Where do I begin? We lost a friend today. Not a friend: a family member. A brother. One of our very own at *365ink*. But who am I to claim Mike Ironside? He was one of us at *365*, but he was one of us ALL, and even if you didn't know him, I promise you that you will miss him in these pages from this day on. But at the same time, his mark remains made on these pages forever. Our ambassador of cool has written his final words, taken his last photo, and played his last bass line at the Sandy Hook Tavern, and I'm sadder than I have the words to express.

Joseph Michael Ironside (yeah, did you know Mike was his middle name?) was part of the Dubuque365 family from before it was Dubuque365. When we had the silly idea to start an events website back in 2000, before there was a Facebook or even a Myspace, Mike was part of the team. At the time, he was "Main Street Mike," working for Dubuque Main Street, Ltd., doing their marketing and promotion and running Dubuque... and All that Jazz! through its heyday years. I knew he was the right guy to help us try to tell the cultural story of Dubuque, and man was I right.

Mike was also a talented musician and music lover. That's why he covered all things music for *365ink* through the years. If you knew where a band was playing in town, it was because of Mike. And when he wasn't using his words to make you want to discover all of the other fantastic talent that played our stages, whether just passing through or homegrown, he was making music of his own. I didn't yet know Mike in his Loudmouth band days, but certainly through ochOsol and, of course, in The Lonely Goats for what seems like, well... like it's always been that way.

I could try to tell Mike's impact on other people, and I'd fail miserably. As good as a friend as he was it doesn't hold a candle to the bond he has with his bandmates in The Lonely Goats, one of Dubuque's most prolific, creative, and longest-tenured bands. (You hear that, Iowa Rock and Roll Hall of Fame?) Mike held down the low end on bass while sharing the singing duties. But, the truth is, Mike brought the epicenter of mellow coolness to the stage. which could only ever be upstaged by, oh, say, a lovely belly dancing girl in full feathered wings... and wouldn't you know it, there's one of those in the band. Damn the luck. My heart goes out to this long-time musical family: Jimmy, Amanda, Bob, and Leo (and Mike's trusty backup, Jeff), who I know are all hurting right now. It's hard to get tighter with people than guys you've been in a band with for so many years. I know they will play on, exactly as Mike would want, and hopefully the smiles will continue and the music heals everyone it washes over. And to the larger musical family Mike was part of, you all know who you are ... fan, pickers, singers, writers, dancers, shooters, bar owners, and groupies. Mike is the GOAT!

As much as we all would love to have another day or year with Mike, one thing no one will ever be able to say is that there weren't enough good pictures of Mike because Mike looks cool in every picture ever taken. He could pull off absolutely any look and make it seem like it was second nature to him. The kind of outfit that you or I would try on in a carnival photo booth, Mike could put on and own it. That was just Mike. You could see him play bass dressed as a pirate and not bat an eye because of course he's dressed as a pirate. He IS a pirate at that moment. Rinse and repeat for every costume he ever made real. Hell, the man made a minivan cool, just like Chili Palmer in *Get Shorty*.

When they say a person marches to his own drum, well, Mike sauntered to his own bass line. If there is a service for Mike and the universe holds to form, Mike will roll in about 30 minutes after it starts, and no one will mind because he's bringing the goods. Yeah, his cover stories often showed up about an hour after my heartburn kicked in. But the stories were also good, and I always knew they'd be there. This is, after all, *365ink*. We don't do breakfast. Maybe a long brunch. If we wanted real jobs, we wouldn't be here. Mike fit right in. Or maybe he's the one who rubbed off on the rest of us.

He loved the arts. LOVED the arts, and lived that love through service to the Dubuque arts community as long as he called this town home. He also loved great food and cooking it. He was master and commander of his grill, much to the benefit of many friends. He loved a good cup of coffee, too and a tasty adult beverage on occasion. He loved photography and took a bazillion photos in his life, many for Dubuque365.com and 365ink Magazine. He loved to travel with friends like Michael and Suzanne and lived in Japan for a spell, bringing the love of that culture home with him. He loved camping with his close friends like Bob, Cindy, George, Kathy, and more. He loved his cats, Craig being the current master of the house and therapy cat extraordinaire. Your work is not done yet, little man.

And above all, he loved Julie because, well, Julie is awesome. She's the yin to his yang. I totally get the relationship because I have the same kind in my life. Our amazing, smart, talented, grounded, organized, responsible wives allow us the flexibility to sometimes be the exact opposite. And for some reason, they love us all the more for it. Without Julie, there could not be a properly functioning Mike. And, to no one's surprise, as Mike lived his final days, it seems like it wasn't us making Julie feel better but Julie making everyone who loves Mike feel better. Pragmatic, compassionate, patient, stalwart in support of Mike through his battle. We love you, Julie Steffen, and bow to your awesomeness.


My sincere condolences to his parents and brothers and sisters and family, as he joins his lovely sister Kathryn on the other side of whatever awaits us all.

I love you and everything we've built! Carry on!"

The Mississippi Moon Bar Reopens at Diamond Jo Casino

Our last cover story celebrated the reopening of the beautiful Heritage Center and Butler Hall for live performances once again at the University of Dubuque. Now, with the Diamond Jo Casino's cultural centerpiece, the Mississippi Moon Bar, lighting up again as well, the last of Dubuque's major performance venues is back from a too-long slumber to welcome great touring shows to their stages. By the time you read this, the Moon Bar will already have rechristened the venue with a concert by Don Felder, formerly of the Eagles. It's almost prophetic that the first live music show of the Moon Bar's return was hosted by UnityPoint Health— Finley Hospital, one of the local hospitals that has been on the front lines against the COVID pandemic, caring for Dubuque's citizens, and working to get us back to a place where gathering together to celebrate is again a possibility.

In addition to bringing back the best local talent to the stage, big-time touring stars and longtime favorite tribute shows will soon be rocking out at the Moon Bar. Established favorites like Arch Allies, a tribute to the music of Journey, Styx, Boston, and more, will be joined on the concert calendar by Hairball, the '80s metal tribute, and Here Come the Mummies, a funktastical undead musical feast for the senses. A new, soon-to-be-favorite on this list of great tribute acts, Nightrain, will join the fray on Sept. 17, paying homage to Guns 'N Roses.

Stellar comedy returns to the Diamond Jo as well, with names like Ryan Niemiller from *America's Got Talent*, Rob Schneider, Tape Face (who also rose to fame from *America's Got Talent*), and America's favorite '90s TV dad and comedian, Bob Saget.

And, finally, big-time touring hitmakers will once again start calling the Moon Bar stage home, as Don Felder is followed by Black Stone Cherry in October, Ashley McBryde in December (already sold out), and more to come quickly.

It's equal parts excitement and relief to see the Port of Dubuque's centerpiece for live entertainment power up once again, not just for fans like us, but, clearly, for the Diamond Jo Casino team as well. Marty Maiers, Director of Marketing for Diamond Jo Casino, oversees the live music venue and talked with *365ink* about what it took to not just get through the toughest year in the history of American live entertainment, but also what it looks like ahead on the other side of it.

"It's interesting to look at it now," Maiers begins. "Sixteen months ago, on March 1, you heard rumors, and by March 17, we were closed completely. We know now that they were delusions of grandeur, but at the time, we were hoping to postpone shows for just a couple of months and get ready again for late August. But the news wasn't getting any better, and our facility was still shut down. A lot of employees were furloughed, so it was tough. Coming back in June of 2020, we had a better template of what the future was looking like. All of our business is entertainment, and we were very lucky that we were one of the entertainment destinations that could reopen. But we did it consciously to safely focus on our core product, which is gaming and the sportsbook. And we always knew live entertainment was going to come back, but it was going to have to be that last piece of the puzzle."

In June of 2020, they were still hoping that maybe another six months would see things getting back to normal, but by September, they saw that it was going to be at least another year, fall of 2021, before live music was going to return to the Moon Bar. "It was overnight that the Moon Bar became a warehouse," Maiers says. "All of our excess slot chairs, restaurant chairs, and tables all got crammed in there, so we could create a safe, socially distanced venue for gaming amidst COVID. It was kind of sad to look around, knowing how much fun and excitement this venue brings to people, and here it was looking very much out of place."

But it wasn't gone. It was simply in a holding pattern. In a crisis, everyone and everything becomes what it needs to be to weather the storm, and that's what the Moon Bar did in order to carry the rest of the Diamond Jo through to the other side of this time, and now it's time for it to shine once again. Well, that year has passed. Patience and planning have persisted and now is time for the payoff.

"So, we've been preparing," says Maiers. "We're excited, we're gung-ho, ready to open up the Moon

Bar and get cranking out great live shows again. To be able to transform the room back to what it should be has been really exciting for our crew."

"Prior to COVID, we were always Dubuque's most prolific live entertainment venue, cranking out three to four shows per week with music and comedy. As we come back, we're focusing on at least one show a weekend, maybe two. What that means for staffing is bringing a lot of people back who were our audio-visual technicians, and we've had to split up some of the duties like booking bands and talent management amongst other people. Unfortunately, we did have some people that, being down for six months, found other employment opportunities, which we fully understand, and it's great for them. But we have a good crew back now to move ahead with this new slate of shows. Our first was Don Felder on Aug. 14, and we'll continue to dust off some cobwebs for the rest of August as the old crew and some new team members get back in the flow and get this concert venue running on all cylinders again. And then in September, we'll get back into some of the tried-and-true shows that people always love, and which do very well for us."

We listed many of those shows at the top of the story, and you can check the sidebar for a full rundown of what's on the calendar—so far—through the end of 2021.

"It was an interesting process," says Maiers, "navigating the live music landscape over the last 16 months, and the whole live music industry was going through it with us. Nobody knew what was going on for sure. Different parts of the country were opening up faster than others. We did maintain constant contact with them to see what the prevailing winds were for the industry. And it was in March or April of this year that we said, 'Let's do some solid dates.' I would say three-quarters of the shows that we have for the rest of the year are going to be shows rescheduled from earlier, where we had ticket sales already in place. We're honoring those tickets where we had a built-in audience, and then went back on sale with them and started to fill back up. So now we're looking to fill in some of the calendar gaps with some new acts."

The touring music market has been interesting and volatile recently. Pretty much every artist was off the road for a year, and then they all came back at once. There are still fewer places that have come back to host live music, but a good amount have returned. Maiers believes both of those realities combined have created a kind of congestion, with a lot of bands out

there looking for slots. And with a changing booking outlook comes very different touring scenarios.

"So far the only thing we've come up against are the artists, and understandably so, who are hesitant to do meet and greets with 30 people, all that shaking hands and getting close," explains Maiers. "We do get questions about how is lowa, and Dubuque, doing with positivity rates, and that communication is always ongoing. Contract language has obviously changed to address the issue more specifically, but overall, the process has been the same. The pandemic is not over, and as a business, we're certainly handling it better. We've learned things. In this day and age, you have to stay on your toes for any market-changing conditions."

Considering how well the Diamond Jo team adapted to create an extremely safe, comfortable, and accommodating venue in the first month of operation following the shutdown of 2020, we know the same level of forethought and customer comfort and safety will be in place as they build on their great history of being a beating heart of live music in the Dubuque community. And with a beating heart comes vitality.

"The return of live entertainment is going to bring a new energy back to Diamond Jo Casino," says Maiers. "For the better part of nine months, we were open as a casino with slots, table games, the sportsbook, and some restaurants, but with the different mandates for masks and social distancing, it didn't feel like the full experience. In March, we were able to scale back some of the restrictions. More people are coming here and enjoying themselves. This has been the return of a summer of fun for a lot of people who were cooped up for a year. That live music and the energy and what it brings to the facility with more people coming down to enjoy themselves, it's hard to describe. But it does alter the mood of the whole casino for team members and guests."

Based on the recent successes at venues like Five Flags Arena, the question of "Will they come back out?" seems to have been answered. Marty Maiers had his own first experience "back" to live music just days ago and saw it first-person.

"I went to Dave Matthews Band last weekend," he explains, "and being in a crowd of 30,000, I wondered what that would feel like. We discussed that feeling amongst our staff, too, talking about how soon would it be before people would be comfortable with being close to each other? We didn't know if it would be weeks or even much longer. But from our experience at that big concert, it ended up being very quick. Probably about 10 minutes when people got over it and rocked out. Being in a big crowd like that again was exciting. I'm a big concert-goer myself, so being able to see that for the first time in two years was really cool."

While music is coming back, there are some changes post-COVID that will not go back to the way they were, and for the most part, it's a national trend, not just a Dubuque thing.

"Since reopening, we've been operating food-wise with three main elements: Woodfire Grille, The Filament, and Subway," Maiers explains. "We are working on a plan to bring The Game Sports Bar back. Unfortunately, The Kitchen Buffet will not be coming back, and we are in the process of looking at options for the space, but it's wide open. We don't have a set plan or focus yet, and that timeframe is a little ways down the road."

From Vegas to Atlantic City to California, buffets seem to have had their day in the sun. New options like food courts and indoor food truck concepts are gaining steam. We will have to wait and see what the future holds for The Kitchen Buffet space at the Diamond Jo.

While the new world is going to continue to evolve in the wake of COVID and its aftermath, it seems certain that our desire to gather together to celebrate and to enjoy the arts and culture of our community will never go away; whether or not we have to adapt, we experience that joy. And with the return of Mississippi Moon Bar to the offerings at the Diamond Jo Casino, we have yet another great reason to come together again.

"Dubuque has grown with live music, and it seems that our city has been at the forefront nationally with getting these crowds back again," says Maiers. "It has been exciting to see Five Flags come out hosting big shows and the Back Waters Stage returning outdoors and both doing it so successfully. It's been great for Dubuque and the market, and we feel like now it's our time to get back in the game with our culture of live music and bringing people to the city."

This past weekend's concert was just the beginning for Mississippi Moon Bar. "The energy and excitement during Don Felder's performance reaffirmed what our venue was intended to be," said Wendy Runde, Diamond Jo Casino General Manager. "We are thrilled to bring live music back to the Moon Bar."





16th Annual Dubuque Irish Hooley Music Festival Featuring Gaelic Storm

Sometimes when life gives you lemons, life gets even sweeter! Let us explain...

The Dubuqueland Irish return after a year hiatus, just like everyone else, to host the 16th Annual Dubuque Irish Hooley Music Festival in the Port of Dubuque on Saturday, Aug. 25, from noon to 10 p.m. The festivities, as always, center on the Alliant Amphitheater at the Star Brewery. And also, as always, the cultural celebration includes world-class Irish music, Irish dance, cultural events, food and gift vendors, and beverages from Ireland and America.

First, COVID canceled 2020 pretty much entirely as far as festivals and culture go. And then, as this year's Hooley approached, it tried to ruin the fun again, as the planned headliners, The Screaming Orphans, got stuck in Europe because of the ongoing lockdowns and were not going to be able to make it to America, much less Dubuque to celebrate with us. Well, as we said at the top, sometimes life gives you lemons and you turn around and make Gaelic Storm lemonade out of it. Yes, the all-time kings (and queen) of Irish parties in Dubuque (and across the country) found a way to wedge an opening in their American tour schedule and save the day in Dubuque. So instead of the party getting smaller, it just got bigger. MUCH BIGGER!

If history holds to form, the day starts early with a traditional Opening Ceremony with Ancient Order of Hibernian's Dubuque County Divisions and Ladies of Ancient Order Hibernians followed by Salute to Armed Forces and area Veterans. Ian Gould plus The Dubuque Fire Pipes and Drums bring their killer shows next, and then the McNulty School of Irish Dance kicks into high steps.

Music is always central to the fun and success of the Irish Hooley, and this year is no different. Did you know Dubuque now boasts two great traditional Irish groups (not including the awesome Dubuque Fire Pipe and Drums)? The Lads have been playing fun sing-along pubstyle Irish favorites for many years in the area and always bring the party to any stage they fill. More recently, Ballyheigue formed as a five-piece Irish band specializing in traditional instrumental and vocal Irish songs. Comprised of family members Jim, Alison, and Emily Ott with Rob McCullough and Jason Kuntz, they have quickly amassed a following with skillfully performed tunes that will keep your feet falling and the eye (Irish or otherwise) smiling.

Joining our local talent is Ian Gould. A guitarist and singer from Belfast, Northern Ireland, Ian today shares Irish wit and his striking voice with American audiences with a show that shares pub spirit and conjures images of Ireland.

The now-headlining Gaelic Storm needs no introduction in Dubuque. It's hard to imagine a band just coming into their own after 20 years of success, but that's exactly what makes a true anomaly. This multinational, Celtic juggernaut grows stronger with each live performance, and as you can imagine, after two decades and over 2000 shows, it is a true force to be reckoned with. With their latest release, *Go Climb a* *Tree*, their music has never sounded more representative of themselves as musicians and as live performers.

You will, of course, be able to wet your whistle of great cold beers including those of the Irish persuasion as well as tasty food from Stone Cliff Winery, West Dubuque Tap, Happy's Place, and Freddie's Popcorn.

The Irish Hooley Music Festival offers an annual cultural event by collaborating with like-minded nonprofit organizations, plus a host of volunteers and sponsor companies. In the past 15 years, over \$500,000 has been contributed in the Tri-State area. For 2021, they plan to continue sharing with Research For The Kids as their primary hosted nonprofit.

The music and cultural event seeks to involve young and old alike, so that we may all gain a greater appreciation for our Irish-Celtic heritage and celebrate it together.





Chop's Kall Inn Old-fashioned as a virtue

It says something about supper clubs that the drink most associated with them is an old-fashioned, the first designed cocktail. A singular mixture of whiskey or brandy, bitters, sugar, and water was concocted in the early 19th century somewhere along the east coast. As bartenders developed fancier cocktails with more and more spirits and liqueurs, many customers wanted the simpler "old-fashioned" and the name stuck. With a slice of orange and a cherry on top, the drink as we know it today has not changed in more than a century. There is some comfort in going back to the original concoction.

Supper club dining inspires similar feelings. Supper clubs started appearing sometime in the middle of the 20th century, especially here in the upper Midwest. Usually located just outside town in rural areas to make obtaining liquor licenses easier, they presented upscale dining in a fancier setting and soon became the thing to do on a weekend evening. As food trends changed and restaurants started offering lots of fancy options, there remains a hankering for good, simple, reliable, and still somewhat aspirational food.

Chop's Kall Inn comes with a lot of history and represents supper club traditions faithfully; from the red velvet décor to a relish tray that greets you on the table, from homemade dips and dressings to ice cream drinks. According to Allie Sparrgrove, one of the managers, "There is a deep appreciation for the staff and the guests" that informs the place. Allie comes from a lineage steeped in supper club culture. Her parents, Chop and Julie Moor, now run Kall Inn (hence the possessive "Chop's" in the title) with the help of their children. Allie remembers working with her other three siblings at 3 Mile House as they grew up; that establishment was in their family for nearly four decades before Chop and Julie sold it in 2017. Their "retirement" did not last long as Jeff and CeAnne Kaiser, the current owners of Kall Inn, asked Chop and Julie to take over the management, and they opened Chop's Kall Inn last November.

The relish tray is one of the mainstays of any supper club, and Chop's definitely makes you feel welcome when

you approach the table. There are three homemade dips surrounding the fresh vegetables (carrots, green peppers, celery, cauliflower, radish, and cucumber) in addition to baskets of crackers and breadsticks. There is good old ranch, Grandma Velma's cheese dip with a cheddar base, and braunschweiger, the liverwurst-like meat paste that was new to me. My dinner companions proceeded to educate me on how no self-respecting Germanic supper club in Wisconsin would dare not have its own braunschweiger. I don't know if I will ever be a convert to meat pastes, but I definitely enjoyed the cheese dip with its sweet taste and sour cheddar notes.

The menu looks very traditional for a supper club. Allie did tell me that they will add soup in fall and winter as her mom (that would be Julie Moor) makes wonderful homemade soups. But otherwise, they were sticking with the expected supper club menu and focusing on doing it well. When supper clubs started, the idea of elevated cuisine was steaks and meats, hard-to-obtain seafood, all paired with robust vegetables. The shrimp cocktail would have been quite a sight-fresh shrimp could only be obtained in the Midwest through refrigerated railcars, and it was one thing that would distinguish a supper club from a home meal. You do find a shrimp cocktail on the appetizer menu here along with steak bites and fried items like onion rings. The cocktail sauce has a nice bite to it.

Chop's offers a few sandwiches—hamburger, cheeseburger, fried chicken, or cod. They also have a hefty chef's salad. All come with the choice of a potato, salad, or when it arrives, soup. For pasta, you have a choice of beef tips and noodles or classic Alfredo. Our group, though, went directly to the specialties!

If you want beef, there is the filet, the ribeye, the sirloin, or the hamburger steak. The steaks are grilled to order—my friend ordered her sirloin medium, and I could cut off a piece with my dinner knife. You can add mushrooms and onions to the hamburger steak—the portion is quite generous. For pork, you can get pork chops or ham steak. Chicken can be grilled or broasted. The specialties come with two choices—some salad and potato. I asked for hashbrowns with cheese, and it was nice and crispy.

If you want a true supper club meal, you must try the surf and turf, one of the signature combinations to define supper clubs! You can pair the filet with an African lobster tail or shrimp. One of my dining partners had the filet with fried shrimp and was quite content with the combination. You can also pair the shrimp with barbecue ribs. One of our party members had the pork chop with chicken combo-the dark meat of the chicken was tasty and a nice departure from grilled white meat. I never understood the reticence of some diners to try dark meat, with some even believing that white meat is somehow healthier (perhaps confusing red meat with dark meat).

As mentioned above, seafood brought in refrigerated cars defined the supper clubs of yore, and that is reflected in the large selection of seafood on Chop's menu. There is lobster, shrimp, scallops, salmon, catfish, and cod, and you can get them

in various combinations. I was intrigued by the stuffed shrimp, where shrimp was stuffed with a seafood blend and cheese, breaded, and deep fried. The shrimp with a squeeze of lemon and dipped into the cocktail sauce made for a well-balanced bite, the sweetness of the shrimp and the fat of cheese working well with the mild acidity of the lemon and the sharpness of the sauce. The cod was the nightly special on the Friday we went, either broasted or baked. The mild fish with dense flaky flesh is beautiful when fried well.

I would be remiss if I did not mention the ice cream drinks. While cocktails have always been a prominent aspect of dining at supper clubs (the kids can always have their Shirley Temples!), the ice cream drinks also work as a great meal ender. The Grasshopper is probably the best known of these-a great mixture of crème de menthe and crème de cacao served with mint ice cream. I do not normally like mint-flavored drinks, but this was a delightful surprise. Another signature cocktail invented in Milwaukee is the Pink Squirrel, with crème de noyaux (almond, apricot, cherry) and crème de cacao. There is also the Golden Cadillac with Galliano liqueur (Italian vanilla elixir) and vanilla ice cream, and the Charlie Brown with white and dark crème de cacao and

chocolate ice cream. One simply must indulge in a cocktail, even at dessert!

The original Kall Inn supper club opened in 1945 and most likely featured a menu similar to what you can still get at Chop's. There is comfort in keeping the traditions alive; sipping an old-fashioned, and cutting into giant sirloin steak. It is as if time has not passed at all...

Hyle Go Greek for Great Burgers

Flavor up your grilling with a healthy, Greek twist on turkey burgers. Turkey is a lean, heart-healthy alternative to ground beef burgers because it is low in fat and rich in protein. Proteins are the body's building blocks for muscle, hair, skin, blood, and more. A diet with adequate protein may support weight loss by promoting feelings of fullness. Lean protein is highly recommended because it is low in saturated fats, which can cause high cholesterol. Turkey is also loaded with B-vitamins, zinc, selenium, and phosphorus making it a nutrient-rich option you can add to salads, casseroles, and stews.

Grilling turkey can be easy with these simple steps below. Turkey burgers are leaner than traditional beef hamburgers, and because they are leaner, they can be dry unless you "flavor them up" with ingredients that add moisture. One way to keep moisture in the burger while it cooks is to add ingredients like onions or garlic. Both of these ingredients "sweat" when they are cooked and keep the burger moist. Another trick is to add in breadcrumbs. Breadcrumbs keep the moisture in the burger while it cooks on the grill instead of dripping off. Follow these steps for grilling:

- Preheat grill to medium-high heat, approximately 375–400 degrees.
- Clean grill grates with grill brush and rub grill grates with oil to prevent sticking.
- Place turkey burgers on the grill and grill each side for 4–6 minutes (or until internal temperature reaches 165 degrees). Remove from grill and let rest for 5 minutes before serving.

Choose colorful fruits or vegetables to serve as your sides. Salads, along with roasting and grilling fruits and vegetables, are great ways to add flavor and health to your meal! Fruits and vegetables are loaded with vitamins, minerals, and fiber. Aim to eat five to nine servings of fruits and vegetables per day.

Greek Turkey Burger MAKES 4 SERVINGS

Ingredients

- 2 cups fresh spinach, about 1 ½ oz lightly packed and divided
- 1 lb 93% lean ground turkey
- 1 Hy-Vee large egg, beaten
- ½ cup Soiree traditional feta cheese crumbles
- 1 tbsp Italian parsley, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced



What to do in the August Garden...

Mid- August through late September in the Midwest is my absolute FAVORITE time of the year to plant. The ground is "preheated" yet the cool air is here or coming and the plants require less watering to take off running. 

The seeds germinate quickly in the warm days and cool nights and will face less competition from weeds as we move into fall. Don't forget to apply your 3rd application of lawn fertilizer as the summer continues.




