to Save the World*, which stars Jon Heder. Heder played Napoleon in the 2004 indie comedy *Napoleon Dynamite*.

There will be a Q&A session with the director and producer, as well as to-be-announced cast and crew members, following the film. Tickets to the screening, held at the Five Flags Theater, are \$10 in advance and \$15 at the door. Doors open at 4:30 p.m.

After the screening, filmgoers can walk down to the JDIFF Block Party. This free street party, held from 6 to 10 p.m., will feature beer gardens and two bands on Main Street between 2nd and 3rd. Almost Classy will take the stage at 6 p.m. and Arzalez will begin at 8 p.m. The event is sponsored by American Trust.

The party will then move to Diamond Jo Casino's Cherry Lanes with cosmic bowling from 10 p.m. to 1 a.m. Tickets are \$20 in advance or \$30 at the door. There are a limited number of tickets available for this package, which includes free bowling, shoes, food, and music by JC Brooks Band, which is featured in *When Jeff Tried to Save the World*. The event is sponsored by Diamond Jo Casino.

Saturday will again feature the Awards Night ceremony at Five Flags Theater, recognizing the best films of the festival. The show will be from 8 to 9:30 p.m. and include musical performances by Arzales, Caroline Curtis, and more. The Awards After Party, set for 9:30 p.m. to midnight at the Five Flags, will feature complimentary food by East Mill Bakery and music by Ceili Rain.

The fest's final day, Sunday, is Kid's Day. From 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., The Belltower, The Scene Studio, and Creative Adventure Lab will entertain kids with free workshops at Creative Adventure Lab. That night, the festival will come to a close with a screening of the film *F.I.S.T.*, which starred Sylvester Stallone and was filmed in Dubuque.

"This is the 40th anniversary of that film, so what better way to celebrate that than to screen it right where it was filmed," said Susan Gorrell, executive director of the festival.



THE CORNER GRILL BY DANNY FAIRCHILD

"Greece is the word."

The Brothers Gibb
 When people think of Dubuque,
 they don't think of Greek cuisine. Why

not? It's right there in front of our noses which are catching a good whiff of the spinning gyro meat. I've lived in Dubuque over 15 years and nowhere I've lived has had as vibrant of Greek heritage (it should be noted I've always lived somewhere in Iowa), and even I think of so many other things before my mind lands on Greek cuisine as a defining characteristic of Dubuque.

Let's stop this foolishness now, shall we? Dubuque means Greek cuisine. It just does. Shut up and accept it. It shouldn't be hard to accept. In fact, we should all be accepting gyros and baklava into our face-mouths right now. Dubuque means Greek cuisine. And with The Corner Grill at our service, I'll go so far as to say that Dubuque means GOOD Greek cuisine.

Braving the storm of unrelenting street construction stands The Corner Grill at the corner of Elm and 17th Streets, a monument to all things Dubuque, including the Greek aspects of it. Everything about it screams of the Dubuqueiest aspects of Dubuque, from the decor to the bartender serving double duty as a server and telling the daddiest of dad jokes:

Q. Why did the cheese curd cross the road?

A. To get out of the whey.

The question will be asked, "How authentic can it be?" A fair question. A douchey question, but I'll allow it. To find the answer, we must go to a much larger city with a much larger Greek community: Chicago. Zoom in a little more and you'll find Greektown. Zoom in even more and you'll find Halsted Street. That's where Yanni and his team get their gyro meat. It's THAT authentic. Now shut up and eat. But make sure you visit a cash machine before you come on down as The Corner Grill doesn't accept cards. There is an ATM in-house if you forget, but...y'know...fees.

Let's get down to the food, yo. Here there be Coke products. And lemonade. And iced tea. I usually don't make special note of iced tea. As long as it's iced and it's tea, then who cares, right? But friends: I must comment on the iced tea. Yanni and Co. brew it-get this-on the grill. I know, so what? A heat source is a heat source, right? Maybe. But the results speak for themselves. They also know not to friggin' boil your tea. They get it to a good steeping temperature. And this isn't some ultra exotic jasmine pearl orange pekoolong here. This is just the tea you've come to love and expect. Doesn't matter. They still take care to brew it right. It's a small thing, but it should be appreciated. Appreciate it, won't you?

We started things off with some spanakopita, which is a blend of spinach and feta wrapped in filo dough. I'm here to tell you, friend: There is absolutely no better way to eat spinach. I stake my honor on it.

First entree: The gyro. We went ahead and test drove the gyro supreme because there was four of us and neither of us wanted to sleep on the gyro. The gyro supreme falls under the "Mega-Sized Sandwiches" heading of the menu, and it lives up to the name. Gyros are kiiiiiind of open-faced sandwiches anyway, but with the gyro supreme, there's no "kiiiiiind of" about it. You ain't folding that thing. It's open season on open-face, y'all. You may even doubt there's a pita under all that meat and veggies and feta. Keep digging. It's there. Ever want to eat just a pile of gyro meat? You do now, don't you? Go get you some. What I'm saying is The Corner Grill does not skimp. Perish the thought.



SOUVLAKI SPECIAL

Next up was the souvlaki special. Souvlaki is a Greek street food consisting of marinated meat grilled on skewers. Shish kebab, right? Different culture, but culinarily similar. Except shish kebab almost always has veggies on the skewers. Souvlaki almost always doesn't. Again, very Dubugue. The souvlaki special features chicken. I don't know about you, but almost every skewered and grilled chicken thingy I've ever had has been dry as an episode of *Seinfeld*, marinated or no. I have found the holy grail of moist (sorry for using that word) grilled, skewered chicken. It's at The Corner Grill. Marinated and grilled to perfection.

Then the burgers. The Corner Grill may not be your top choice for burgers, but if you're out with your pals and you're feeling like gyros and your friends are screaming for burgers, there's no reason you can't all be happy. The bun was a little large for the patty, but that was the only complaint with the Athenian burger we sampled. It's their fresh chuck patty with Greek seasoning and it's delicious. Do yourself a favor and upgrade to onion rings.

For your Lenten delights (again: Dubuque) there's the breaded cod

sandwich. And as this is The Corner Grill, that means it's getting served on a pita, yo. It's an excellent twist on the usual fish sandwich you get during Lent. And the cod is breaded and fried a beautiful golden brown and is super flaky. Nom.

The baklava is homemade and is dangerous. If you eat it, you will want to eat it again. Flaky filo dough layered with spices and walnuts and sweetened to high heaven with honey? You're already there, aren't you?

The restrooms are very clean, though the automated towel dispenser didn't work on the day in question. But paper towels were readily available and truth be told, I hate those dispensers, anyway. Both restrooms (I peeked in the ladies' whilst it was unoccupied) have full-length mirrors so you can make sure you look cool before going back to eating. There was even some Kenneth Cole body spray available.

All-in-all, I can't for the life of me figure out how Dubuque isn't known, at least within the Tri-States, as a gyro destination. How can such deliciousness be overlooked? It's Greek to me! HAHAHA-HAHAHA! I'M SO FUNNY, YOU GUYZ!



ACHILLES HAD A TENDON C TO EXAGGERATE

The Song of Achilles by Madeline Miller is utterly original, stunning, dazzling, breath-taking, brilliant, remarkable, intense, gentle, brutal, shocking, bucolic, savage, bloody, pastoral, and violent. That about empties the thesaurus in my head. I can't think of

another book that rivals it except her second novel, which I am reading presently, and the *Iliad* by Homer. *The Song of Achilles* is a retelling—no, a reimagining—of the *Iliad*, the first epic poem by Homer which tells the tale of the Trojan War. Ms. Miller chronicles the story of the *Iliad* as she follows the career of the greatest

warrior in ancient Greece, maybe of all time, Achilles. Achilles' mother was a goddess who tried to get Zeus to make him a god. Zeus said no. So, the least she could do was to make him immortal. She carried her baby to the river Styx (yes, that's where the band got their name) and dipped him in the water. Every part of his body was washed immortal by the water except where Mom held him, by one of his heals. This is something that is of a major consequence to poor Achilles later in this life as he fights the war with Troy.

I think this would be a good time for a brief review of the Trojan War. The Trojan, King Priam decided that it was time for one of his sons, Paris, to get some experience running the kingdom he would inherit with one of his brothers, Hector. Paris is sent on a diplomatic mission to the Greek kingdom of King Agamemnon. Among the royalty he meets is Agamemnon's younger brother, Menelaus, also a minor Greek king. It turns out Paris was a lot more interested in King Menelaus' wife, Helen, you know, she had the face that launched a thousand ships.

Paris and Helen fell in love and snuck out of town. They made it back to Troy. Menelaus went berserk. Agamemnon was apoplectic. The Greeks marshalled a huge army to sail to Troy to get Helen back. It took 10 years and a huge number of dead soldiers and civilians. In the end Helen went back to Greece and Menelaus. The Trojan war was a result of Paris not being able to keep his toga buttoned.

Ms. Miller recounts Achilles' back story in *The Song* of Achilles. As a boy he was taught to be a warrior along with another boy, Patroclus. They were attracted to one another in a way that seemed to be a small, accepted part of growing up in Greece and they were inseparable. Training together, eating together, and sleeping in the same bed. As teenagers they were sent out to the wilderness to complete their training and education.

Their teacher lived in a cave and gathered food from the mountain. Chiron was a great teacher with one startling distinction. Chiron was a centaur. Under his guidance Achilles and Patroclus became educated, fierce warriors, and dedicated to each other for life. This is the love story in Ms. Miller's book. It is the example of a successful relationship driven by love.

Achilles and Agamemnon intensely disliked each other. The soldiers were dividing up the spoils from a few raids in the countryside which included a pretty woman. Achilles claimed her and as he was leading her back to his tent, Agamemnon stopped them and claimed the girl for himself and took her away from Achilles. This was a supreme insult and a massive example of complete and total disrespect. Achilles, then, refused to fight until King Agamemnon apologized and return the girl. That didn't happen.

The Greeks were losing the war. They were

being slaughtered. Patroclus begged and pleaded with Achilles to fight. He refused. Achilles and Patroclus hatched a plan. Patroclus put on Achilles armor and helmet. All thought it was Achilles. Patroclus wasn't a very good fighter and he is killed by the Trojan Hector.

Achilles was raging. He joins the fight the next day. Finally, Achilles kills Hector and desecrates the body by dragging it behind his chariot many times around Troy in the morning, at noon, and in the evening. The next battle sees Achilles wander too close to the walls of Troy where he catches a random arrow in his heel, draining his immortality but not killing him.

Paris is up on the wall and lets loose an arrow at Achilles. From the back, through the armor, through the heart, Achilles is done. Achilles is buried. His mother stands at the tomb along with the spirit of Patroclus which she can see and hear because she is a goddess. Finally...

"In the darkness, two shadows, reaching through the hopeless, heavy dusk. Their hands meet, and light spills in a flood like a hundred golden urns pouring out of the sun." All is well and *The Song of Achilles* by Madeline Miller






