



A post by a friend on Facebook made me think about things I was "into" at one time that I find I no longer am. Most of those things changed between college and my professional life, and I'll bet that we all have made that shift. Here are a couple of mine. They both relate to TV but are literally at two very different ends of the entertainment spectrum.

And although I had moved on from NASCAR by then, I was watching the Daytona 500 the day we did lose him.

My favorite driver back then was Mark Martin. He was the best driver that never won a Winston Cup. I'm not sure why I liked him so much. Maybe because one of my roommates did. He just seemed like a good guy. So the Valvoline #6 was my car. He eventually changed sponsors to Viagra and it was just, um, hard, to keep rooting for him then. I'll bet the Mark Martin swag sales dropped out real fast after that.

I kept watching for a few years after college. What else is a bachelor to watch outside of football season in the mid-'90s? A couple years after joining the Jaycees, the guys there started a NASCAR fantasy league. So I played. And I won. The thing was, everyone got one awesome driver and two good drivers, but then with the fourth driver, guys were picking up perennial bottom dwellers like Dick Trickle and Ted Muscrave. I figured, why sill things out with a guy who's never broken into the top in the last 10 years, so I went with a rookie. I think I took Tony Stewart. So, yeah, that worked out well.

But somewhere along the way I petered out on the NASCAR. I don't even know when. And now, I don't think I could tell you the name of five active drivers. I watched part of a race the other day for the first time in a long time and I got confused. I thought maybe I was seeing some practice or something because the place was empty. When I realized it was a live race (I think it was Bristol) I could not believe that the seats were so empty. Then I Googled it and yep, apparently NASCAR is dying a fast death.

Apparently a lot a safety measures were instituted following the death of 19-year-old

Adam Petty, slowing cars. NASCAR also went after a lot trendier markets, getting away from the core, and from what friends say, drivers have become photocopies of the same pretty boy persona and the real diversity of personalities who used to take the wheel is gone. It became a machine and a business instead of a sport on the edge of mainstream. Fame killed it. That's too bad.

On a very different note, the other thing I was into in my first two years of college, I immediately lost interest in once I left dorm life. But this thing was far less of a thing I liked and more of a thing I watched because it was literally THE ONLY THING ON.

In 1992 at the University of Northern Iowa dorms there was no such thing as the internet. There was also no such thing as cable TV. There was VHS and broadcast TV. Except in the Quad (Nohren, Hageman, Rider, and Shull halls) the only channel that rabbit ears could pick up was KWWL Channel 7, undoubtedly because the station was literally broadcasting from next door. So all we could watch was NBC, and we did. We ALL did. Thankfully those were the days of *Cheers, Seinfeld*, and *Frasier* so it was ok on Thursday nights.

The show I'm getting around to is the result of a perfect storm of scheduling. Like everyone, I would get back from morning classes at 11 a.m. and have free time until Redeker Dining Hall opened for lunch at noon. (Coulda been 11:30 a.m. but, hey I'm pushing 50 and it's all fuzzy now.) So from 11 a.m. to noon, me, my roommates, and all the guys in my hall would watch TV for that hour, and the show that was on then was *Days of Our Lives*. Not even kidding. If Nielsen did TV ratings in the quad in 1993, NBC would get 100 percent of the viewership.

One of those two years in the quad, there was yet another tediously long and drudging story line that had Marlena Evans held prisoner in a pit somewhere by a crazy lady who's name I fully remember: Stella Lombard. Everyday we'd watch her almost get saved but not quite. And then one magical afternoon, as about a dozen guys gathered around a TV, John Black found her and our long national nightmare was over. A cheer went up in the room. But then the cheer subsided, and we heard a rumble. It was cheers coming out of hundreds of dorm windows all around the quad. The whole university was cheering for Days of Our Lives. It was a moment I'll never forget.

Then junior year we left campus. We got new videos games and cable and I've never seen *Days of Our Lives* since. Well, I've seen like a minute here and there, usually in doctor waiting rooms, and the kids on the show in 1993 are now 40 and still in contentious relationships with the characters they were fighting then. I'm taking to you Sami and Lucas! That's even sadder than NASCAR. I wonder is Stefano Dimera is still alive?

I wonder if I'll ever stop watching American Pickers or Deadliest Catch. I know Christy is hoping I do, and soon.

Bloktoberfest returns on Saturday, Sept. 21, Noon-7 PM to the Millwork District this fall. When the event was just a crazy new idea in 2018, we sat down with organizer Chris Puetz for his take on how Bloktoberfest was going to reinvent the festival in Dubuque. Hoping more for an event done right than a huge crowd, Chris didn't know what to expect. If a big crowd was to be

the measuring tick for how well the idea went over with Dubuquers, all we can say is, um... that worked! "It was great," Chris said at the start of this year's interview. "You take big chances, you don't know den, Holy Cow! It was clearly something very different. The stars aligned and it was a perfect fall day, and if we could repay that I'd really appreciate it. There's so much I didn't expect. The BMX was so popular, people were packed in around it all day. The kids area was so popular, kids were everywhere, playing with the stuff from Creative Adventure Lab and painting on the paint wall, just kids being kids interacting with each other."

Now organized by Puetz's own non-profit "Be A Decent Human," his hope is to build on the success of last year with just a little more sprinkled on top.

"It's different from other events in Dubuque, and it ended up being amazing. I didn't expect the crowd to build the way it did, and how people found interest in so many different things made the event so much more than just another music festival. It was truly an active event. There's also never been anything of that scale down here in the Millwork District and people loved it."

It seems like all the events the Millwork District touches turn to gold lately. The Millwork Night Market is wildly popular, concerts in the courtyard at the Schmid Innovation Center have great turnouts, and now Bloktoberfest is introducing this revitalized part of Dubuque whole new audiences. It can only mean positive vibes from the resurrected part of Dubuque old industrial complex.

"It's got a good vibe to it. There's something really fun about hanging out between these giant, old, repurposed buildings. I'm thrilled we have this. This is unique. This is Dubuque. It's becoming a community center, and that was the purpose of this whole festival. It was never a festival just to throw a street party."

"This year is bigger. We're moving some things around. The BMX is moving to a new street, and they're giving a whole street to the kids. People thought having the kids next to the band area was loud last year so they listened, made the kids area way bigger for even more kids opportunities, and also distanced it from the stage for a sound buffer. It's a great, free thing for parents to take their kids to locally. The vendors also have a new space, all working around the exciting but inconvenient construction currently happening in the area. That would be the soon-to-be Dupaco headquarters, and as new neighbors in the area, they've joined the festival as a major sponsor."

Jessica Pfohl Paisley from PS Styling is bringing in a fashion show featuring some of the business in the Millwork area, but it also coincides with New York Fashion Week, so it's the theme for the show and a great way to feature this businesses.

"We are bringing back the musical headliner from last year, the Zealots. They were just signed to a major record label, so were afraid we wouldn't be able to get them again. They won a major Battle of the Bands competition in L.A.







after performing in Dubuque last year and have been on tour ever since. But they had such a great time last year that they wanted to come back. So that's great. A second band is still to be announced, and the kids area will have its own DJ, playing lower volume kid-friendly tunes."

This year Bloktoberfest has brought in six breweries from around Iowa to be part of the event including Exile, Toppling Goliath, Big Grove, Single Speed, and Front Street, plus, of course local favorites 7 Hills Brewing and Potosi Brewing. And don't worry Dad, mainstream favorites like Stella Artois and other Budweiser products will be available, too. The Jaycees are back serving up those cold beers again this year.

The extremely popular beer yoga, led by Jessica Hruska is coming back as well as is a tug of war battle between off-duty members of the police and fire departments. And great food is on the menu again this year featuring the best of Millwork District from Brazen Open Kitchen, 7 Hills Brewing Co., the just reopened Charlotte's Coffee House, and Frosted & Filled cupcakes with, we're told, one more yet to be added.

YOUR PIE ORIGINALLY RUN ON JANUARY 11, 2018 BY RICH BELMONT

This is the story of a new pizza place in Dubuque. Your Pie is a franchised store specializing in fast casual brick-oven baked personal size pizzas. They feature homemade and hand tossed, hand stretched dough with only the freshest and highest quality ingredients available.

This is also the story of two men. The first man is Drew French. In 2006 he married Natalie and then in the same year he visited her Italian family who live on the Island of Ischia, Italy. Ischia (pronounced ees-key-ah) is a small volcanic island located 19 miles from the City of



Naples in the Gulf of Naples. Drew was very impressed with his new family's love of food and particularly their use of brick ovens and the perfectly crisp doughs and smoky, earthy flavors of the food that came out of them.

When Drew and Natalie returned home to Georgia, Drew began to plan for opening his own pizza restaurant. Relying on the training he received while acquiring his business degree from the University of Georgia and the experience he gained while on Ischia he opened Your Pie in 2008 in Athens, GA. Soon, thereafter, he began franchising the custom order-your-pizza-the-way-youwant-it concept. Today there are approximately 55 Your Pie locations in 16 states.

The second man in this story is Dan Sacco. He and his business partner, Doug Ormsby, are the owners of the Your Pie franchises in Davenport and Dubuque. They opened the Davenport store on



May 5, 2017 and the Dubugue store on Dec. 15, 2017.

Dan is a native of Dubugue who attended Wahlert Catholic High School. He graduated from Iowa State University in 1976. He returned to Dubuque and for the next 5 years was a teacher at Resurrection Elementary School. During this time he had a part- time job working at the Mining Company Restaurant. In 1981 he opened Spatts Malone's and then became a Manager

at Pizza Hut. During the 20 years he was with Pizza Hut he was a Store Manager, District Manager and Certified Corporate Trainer. He had to relocate a few times during his career and lived in DeWitt, Iowa, Peoria, IL and built a Pizza Hut from the ground up in Eureka, IL. He met Doug when they both worked for Pizza Hut and they have now been working together over 25 years.

In 2005 Dan and Doug opened Pancheros Mexican Grill franchise stores in Davenport and Dubuque. They are still the owners of these restaurants so as of now Dan has been in the restaurant business for over 40 years!

Dan says his philosophy is very simple: Provide excellent customer service, serve only high quality fresh food and always give your customers an exceptional value. Oh, and one more thing: Have intelligent, hard-

working people with positive attitudes. He currently has a staff of 24 who are under the direction of his talented and experienced General Manager, Haley Cottrell. She has been one of Dan's managers for several years.

Much of the taste of Your Pie pizzas can be attributed to the brick oven. It is a Wood Stone Brand Oven manufactured in Bellingham, WA and is well known to top pizza makers throughout the U.S. Wood Stone ovens have one-piece dome ceilings and floors and can easily maintain accurate temperatures well over 800°F. The oven used in this pizzeria is a gas fired open flame classic pizza oven.

The dough is homemade from scratch. It is handtossed and hand-stretched. This actually has a purpose and is not merely done for show. Hand-formed crusts are not worked very hard like crusts that are rolled. They are airy and full of holes. The pizza maker's fingers create and exaggerate air pockets in the dough allowing gas to expand during baking. This causes the crust to bake with more blistering and variations in color and texture.

In this photo Pizzaiolo (pizza maker) Jerome Finzel is stretching the dough. The owners of Your Pie understand their

key to success depends on the use of all fresh ingredients of the highest quality. All sauces and dressings are made in-house. All meats are sliced on the premises. Vegetables are cut daily and fresh basil, cilantro, jalapeños and garlic are chopped every day as needed.

All the pizzas are a 10 inch personal size. The beauty of Your Pie is you get to order your very own pizza just the way you like it. Here is how you customize your pie:

STEP ONE: CHOOSE THE DOUGH

White, Wheat or Gluten Free

STEP TWO: PICK A SAUCE

Marinara, Extra Virgin Olive Oil, Buffalo Sauce, BBQ, Ranch or Basil Pesto

STEP THREE: SPECIFY THE CHEESE

Feta, Ricotta, Parmesan, Provolone, Vegan Cheese, Shredded Mozzarella or Fresh Mozzarella

(I prefer fresh mozzarella because it is creamier). (Fun Fact: The Vegan Cheese is from Daiya, a dairy alternative food company in Vancouver, BC. Daiya Mozzarella Style is made from cassava and arrowroot and is known for cheese-like consistency)

STEP FOUR: ADD MEATS

There are eight of them and don't be afraid to try unusual ones like meatballs or salami.

STEP FIVE: ASK FOR YOUR FAVORITE VEGETABLES

There are 17 choices

Hint: Go ahead and ask for all the toppings you want. There is no limit!

On those days when you just don't want to pick out all these ingredients you can order one of the six specialty pizzas. These include:

- Ischia Basically a Margarita. Extra Virgin Olive Oil, fresh mozzarella, tomato, basil and garlic.
- The Nat a delight for basil pesto lovers. Pesto, mozzarella, feta, sun-dried tomatoes, spinach and chicken.
- Great White an unusual three cheese pizza. Extra Virgin Olive Oil, garlic and ricotta, mozzarella and feta cheeses.



NONNO'S ITALIAN PANINI

The Panini are all very good. I especially like Nonno's Italian Panini. (Nonno is Italian for Grandpa). It is on a toasted fresh baked panini roll and is stuffed with provolone, spinach, tomatoes, red onions, ham, salami and pepperoni.

When you are just in the mood for a chopped salad there are 3 of those to choose from: Caesar, Caprese and Greek.

A Combo turns your Pizza or Panini into a complete meal. It includes a drink plus side salad or chips or Gelato. I prefer the Gelato, because as you know I always like to finish my meal with dessert!

If you are like me you might enjoy an alcoholic beverage with your meal. There are 10 Iowa Brewed Craft Beers on tap. There are also several popular beers in cans or bottles.

There are 5 wines available for those Oenophiles (wine connoisseurs) among us. They are \$6 per glass and \$23 per bottle. Remember, a standard 750 ml bottle of wine contains 5 glasses.

Wednesday is Wine Day. All glasses of wine are only \$3.14. Thursday is Pint Night. All craft brews are only \$3.14 per glass. So why is the price \$3.14? Well, Your Pie is in The Pie Business. Pi (pronounced pie) and depicted by the Greek letter ϖ is a number. It is approximately 3.14159... and is the circumference of any circle divided by its diameter. It is shown as $\varpi = c/d$.

Be sure to check out the large photos on the walls. The one in front is Natalie French's family on the Island of Ischia. The photos in the back are of Dan's Grandparents, Charlie and Mary Sacco. Charlie came to the US when he was 16 from Gizzeria, Italy. The first photo is Charlie and Mary's wedding photo from 1916. The second photo was taken on their 60th wedding anniversary in 1976.

I recommend you check out Your Pie. About 65 percent of the customers order their customized favorite pizza by choosing their own ingredients. I suggest you do the same and "Express Your Inner Pizza!"



I got that feeling in my stomach. You know that queasy feeling. Come on Matt. This is what you do for a living. I know this stuff. I teach this stuff.

It became painfully obvious I was encouraging my puppy and rewarding my puppy more than I was encouraging and rewarding my own kids. Ouch, this one hurts. Oh. the horror! Why? Why is this happening? Maybe if I could put the kids in the kennel, yeah. Or what if I put shock collars on them? Would that work? Wait, wait, I know. I know why I'm treating the boys like that, because that's how I was raised. Do I sound like my dad? I do sound like my dad. My dad was more of a hands-on speaker if you know what I mean. The more I studied it and the more I thought about it, the queasier that feeling got in my stomach.

If I'm not encouraging my kids enough, am I encouraging my wife enough? What about the rest of my family? How about my friends, neighbors, and coworkers? As a professional speaker. Lencourage others for a living, and I wasn't doing a very good job at home.

Our family learned a bunch at puppy preschool, but what I learned is much bigger than a pouch full of pepperoni flavored treats. When you're encouraging someone, there's no room for criticizing, condemning, complaining, and gossip. Simple words and actions of encouragement push the negativity right out of the room and your life. I wasn't encouraging others enough. How about you? Are you encouraging others enough in your life?

Researchers at Yale University recently found that participants in a study who ate two ounces of walnuts every day for six months had significant reductions in LDL (bad) cholesterol. WALNUTS CAN HELP LOWER BLOOD PRESSURE, TOO

In addition to lowering cholesterol, walnuts may also help decrease blood pressure, especially when combined with a diet low in saturated fat. Consider replacing a snack that's high in saturated fat with a small handful of walnuts.

Walnuts are the only nuts that contain significant amounts of omega-3 alpha-linolenic acid (ALA). Your body uses this type of fat for energy and, to a limited degree, it can convert ALA into EPA and DHA—the essential omega-3s you get from certain fatty fish.

WALNUTS HAVE ANTIOXIDANTS

Walnuts contain powerful antioxidants and polyphenols that may help prevent cancer as well as memory loss and cognitive decline.

WALNUTS CONTAIN FIBER

A ¼ cup serving of walnuts also gives you 2 grams of fiber, a nutrient that can help lower cholesterol and help you feel full. Americans eating a 2,000-calorie diet should aim for 28 grams of fiber daily.

Walnuts work well in baked goods, but they're also great on cereal, salads, and even pastas and pizzas. Ready to stock up? Pro tip: Look for walnuts in the bulk section. To store, place shelled nuts in an airtight container in the freezer.

ROMEO, ROMEO WHERE THE HELL ARE YOU?

The novelist Kate Atkinson has written 10 novels with which she has reached the pantheon of British writers. Her latest, *Transcription*, is an espionage story taking place during WWII. There are echoes of two great English spy novelists, John Le Carre and the man at the top of the heap, also considered one of the great writers of the 20th century, Graham Greene.

Transcription shares similarities hiding interesting differences with John Le Carre's *The Spy Who Came in From the Cold* and any one of the half dozen or so Graham Greene spy novels like my personal favorite, *Our Man in Havana*. You will find parallels in the general type of characters all three use and in the plot insofar as they all deal with lying, stealing, and cheating. The plots tend to be convoluted and quite complex. The themes are overlapping as well: love of country leading to the lack of a moral compass to do things for your country that would be considered illegal or immoral.

In 1950 Juliet Armstrong is working for the BBC as a producer of children's programs when she sees an old colleague from the days she spent in MI5, the British Secret service during the war. He denies even knowing her. This triggers all kinds of memories going back to 1940.


Juliet was 18 and hired by MI5 to join a small unit running an operation to identify Nazi sympathizers. They rented two apartments side by side, one for meetings to draw in Nazi types run by an MI5 double agent posing as a Gestapo Officer. In the other, they had a number of devices to record what was said next door. It was Juliet's job to transcribe the conversations.

MI5 finds out one of the participants has her own little discussion group and they become aware of the existence of the Red Book, containing a list of almost all of the Nazi sympathizers in England. MI5 has a mole in the group who takes Juliet and introduces her to Mrs. Sciafe, a promotion apparently. Juliet worms her way in and through a few mistakes, Juliet is responsible for an innocent person's death. That's just the start of Juliet's problems.

The war ends and Juliet is hired by the BBC. Over the course of a week or so in 1950 Juliet bumps into, seemingly by accident, many of the people she worked with at MI5. Juliet absolutely is not interested, but they want her back in. She is told there is another kind of war being waged that involves the communists whereas the war they fought involved the fascists.

Juliet finally agrees and they ask her to start spying on her former workers. Other things happen I will not reveal. She has a real and massive shock about Great Britain.

Every once in a great while a book will surprise me. Ms. Atkinson has managed to stop my breath on at least two occasions and it all made sense. Kate Atkinson's books have just gotten exponentially better. Her last three novels, *Life After Life, A God in Ruins*, and *Transcription*, are outstanding, elegant, funny like Graham Greene, and filled with damaged characters like John Le Carre. She leaves a lot unsaid, like Graham Greene. It would seem that many of her characters would be in the box labeled I Don't Know How We Won The War With These Bumbling Idiots Running It.



Their actions cause the reader to think hard about patriotism, treason and the morality of war itself when some of the Nazi sympathizers come off more committed and far more competent than the those rallying around the Union Jack.

I realize I have been writing entirely about British espionage writers and sharp readers will catch that I have not mentioned the most obvious one, Ian Fleming. Well John Le Carre hit that one pretty hard and Graham Greene had very little to say about the inclusion of Ian Fleming on the list of serious espionage writers. Simply put, Le Carre thought he wrote two good novels in the James Bond series: *Casino Royale* and *From Russia With Love*. The rest were cartoons. Mr. Greene was, how shall we say, disinterested.

Ms. Atkinson uses some Greene-like humor in the first half of *Transcription*. In the second half, we see characters morphing into the tragi-characters of John Le Carre. However, Ms. Atkinson has thrown all this in a hat, covered it with a gauze of a modern novel, and come up with a classic. Look at one of the best writers working in English at

the top of her form, Ms. Kate Atkinson's *Transcription*.






