## WHERE'S WANDO?



WE'VE HIDDEN WANDO  
SOMEWHERE IN THIS  
ISSUE OF 365INK. CAN  
YOU FIND HIM?

The day the last issue of 365ink hit the streets, I hit the road for the great western plains. It's tourist time!

Earlier this year, my wife's parents asked us to join them for a week in Yellowstone National Park. They were getting a house for a week. Considering how awesome the family vacation was to Maui two years ago, how could we say no?

So we found a couple of weeks that would work out and set a date. Finally, a vacation! We considered flying out but decided that we would take this one time opportunity to stretch this thing out a bit and do it by car so that we could see all the sights along the way.

I'll note now that the "sights" along the way didn't really start until about 650 miles into our trip. Sorry Western Iowa and Eastern South Dakota, but you boring! Except you, Dignity!

We did have a nice dinner at a place called Ode to Food and Drink in Sioux Falls, next to the Big Sioux River and a cool piece metal sculpture over the river called Arc of Dreams.

The only interesting things for the next 300 miles were hundreds of silly billboards for Wall Drug or a fire station-themed brew pub in Rapid City. Literally every one of the maybe 50 billboards from Firehouse Brewing was accompanied by a real firetruck. It was crazy.

We eventually hit the Badlands of South Dakota, and they were beautiful. Desolate but stunning. The first stop inside the park about one minute past the gate was worth the whole fee. The Big Badlands Overlook. Some things cannot be captured in a photograph. I'll find that to be true about a hundred times in this trip.

Leaving the Badlands, we were, of course, immediately welcomed by Wall Drug. We had to stop, right? We did NOT get a free ice water or five cent coffee, but we did climb on the giant jackalope for a photo and took our complimentary bumper sticker. It's like the House on the Rock of the plains. Check that off the tourist list!

On our third day, a simple 45 minute trip to Deadwood took about 12 hours because, well, we have hit road trip tourist heaven! Naturally, we started at Mount Rushmore. It was my first time to all of these places by the way. What can I say. It's a must see. Pretty cool. There was construction on site, so I don't think we got nearly as close as you normally do. All in all, a very American destination that everyone should see. And can I say that the National Park Service is very sensitive to things like recycling compost, food allergies, and locally soured and organic options. Who'd a thunk? It could only be marred by a few very offensive pro-Trump T-shirts in the park worn by some of the thousands of Sturgis bikers that featured their hero President's orange face and either a middle finger and a bald eagle or else a hand gun and the F word. Stay Classy MAGAers! Are we great yet?

Then onto Crazy Horse Monument. I don't know man, it was kinda weird. It was also kind of expensive. A dated video explained why the guy who started charging the mountain all alone wasn't nuts, and there was a visitor center with lots of Native American art. I checked it off my list, but I think I'd have been okay trying to spot it from the road.

Custer State Park was next and beautiful. Wonderful winding freshly-paved roads made me wish I had a motorcycle too. And multiple very narrow tunnels through the rocky hills/mountains of the park made me glad I wasn't



a bus driver. They actually drive 8-foot-wide busses through these tunnels, some are only 8'4" wide. NUTS! Christy was driving and does NOT like heights, at least not when they are next to very steep drop offs. But she was a trooper!

We ended our day in Deadwood with a stroll down the historic Main Street where Wild Bill Hickok was shot and where storied characters like Calamity Jane, Seth Bullock, and Al Swearengen made their names. Lots of semi-hokey history trying to make a buck, but it was fun. And our dinner at Legends Steakhouse was the best of the whole trip. Our stay at the Deadwood Mountain Grand Hotel/Casino, which was renovated from an old gold sifting "smile plant," was also good. They get all of the exact same concerts as Dubuque. Seriously.

One more long day to our house in Emigrant, Montana at the North Entrance to Yellowstone. Every view for the next week is pretty much gorgeous. We made day trips into the park, a couple of them lasting over 12 hours. Long days but so, so much to see. Where do I even start? Nothing was disappointing. We got the GyPSy Guide app for my phone to help the tours, and it was well worth the few dollars. We made some stops that we would not have otherwise and would have missed some of the best sights in the park. For example, the Calcite Springs Overlook just above Tower Fall was simply stunning. We went twice.

Walk, walk, walk. There was plenty of hiking to do for sure. Even the spots right by the road might have hundreds of stairs to get to the "sweet spots," the best example being the Grand Prismatic Spring. Just WOW! What time of day you visit matters too. There is a lot more visible steam pouring from natural features in the cool morning than the hot afternoon, but also low clouds or fog limit visibility in the morning. For example, Roaring Mountain is full of steaming fumaroles in the morning and pretty lame after lunch.

Yeah, we had to do Old Faithful and it was cool, but honestly not the most impressive part of the park. But still a check off the bucket list. The Inn there is well worth a visit for a view of the stunning lobby. The falls in the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone and the Mammoth Hot Springs were high on my "cool list." I was a bit disappointed in the Paint Pots and Norris Geyser Basin from what was promised. And the stink was pretty bad at the basin. Mist got all over you, and you smelled like it all day. And the wildlife were sparse the first couple days but paid off on our last day in the park with elk galore, pronghorn, and a bison herd in the Hayden Valley. There was even a bear eating a bison carcass, but it was too far from the road to see without super-gear zoom lenses... and there were LOTS of those.

1,200 miles home in two days through a massive lightning storm was not awesome, but we powered through. Bucket list checked! Lots of checks... and a few T-shirts and fridge magnets, because I'm an American on vacation, dammit! ■







"It's just a tremendous kickoff for what's going to happen out there next year, with Major League's




recent announcement of the Yankees vs. White Sox game coming to the venue on Aug. 13, 2020."

I don't know how that will look and how it will be managed yet, but that is certainly the number one question we get right now: "How do we get tickets?" I think the answer is to see what Major League Baseball comes out with in a couple

of months. In all honesty, I think it's going to be like the World Series, Superbowl, and Final Four all rolled into one. It's going to be a tough ticket to get for sure, but there will be Tri-Staters at the game for sure."

Keith is a Ghost Player at the Field of Dreams, and last week's season finale exhibition game at the field was the biggest attended game since they restarted hosting the games back in 2013. So the love for and the lure of the field is as strong today as ever.

"The game will not take place on the actual field but on a new field build behind the existing field in order to accommodate 8,000 plus people for the game. The two fields will be connected by a path through the corn. The new diamond will be permanent after all of the temporary infrastructure like bleachers and such are gone. Hopefully it will become an annual event, but that's to be determined. But so far, the response has been incredible, so they're not going to lack for fans wanting to fill the seats. The location, with teams like the Cubs, Cards, Brewers, Twins, Royals all within a five hour drive, it's a great location for an event like this, especially as it's a magical piece of baseball's legacy as it sits already. I'm a big Cubs fan, so it would be awesome in 2021 if the Cubbies would be playing at the Field of Dreams. Who knows?"

"The excitement for this year is just is unreal. If we're lucky enough to have a nice weekend of weather, we're just going to have a huge crowd. We're getting a flood of phone calls. We're keeping our fingers crossed for good weather. The event got rained on last year, and all components of the weekend still occurred to interact with the players except for the actual game, which was disappointing, but it was literally a giant storm and nothing could be done. The concern is safety of everyone involved. Field events took place at Dyersville Beckman High School which will serve as a rain site this year as well. Hopefully, that is not needed and the magical event is able to be all it promises to be."



## TAVERN ON THE MAIN

Remember in the original 1984 smash hit *Ghostbusters*, when Louis Tully (played perfectly by Rick Moranis) is chased by a demon dog through Central Park up to this really fancy restaurant and before succumbing to the beast, he's all, "Good pooch...Maybe I have a Milk Bone." That fancy restaurant was the legendary Tavern on the Green. You've probably heard of it. Tavern on the Main is NOT Tavern on the Green. Tavern on the Main is BETTER than Tavern on the Green.

How can I say this even though I've never eaten at Tavern on the Green? So glad you asked.

First of all, since reopening in 2014, Tavern on the Green keeps flipping through chefs like a Rolodex. The team that is bringing us Tavern on the Main has worked with the same chef for years and years. I can't imagine a bigger placement of trust than what a restaurant places on their chefs, and I'm including spouses, doctors, and weightlifting spotters in that statement. So the fact that this team has been together so long is a testament to the food.

But we'll get to the food in a bit.

Another thing that makes Tavern on the Main better than Tavern on the Green is the atmosphere. I'm not averse to eating in fancy restaurants, mind you. I can hang. But Tavern on the Green has gone through incarnation after incarnation, trying its damnedest to capture New York City, sometimes succeeding, often times failing. Tavern on the Main is undoubtedly and unapologetically Dubuque. The decor features prints of the river and of works from the Dubuque Museum of Art. A print of *Doorways of Dubuque* is on prominent display. Beer signage for many Dubuque beers are overhead. And, of course, just about any location along Main Street Dubuque just screams, "Yup! This is Dubuque. This is my home."

This location has a history of inclusivity, and I'm happy to report that hasn't changed. I received some of the most attentive, but not overly attentive, service I've received in years. You're welcome there. It's nice to see that hasn't changed. Muscle memory may tempt you to go down the stairs to take in a drag

show. Don't do that. There are plans for downstairs, but it isn't open yet. And don't let the stairs comment scare you off—there is ADA accessibility down there.

As near as I can tell, the only thing Tavern on the Green has over Tavern on the Main is that Tavern on the Green serves dinner, and for now Tavern on the Main only offers lunch. Once that changes, Tavern on the Green can suck it.

Bathroom report. Also common to eateries along Dubuque's Main Street is having bathrooms kind of carved out of the main floor, probably because of accessibility issues with the downstairs facilities. It ends up being kind of a little room that doesn't reach the top of the high ceilings typical of the buildings of that time period. The end result here is that the ceilings in the bathrooms are very low. I'm exactly six feet tall with shoes on. The ceilings are one of me and one of my hands with my fingers pointed up. So anybody taller than about 6'7" will need to duck... and will probably want to sit down to pee, regardless of what parts you have. And really, unless we're using a urinal, us dudes should probably just swallow our misplaced pride and pee sitting down, anyway. Height restrictions aside, the bathrooms are tops. There's a full-body mirror to make sure you're still the you you'd like to present to the world, and unlike many bathrooms in these old Main Street places, you won't be afraid to touch anything. Whether you're a sitter or a stander, you'll pee in comfort and leave feeling clean.

On to the food, yo!

The food is bar food done with care. Most bars offer food just so they can say they offer food. They'll serve whatever they can get cheap and easy off the Sysco truck. Not that Sysco food is bad. I don't think you can eat at many places without Sysco or companies of that ilk. They make planning a menu effortless, which is good...but an effortless menu sometimes means there's not a lot of effort put into bar food. Not so at Tavern on the Main. Pride is a main ingredient in all their food, and you can't get that off any truck. Well...unless you're buying Pride furniture polish.

Please note! You will NOT be able to buy Pride brand furniture polish at Tavern on the Main! But you CAN get delicious sammiches, burgers, and apps at Tavern on the Main. In fact, let's not call it bar food. Let's call it tavern food. I think that describes it better.

On my lunchtime excursion to Tavern on the Main, I tried three dishes: The reuben dog, the chicken salad sandwich, and the chicken wings.

I'll go over the reuben dog first because if you're like me, you just read the words "reuben dog" and you just about climaxed. I saw it on the menu and thought, yet again, "Yup! This is Dubuque! This is my home!" This is a favorite, guaranteed. The bun isn't some wimpy little thing. It's a serious quality bun. It has to be when you're piling sauerkraut and Thousand Island on it. This bun could spot you while you're weight lifting; that's how well you can trust it. At first, I thought it was purely for structure, but then I took a bite and found the hot dog in there. Friends...are you tired of wimpy little narrow wieners? You should be. If not, then what DO you want out of life? We're talking an emasculatingly thick, all-beef dog that, despite it being a heavy lifting bun, occupies that bun from end to end. I mean look at that picture. You can kind of see that hot dog peeking out even through all the fixin's. You're NOT going to get a bite of just bun. You'll get a proper bite of hot dog in there, no matter what.

The chicken salad. There are two schools of chicken salad thought. One is the chicken salad where the chicken is kind of pulled and shredded. The other is the chicken salad with the chicken cubed in there. We can debate whether one should use mayo or the tangy zip another time. Even though I steadfastly subscribe to the shredded school of chicken salad, I was not disappointed in Tavern on the Main's cubed chicken salad. Because, again, they care. It's served on a buttery, flaky croissant that, while the chicken salad is liberally piled on there, it holds up to the moisture. And the onion and tomato I had it adorned with were perfect. Gotta love this time of year for tomatoes, amirite? Still, I recommend eating this sandwich with utensils, because again...that chick salad is piled on LIBERALLY. Because they care.



CHICKEN WINGS

The wings. Can't have tavern food without 'em, right? Right, Danny!

Oh, people of Dubuque with your intolerance for all things spicy. I know you've been wanting...hoping...lusting for a wing sauce that when it says it's "mild" it is actually mild by your standards. I'm kind of with you. I ordered the mild sauce thinking it would have just the right amount of kick. I was disappointed. This mild sauce IS mild. You get the tanginess of the sauce without the heat. Next time, I'll know to order medium. And people who usually like medium...you might be well served to get the hot variety. Tavern on the Main isn't at fault here. We're just not used to this much honesty in wing sauces. And if you're not into the whole buffalo wing scene, then get you some sweet chili, teriyaki, bourbon, Asian sesame, or BBQ wings. I paired my buffalo wings with the Asian sesame and all I can say is...open friggin' sesame. I'm a blue cheese fan over ranch when it comes to wings...well...I'm a blue cheese fan over ranch when it comes to everything, but that's beside the point. The point is that there are also two schools of thought when it

comes to blue cheese dressing. There's the chunky kind that doesn't let you forget that this dressing contains cheese, and that cheese is blue. Then there's the abomination that some people call blue cheese dressing and may as well just be ranch. I've been in restaurants...NICE restaurants, even...where I couldn't tell the difference between the blue cheese and ranch. Not so here at Tavern on the Main. That dressing is chunk-a-riffic.

And the price! At the time of this writing, there is nothing on the menu that costs more than \$9. Hell, you can get a quarter-pound black angus tavern burger with cheese for \$4.50. Want to add some hand-cut fries (that's right HAND-CUT fries), housemade coleslaw (the creamy kind, not the vinegary kind), cottage cheese, or a house salad? It's just a buck fifty more!

All-in-all, I'm wildly impressed with Tavern on the Main and look forward to them expanding into breakfast and dinner. In fact...I'm just going to say it. I've been looking for a "regular bar" for years now. I'm strongly considering making Tavern on the Main that bar. Or, in this case, tavern. ■

There's a reason juice boxes made their way into lunch boxes over the years. They taste good, require no refrigeration, and fit nicely into compact containers. Here's how.

**It's a Bone-Building Beverage.** Vitamin D helps your body absorb calcium. Not only is vitamin D needed for strong bones, it's also good for strong teeth. Kids can get vitamin D from the sun as well as foods such as egg yolks, fish and liver. Not their favorite choices? Not to worry. Most milk is fortified with vitamin D. A typical 8-ounce serving provides 25 percent of the recommended Daily Value for vitamin D and 20 percent of the recommended Daily Value for calcium.

**It's Also a Muscle-Builder.** Just one cup of milk contains 8 grams of protein, including 9 essential amino acids. Since our bodies don't produce essential amino acids on their own, we need to consume

them through our diets in order to function properly. Plus, protein helps us stay full, especially when paired with fiber and a small amount of fat — preferably unsaturated fat (like nut butter or avocado).

**Seeing the Bright Side.** If it's hard to get your kids to eat carrots, remember that milk fortified with vitamin A can also prevent eye problems. # DA HEAD BONE CONNECTED TO DA HAM BONE

*Them Bones* is Howard Waldrop's only stand-alone novel. The other few were co-written. He primarily works in shorter fiction and has maybe 10 books of short stories. This novel was written in 1984 and is being republished this year. I, for one, am delighted. I had no idea this book existed. It is without question, even by people who don't like it, one of the most creative and unusual uses of time travel as a plot device ever.

Time travel stories wore out their welcome after H.G. Wells. That is, until now. I am going to say that the time travel in this novel is very quiet. It doesn't make a lot of noise until it screws up. By the way, this time travel isn't a machine; it's a portal. So, presumably, we don't get the whirring disc, the odd noises, and electrical arcing Rod Taylor had to navigate in the movie version of Wells' classic novel.

*Them Bones* has three what I would call episodes. Just on the face of it they only have very thin elements in common. The fact is, time travel figures in the episodes to a lesser degree than other elements of the plot. All three have something to do with archeology. They all seem to be investigating early indigenous Americans to varying degrees. It's a little maddening and, at the same time, riveting. Mr. Waldrop doesn't spoon feed anybody. You are left to draw your own conclusions from the evidence he presents.

Part One has to do with an archeological dig in Louisiana in 1929. They are investigating mound builders much

like the mound builders here in Iowa. They have inspected a promising embankment and recovered interesting artifacts. As they come to the oldest level, they made not one but two brain twisting discoveries, akin to finding a Zenith color TV in King Tut's tomb...WITH space command.

Part Two is my favorite and is narrated by Madison Yazoo Leake. He is a member of the Army's Special Group who are being sent back in time to 1930s Louisiana to try and stop the destruction of the human race in a nuclear war. Leake had a whole contingent of soldiers and CIA officers accompanying him. Leake was first to step through the portal. He was the only one who made it. Made it where? The portal had made a slight miscalculation and, evidently, sent him to another timeline in Quantum World. Leake looked around and what he saw made no sense whatsoever.

Part Three is based on the diary entries of Warrant Officer Smith. Some of the information contained in her diary was very scary. Smith, the rest of the Army soldiers, and the CIA Officers all made it through the portal. They were in their own timeline, which was a good thing. Leake was nowhere to be found and that was a bad thing. Then they started looking around and the Way Back Machine had kept them on their own timeline, it was just that it sent them 300 years further back than they wanted to go. SURPRISE!!!

The people in all three parts had contact with pre-Colombian native Americans. This is where it's all at. I


believe the novel concerns itself with the unfortunate, horrific, and murderous contact indigenous Americans, both North American and South American natives, had

when they met White Europeans for the first time. This is never stated directly. Mr. Waldrop never tells us things; he does what only exceedingly fine writers do and do well. He shows us and this is not an easy thing to do. It makes for a much more interesting story in my view.


That is my interpretation and I hope you come up with your own. There is a lot of room to do so.

For a writer as good as he is, Howard Waldrop sure keeps it all on the down low. His books are frequently out of print but available online in digital versions. He has won a Nebula Award and a handful of other prestigious awards. I hope he writes more novels. Here is the thing. He gets 4 stars from me for sticking to his literary love. It is obvious he likes the shorter forms in expressing himself. Trying to make a living writing short stories is difficult these days when the money and publishing preference is the novel and more than that a connected series of at least three novels telling a long arc story.

So, good on ya, Mr. Waldrop for sticking to what you do best. *Them Bones* is a darn good novel. Can you please, if you find the time, write another one? ■




