It's Saturday night and I'm finally on the couch waiting for my toes to warm up watching the Hawkeyes take a beating from Michigan in the Big Ten Championship game. It's been a *looooong* day, but a rewarding one. We spent from 8 a.m. to 4:15 p.m. sitting outside in front of Theisen's in Dubuque to raise money and toys for Toys For Tots and did we ever do that.

For starters, it was practically a balmy 30–38 degrees today, instead of a potential zero degrees or a strong wind, snow, or sleet. So, that's a treat. Up until today we've been able to work in t-shirts all week, because of the fanatic weather so we can sport our nice new Toys For Tots t-shirts that Theisen's got for us at the start of the season. We had a nice heater, but we would have survived without it.

The day got off to a great start with toys and money coming in quick and early, and it really didn't let up all day. While I held down the fort at Theisen's, my sidekicks Paul and Jeff took a massive load of toys to Peosta for the Dept. of Human Services' distribution even happening at NICC this weekend. They brought back the Runde Community Support box truck that we've borrowed for the week and we decided to load that up directly at Theisen's because it's a bit bigger than the Theisen's box truck. It was a good call. By 4 p.m.,that truck was packed from bow to stern with toy boxes piled higher than the sides of the boxes. It must be a thousand toys, easily. And they are NICE toys. I saw the prices on toys when I did some toy shopping. So many things we saw coming in that were easily \$40 toys. It was humbling and wonderful. The kind of things I can't afford to buy with my budget. Heck, I'm not even allowed to spend that much per toy if I wanted to.

Rob Anglin and the Radio Dubuque crew joined us for much of the day. And despite not needing to at all, many of out Theisen's friends, from multiple people with the name "Theisen" to guys like Scott Buse and Mitch Klepper who are not staff at the Dubuque store anymore, but who both once managed the Dubuque store, spent a long time outside with us chatting and thanking people for their donations. Current Manager Jim Gabel and his staff were, as always, the best possible hosts to us. And, truly, who can forget the Dubuque Marine Corps League guys who strike a wonderful image standing along the wall out by Dodge St./Hwy 20 and waving at traffic as it passes by? They make Toys For Tots look cool, and they draw a lot of cars into the lot that may have otherwise driven by. So many cars rolled by our table, rolled down their window and handed us twenties, fifties, and hundred dollar bills. Thanks as well to the young helpers from Eleanor Roosevelt Middle School who shuttled toys and greeted shoppers inside for hours.

That added up to about \$4,000 in cash donations. We will call it a great day. But that long day outside also tends to take a bit out of you. So you look forward to going home and resting. But alas, this





past Saturday was also the Teddy Bear Toss at the Dubuque Fighting Saints.

So fast-forward two hours and Paul Gilligan and I were at it again, this time next to the ice at the Mystique Community Ice Center waiting for the home team to score their first goal. which triggers the tossing of teddy bears onto the ice. Despite going down by a goal early, that first Saints goal came with about 5 minutes left in the first period. The doors at the end of the arena were thrown open and we filed onto the ice with 14 big Toys For Tots boxes as the players assisted in gathering the teddy bears together as they came flying over the dasher boards. A short few minutes later we were dragging all of the boxes, completely full, off of the ice, for another super successful night thanks to ImOn Communications, who sponsors Teddy Bear Toss every year. Thank you! We will return on Monday and get those bears on the Runde truck and get them quickly into the system to help make Christmas wishes come true.

This was the end of a jam-packed week of playing with toys. Operating our own toy distribution event again this year is a layer of complexity and organization I never had to worry about in my first 13 years of running the Marine Corps Toys For Tots program. While the Dubuque Multicultural Family Center helped us make that work with the help of many daily volunteers, there are none more awesome than Paul and Sandy Meyer who are working that event just about every day. What a relief they are.

We also made a giant refill trip to the Dubuque Salvation Army, as well as our annual pilgrimage to St. Olaf, IA, to drop off a huge load of new toys and books for the many underprivileged kids of Clayton County. In between all of that, we're picking up hundreds of teddy bears from PetSmart, cookies from Fairway, and dozens of other stores, sort of like a box truck ballet where we're showing up just in time at each place from Galena to Platteville to Dyersville. And, man, I didn't even talk about the five stores we hit on Black Friday to pack a truck with \$5,000 in new toys... and that was at Black Friday prices.

So yeah, I'm on the couch now watching football. And even though we're currently losing, it feels like a well-earned treat.

Speaking of a well-earned treat, I think I'll have some more of the great pizza that Mike Meyer from The Otherside in East Dubuque, IL, delivered to us at Thieisen's today. It sure is nice to be loved and supported by this community. As much work as this is, this makes it so much easier and more rewarding. 21 days to Christmas... we got this!



With accolades reaching back to the late 1980s, Poundstone continues to receive acclaim for her comedy specials, books, and regular appearances on NPR's news guiz show *Wait*, *Wait...Don't Tell Mel*.

Time magazine, in the March 2020 "Best of" issue, listed Paula's HBO special, Cats, Cops and Stuff as one of "the 5 funniest stand-up specials ever." She improvises with the crowd like a jazz musician, swinging in unexpected directions without a plan, without a net—there's a

disarming ease in her craft, an immediate sense that she's so quick on her feet you need never worry about the possibility of something going wrong."

Paula was the first woman to perform stand-up and host the White House Correspondents' Dinner, sharing the dais with the then President of the United States. She has starred in several HBO specials, including Paula Poundstone Goes to Harvard, marking the first time the university allowed its name to be used in the title of a television show. Her live coverage of the 1992 Democratic National convention for The Late Show with Jay Leno was so memorable that she ended up doing the Republican Convention and the Presidential Inaugural as well. In 1994, the 46th EMMY Awards followed with an invitation for Paula to do stand-up on the show, but she insisted on doing live behind-thescenes coverage instead. The producers were so dubious about her decision. unheard of at the time, they cut Paula to one spot. After she filed the first one, they asked her to do three more. Her performance was reviewed as "career making."

Paula just released a new album, Paula Poundstone Goes to College (For One Night). She is the winner of an American Comedy Award for Best Female Standup Comic and has accumulated a list of other awards and accolades too long to mention. She continues to be recognized in innumerable lists, documentaries and literary compendiums noting influential stand-up comedians of our time.







What a time for beer fans to be alive in this country. The United States has some serious problems. That ain't a hot take, no matter where you lie on the political spectrum. But one thing we've managed to come together to sort out over the past couple of decades... is our beer. After a couple of generations, we've re-established beer as a science AND an artform. Good for us. Just look at all the brewpubs in the Tri-State area alone. There's so many I'd probably accidentally forget some if I tried to list them from memory. And I wouldn't be surprised if I just plain don't know about a few. Everybody's brewing their own beer, and I'm so friggin here for it. In fact, I'm just going to say something that would have been laughable 30 years ago: The United States has the best beer in the world. Europe who, am I right?

But you know what's been missing? Something that doesn't necessarily add to the TAPestry of lowa beers (Get it? Like beer taps?), proudly puts that tapestry on display for all to taste. Though I guess one doesn't normally taste tapestries. Ah well... good pun, bad metaphor.

Darkbird Taphouse isn't your usual taphouse where you can try the offerings from one particular brewer. Darkbird Taphouse is a taphouse where you can try the offerings from brewers from all over lowa (with a few taps reserved for out-of-state brewers as well). I'm from Western lowa, and I love that I'm from there and I occasionally go back. That said, there's no way I'm going to try a Plush English porter from Marto Brewing Company in Sioux City if it

means I have to go to Sioux City to get it. That's just way too boring to drive to then end up in Sioux City. And I don't want to have to get into the whole Des Moinesness of it all to try selections from Lua Brewing in Des Moines. But I'll boldly go to Peosta to try them. You wouldn't be able to stop me. Darkbird is where you go if you just friggin' love beer and want to try different beers without making it a whole thing.

BUT! What if you're not a huge beer snob? Or what if you ARE a huge beer snob but want to get your suds on with your non-beer-snob friends? That last question was a trick. Beer snobs have all long-since alienated all their nonbeer-snob friends. But what if? Darkbird doesn't turn up its nose at offering your classic cocktails, nor does it feel it's above serving your Mich Ultras, your High Lives, your Busch Lights. Folks, this is Iowa. We drink Busch Light here. That's the way it is. That's us. It's time for at least one beer haven to embrace that fact. The bickering must stop, and I apologize for any part I ever had in it. Beer shaming is classist and foolish. A world without beer shaming is a world in which we all deserve to live. I'm not saying that Darkbird Taphouse is bringing about world peace, of course. But I AM saying that if world peace ever does come... it'll come from Darkbird Taphouse.

Anyway, you can even get some local Dubuque beers from Dimensional Brewing. Other Dubuque brewers should take the fact that Dimensional is currently the only Dubuque brewery offered as a hint that they might be doing something wrong. Whether you don't want your beers offered there or Darkbird doesn't want your beers offered there. Either way, you need to get your act together. Darkbird is a sanctuary dedicated to beer. Time to come to Beer Jesus.

Speaking of beer cheeses, let's talk food, specifically pretzels. Darkbird makes

their own beer cheese for dipping. I mean of course they do. Can you imagine how embarrassing it would be to own a place that specializes in beer and you DIDN'T make your own beer cheese? Ugh, gawd. I would die. The cheese itself I'm guessing comes from good ol' Shullsburg, judging by Shullsberg playing a big role in many of the dishes on Darkbird's evolving menu. The pretzel comes out of the oven and served up hot with the light toothiness you want from a pretzel. One of the best things about pretzels is that they pair well with literally any beer without exception. If you're there drinking beer but you're trying figure out something to nosh, the answer is pretzel. You can either share it or keep it all to yourself.

If you're definitely sharing, I'd like to direct your attention to the Brewcuterie Board. Yeah, I don't like that name, either. Makes it sound like a flight of beers instead of what it is: a non-pretentious charcuterie board. But I think you'll like what's on it. We're talking an assortment of Shullsburg cheeses, some yummy

Italian cured meats, housemade jams (which I always appreciate on a charcuterie board. Round out that saltiness of the cured meats with some fruity sweetness? Hell yeah, I'm in.), dill pickles, and fancy crackers. A small board feeds two, a large feeds five. Order accordingly.

A word on cheese curds. Look, this is the Tri-States. I'm not going to tell anybody reading this anything new about cheese curds. We know cheese curds. There's absolutely no reason to have bad cheese curds around here. You have all the tools right here. So I'll just copy and paste their description to let you know that they do, in fact, mean business: "Shullsburg cheese curds, house batter, spicy mayo" Nuff said, right?

If you need more of a foundation on which to build your beer drinking session, look no further than the burgers. Iowa Angus ground beef, yo. The Beer Cheese burger has, you guessed it, beer cheese right on the mofo and damn it looks good. I wouldn't know because I was seduced by the Dirty Bird Burger. It

was definitely a case of my eyes being too big for my stomach. Get this: "Two lowa premium Angus patties, Wisconsin cheese curds, cajun mayo, grilled onions, muenster cheese." Right? I could wax poetic about this burger, but the best description I've seen so far comes from our own Kristina Nesteby: "If the Dirty Bird had a dating profile, it would say 'I'm not your typical burger,' and you'd roll your eyes but you'd also swipe right." Yup. Beautifully friggin' said.

Beer and food aside... this place is just friggin' beautiful. The way you can see the lit up sign from the highway kind of reminds me of *Porky's*, but I think that's on me. That is NOT their brand. It's an incredibly nice place with two levels EACH with a bar, and I can't wait to table up outside when it gets warmer.

Everything is shiny and new at Darkbird, so have no fear of the bathrooms.

Darkbird Taphouse is the kind of place you go if you love beer. Not only that, it's the kind of place that makes you love beer. This place is awesome.



#### **Spicy Tuna Roll Ramen**

**MAKES 4 SERVINGS** 

#### Ingredients

- 2 tbsp olive oil, divided
- ½ tsp cayenne pepper
- ¼ tsp salt
- ¼ tsp ground black pepper
- 2 (8 oz each) ahi tuna steaks, about 1-inch thick
- 1 tsp ginger paste
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 32 oz no-salt-added chicken broth
- 2 (3 oz each) pkgs ramen noodles, seasoning packets removed
- ½ cup cucumber, seeded and cut into thin strips
- ½ cup shredded carrots
- 2 tbsp chopped fresh cilantro
- ½ avocado, seeded, peeled, and chopped
- 1½ tbsp dried nori sheets, cut into thin strips
- Sriracha sauce, for serving
- · Sesame seeds, toasted, for garnish

#### **Directions**

- 1. Heat a medium skillet with 1 tablespoon olive oil over medium-high heat.
- Combine cayenne pepper, salt, and black pepper in a small bowl. Rub tuna with spices. Add tuna to skillet and sear for 3 minutes on each side. Remove from skillet and set aside.
- 3. Add remaining olive oil to a medium saucepan. Sauté ginger and garlic until fragrant, about 1 minute. Pour in chicken broth and bring to boiling. Add ramen noodles and cook for 3 minutes.
- Remove ramen from stovetop. Fill four serving bowls with soup and top with cucumbers, carrots, cilantro, avocado, nori, sriracha, and sesame seeds. Slice tuna into strips and divide between bowls. Serve immediately.

### When He Talks We Listen


I was reading my calendar a little late this month. I came upon Nov, 26. It is Native American Heritage Day, and the month of November is American Indian Heritage month. I decided to acknowledge those events by writing about the best book on Native Americans I have ever read, Black Elk Speaks: Being the Life Story of a Holy Man of the Oglala Sioux. The Tribe considered him a mix of holy man, priest, visionary, a preacher, and a shaman. He was deeply involved in two of the most famous battles in the 19th Century. He was only 16 years old during the first battle and 20 or 21 during the second. His birthday is in some doubt, but his mother had reason to remember the event. It was around 1860, so 1860 it became. The first battle was the Battle of the Greasy Grass as the Native Americans know it, but it, surely, will live in infamy as the Battle of the Little Bighorn. The second battle he participated in is something the government and the Army should never forget: the murder-massacre of men, women, and children at Wounded Knee. The Army says there were no women

or children killed at Wounded Knee. Oh yeah!! The Army also said that the Battle of the Little Bighorn was a victory.

John Neihardt AKA Flaming Rainbow was a white man profoundly interested in telling the story of Native Americans. He met Black Elk in 1931, who was 71 years old at the time. Black Elk communed with the Great Spirit who told him to teach Flaming Rainbow about them and to teach him about the other side. Thus began a relationship that lasted every day for months and resulted in the book *Black Elk Speaks*. Their conversations lasted well into the night. Mr. Neihardt was blessed with his daughter who was an expert at dictation, and she caught every word that was spoken. Every word in the book is one long quote. It is unimaginably precious. One of Black Elk's friends, Standing Bear, has drawn a large collection of illustrations, drawings of both battles from the Native American perspective along with a narration to explain the action of both sides. Unbelievable.

Wounded Knee has some spiritual elements to it. It is referred to as the Messianic Dream. Almost all the shamans and holy men had similar visions right before the butchering. There was great confusion and sorrow. Some have said it was retribution for Custer. It has come to this to solve our problems.

Here are a few historical things I learned.
The battle didn't happen just on the afternoon of June 25, 1876. It lasted almost three days, and all of the 210 soldiers that day died, but that wasn't




the entire 7<sup>th</sup> Calvary. I always thought they all died and Custer was stripped, scalped, and mutilated. His body was found. He was stripped. He wasn't scalped, neither was he mutilated. He was shot twice; either wound was lethal.

If you read *Black Elk Speaks*, I guarantee during some parts you will feel the Earth move beneath your feet. It is a haunting book. You cannot read this book and ever again in your life think of Native Americans as blood thirsty, psychotic savages. I bought this book in the '60s and have taken very good care of it ever since. Yes, it's that good, and better yet: IT'S STILL IN PRINT.

# Did you know you can still plant a tree in December?

#### Things You Didn't Realize You Could (Or Should) Do in the Winter

At the time of writing this, it is a balmy 50 degrees, and while this unseasonably warmer weather may be making you think about venturing more outside and (dare I say) planting a tree—I just did last week—there are several things you can do or should do around this time every year.

- Keep watering until the ground freezes.
   Make sure to give any new trees,
   shrubs, or perennials a GOOD drink
   before we go into the winter and the
   ground is frozen. The ground has been
   dry, and if they go into the winter dry,
   some plants will really struggle.
- Take advantage of a late season sale on a tree or shrub. Not sure if you should store or plant them? Go ahead and put them in the ground. They will fair far better in the ground than in a pot. Ideally, you want to allow a month before a hard freeze to establish roots, but it's okay to plant them any time the ground is workable.
- Ensure your equipment is ready BEFORE the first big storm of the season. Don't wait to get your snowblower serviced or to realize that old, rusty shovel just won't cut it this season. Take care of it now. Also, make sure you have a solid supply of ice salt on hand. Ice is slippery. Don't find yourself slipping your way to the store during an ice storm when supplies are slim.

- If you haven't already, get your HVAC system inspected/serviced. It's so important to make sure that your HVAC system is ready for when the thermometer dips below zero and you find yourself cursing the fact you decided to move somewhere so stinking cold.
- Seal any leaky doors or windows to keep your energy costs lower. Check the seals around your windows and doors for drafts. These seals go bad over time and are fairly easy to replace. If you have a lot of bad seals—as is common in many older homes—you can seal the entire window with a special plastic covering that you can find in ready-to-go kits.
- You can still have porch pots and hanging baskets for this season. They're usually composed of live evergreen trimmings that will soak up moisture now and stay vibrant all season. They're a low maintenance way to show some color around your house—and they make really great gifts.
- ... Or you can bring some life inside. Grey skies and shorter days can be depressing. But studies have shown that houseplants can help prevent stress, improve productivity, and have a calming effect on people. Additionally, many houseplants like succulents or spider plants or philodendrons are really low maintenance.


