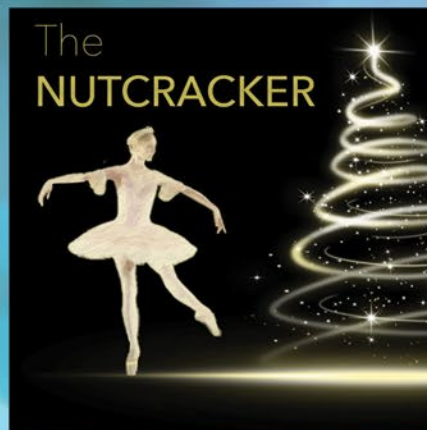
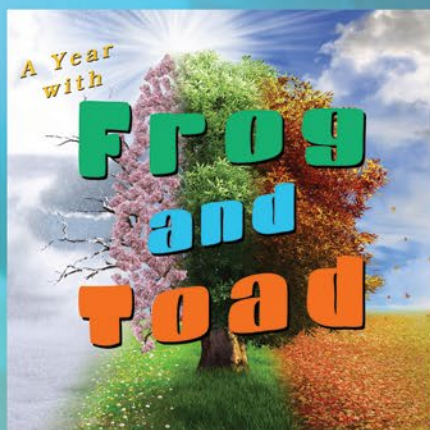

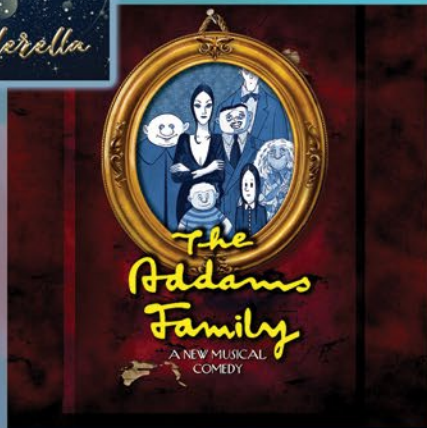

Well, we survived a day in the sun, rocking out at East Dubuque Wingfest XVIII. I think my band, whichever band it is at the time, has played East Dubuque Wingfest about 14 of the 18 years it's been around. And in that time, we've experienced every kind of weather and stage arrangement possible. Usually it's a flatbed semi sitting in the middle of the street.

Last time we played, it was two years ago, and I think it was about a million degrees out. And we played for 4 hours in the beating sun on an uncovered semi trailer. One of our singer Liz's daughters passed out from the heat (and she didn't eat anything), and she wasn't even on the stage. It was a killer.

So this year, Jimmy Zmudka, the man behind the Mud Lake Bluegrass festival, was so kind to not only loan us the tent, but he also specifically jerry-rigged it to work on a semi-trailer, and he actually came over and set it up... for free! It was a life saver. Meanwhile, there's a guy actively wiring new power supply boxes to the fire station so we'd have enough just to rock out while all those wing fryers were pulling 1.21 gigawatts of their own power.

The street filled fast with about, who knows, a thousand people? It was a sea of people. And we had our new keytar player, Bri, with us for this one. She even got her picture in the, um, real newspaper. I told her she's not allowed to get her picture in the paper anymore until she'd loaded the band gear a sufficient amount of times. That includes the subwoofer and also doing the unseemly duty of sucking the excess bubble juice out of Fister's "butt" with a turkey baster.

Okay, so Fister is the fluffy pink unicorn mascot for our band, Unicorn Fist. He shoots smoke out of his horn and bubbles out of his butt... because of course he does. This is thanks to the engineering magic of Paul Meyer. But when the show is done, there's always some bubble juice unused and, well, it's gotta go back into the jug. Rock and roll ain't all glitter and chicks, man. Sometimes it is bubbles and chick-en wings.

The wind kicked up a lot after the second of three sets, and the tent over the stage started to come apart. The poles that ran the length of the tent came out of the end supports, so it kind of looked like the tent was hanging from the balance bar of a highwire performer. And then, the legs of the tent tied to the stage started slipping off the edges of the trailer. So bass player Tom and Bri (welcome to the real life of a rock star) spent the last set basically doing double duty, playing their instruments while also hanging onto their respective poles so the tent didn't collapse



on us. What troopers! I'm not knocking Jimmy. Despite the malfunction, that tent saved our bacon, er... chicken wings.

By hour 3.75 of 4, I was pretty much wiped-out. Liz had worked the phrase "chicken wings" into just about every song we played all day. "Hot Stuff" by Donna Summer became "Lookin for some hot wings baby this evening"... you get the idea. My spot on stage was in full sun now. For the first two sets, it was just my left foot. I had one very hot foot. I was also standing on top of some kind of big steel roller pin on the truck and had to be very careful not to kill myself stepping on that constantly. Thanks to Salon 150, I stole their front door mat for 4 hours to try to cover it up so I didn't step in a hole. I promise, I put your welcome mat back!

In a merciful act, the event organizers came up to use the mic to announce the chicken wing contest winners at 4:45 p.m. It meant we were done. I was done, for sure. This is where I note there were also no stairs to get on or off the semi trailer. Great for old fat guys! But hey, we survived. I was so tired, I didn't even go find our paycheck. I think I drank 10 bottles of water during the gig and didn't have to pee all day and yet never felt sweaty. So the warm breeze was doing its job. We packed up, I went home and flopped right onto the bed. I'll go find a check on Monday.

Shockingly, I eventually showered, took my wife out to dinner because I never did get any chicken wings, which was my own fault. I don't like to eat and play right after. I suffer for my art! I even made it to the Yardarm later in the night to see one of Johnny Trash's last shows for a couple of hours. I'm glad I did. They were awesome, and the crowd was huge, even with Halestorm's giant show at Q Casino going on at the same time, the second giant concert in a row after Elle King filled the Back Waters Stage the night before.

Needless to say, it was a great weekend for live music in Dubuque (and East Dubuque). Not so much of a great weekend for chickens, however. Would I do it again? Yup! Probably next year. Such is the life of a local aging out-of-shape rock star. ■

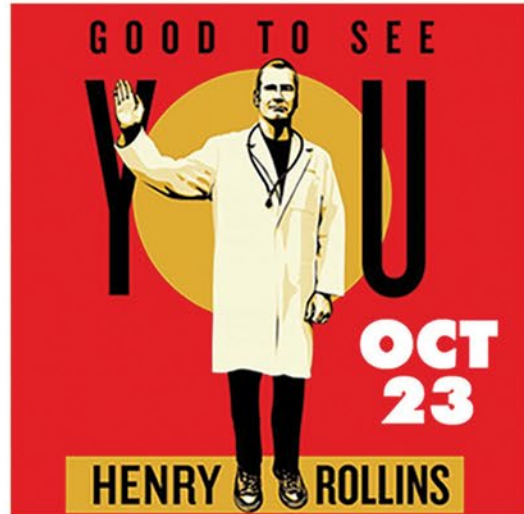

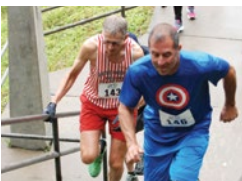

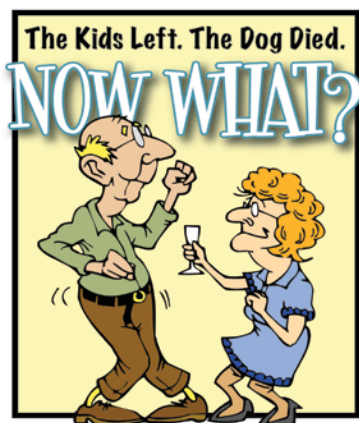

at the end of November is interesting in that it is written for five performers. So they'll be responsible for taking on the roughly 40 different characters in the piece. It will be your traditional story of *A Christmas Carol*, but it's really cleverly written in terms of how they've paired the casting down and how the story is presented. This production is sure to be a fresh retelling of a holiday classic."

"The Dubuque Youth City Ballet is about ready to unveil a whole new production of *The Nutcracker* this year. This year's production will feature new design elements that are inspired by Dubuque and the surrounding area. Audience members might see some familiar imagery that will accompany the exquisite dancing."

Then into the new year comes a sweet and witty play, *Almost Maine*.

"It's just a really fun and relatable piece. It's about relationships and things that we all go through in our everyday life told in a very humorous way. Dubuque Senior High School actually kind of put this play on the map. They were selected to bring the production to the 2009 International Thespian Festival, where thousands of high schoolers and their teachers gathered. *Almost, Maine* became one of the most produced plays the following year and it continues to be one of the most produced plays to this day."

The month of April will feature the Heartland Ballet's production of *Cinderella*. The popular fairytale will feature talented local dancers in a production for the whole family.

"Looking forward to the summer, we're collaborating with Rising Star Theatre Company again in June on *School of Rock*. This production will be the first time in the area that both students and adults can do the show together. We're excited about that opportunity, as well as finding the students who can not only act, sing and dance, but also play instruments. So that'll be fun!"

"Then we round out the season with *The Addams Family*. This fast and funny musical is a bright production of song, dance, and doom that will satisfy theatergoers of all ages," Nick adds with a wicked smile.

Outside of the Grand's own slate of productions, there are already a couple of great outside shows coming to the stage you won't want to miss.

"This fall, we've got Steely Dane coming from Madison on Nov. 3. They are the ultimate Steely Dan tribute band. And then The Dubuque Arts Council is producing Sinatra and Friends for New Year's Eve. This new production will include expanded repertoire that features music from Frank Sinatra and many of his contemporaries. And we're also looking forward to continuing to be a screening location for the Julien International Film Festival in the spring."

So now, all Nick Halder and his crew have to do is pull it off. Piece of cake!

"Personally, there's not a day that I take for granted in my work at the Grand. I am fortunate to go to work everyday and do something that I love. And that's not everyone's lot in life. And probably the most rewarding thing about what I get to do is collaborate with the community on everything that we do. That aspect feeds my soul in a way that a paycheck can't. It's a lot of long days, but yet so rewarding at the same time."

But now they had a clubhouse-shaped hole on their property and a chance to build back better. And they did. With a beautiful, full bar, an incredible view, and good food. They're still not competing with the menu at Timmerman's. This is bar food. The kind of food that gives me life but will probably kill me. And yeah, I know what you're thinking. Lacoma isn't as out of the way as a lot of golf courses, but it's still a little out of the way to go for bar food. Why would you go there if you weren't already there to golf? Two words: Duck wontons. That's why you have to go there. You already like crab rangoons, right? One of the greatest culinary inventions ever. Ever wonder "Why crab?" It doesn't have to be the only kind of rangoon, right? How about we put some duck

bacon in there? Yes, that's bacon made from duck. Smoky, ducky, yum-yum. And cream cheese, of course. Then let's round out the flavors with sweet corn, wrap it all up in a fried wonton, serve it up with some sweet chili sauce, and you know where it goes from there? Into your mouth with a satisfied, "Mmmm!"

You have to go there at least once to try the duck wontons. I don't mean to oversell them. But there are duck wontons being served in the Tri-States. Are you honestly going to do nothing with that information?

And that's just an appetizer. And if you like to keep it classic with your apps, then get ready for Bavarian pretzels, mini tacos, cheese curds, and jalapeño poppers. Or you can get a little cute with cheesy hash puppies. No, that's not something you can pick up at an Illinois dispensary. They're like hush puppies, but cheesy and made of shredded potatoes.

Alrighty! Now let's get on with the main course. Can you imagine the old clubhouse serving paninis? Oh, what a comical thought! But paninis have risen from the ashes of the old clubhouse like a beautiful culinary phoenix. This opens the door to anything from your classic turkey melt to a Cubano sandwich. That's right, one of the greatest sandwiches ever created, the Cuban, is waiting for you in panini form at Lacoma Golf Course. Or you can get one of the other greatest sandwiches ever created: the reuben. We ordered the reuben, and even those in our party that don't dig on kraut thought it was damn good. And I hardly ever miss an opportunity to order a Cuban. The reason for that is because a Cuban is made of thin-sliced ham, pork carnitas, Swiss cheese, spicy mustard, and pickle chips. There's no weak member of the team there. Mmmm. I've had Cuban sandwiches at renowned joints in Tampa and honestly? I think we make them better here in the Midwest. I don't know why. Maybe because I'm pretty sure we keep all the best pork to ourselves.

The reuben was actually a misunderstanding. We intended to order the "brat reuben." It's a reuben. No surprises so far with the corned beef, kraut, Thousand Island dressing, etc. But 'cept now we're taking that deli classic and saying to hell with kosher and putting a juicy brat patty on there then serving it on a brioche bun. A reuben... with a deliciously seasoned pork patty on it. Gotta be sacrilicious, right?

If you're looking for something a little lighter, then might I draw your attention to the salads and wraps. Ever try to split a wrap between four people? You tend to end up with a salad anyway, hehe. But if we hadn't hacked the crap out of it, the wrap was beautifully constructed and contained. Sometimes wraps can get messy. These wraps aren't

merely assembled. They're built. We got the honey BBQ wrap, featuring tossed BBQ chicken, fresh veggies, and tortilla strips. So good with a delightful crunch.

And of course, you got some burger options, all brioche-bunned and delicious. You've got your classic burger, of course. Along with some everywhere-faves like a blue cheese burger or a western burger (bacon, onion rings, BBQ sauce, of course). But you've also got a burger called the Green Jacket. Golf reference. It's got pimento cheese and bacon on it. How friggin' Tri-States is that?

And then there's the view. Lacoma has always been a beautiful course, and even though golf is not for me, you just can't beat the setting. I don't know if looking at well tended countryside helps with the already yummy taste, but it can't hurt, right? It's a pretty chill hang.

Oh! And before I forget! If you're missing those heady Lacoma days of yesteryear, where you get back to the clubhouse ready to wrap your mouth-bones around one of those delicious jumbo dogs, well... stop doing that. You don't have to fruitlessly pine. A lot has definitely changed since Lacoma rebuilt their clubhouse as something better, but those jumbo dogs are still there and as good as ever. But that's not the only thing on their Quick Menu. If you're hungry but gotta get going, you owe it to yourself to try a fast sandwich or a brat. Add a bag of chips while you're at.

But seriously. Long live the jumbo dog. ■

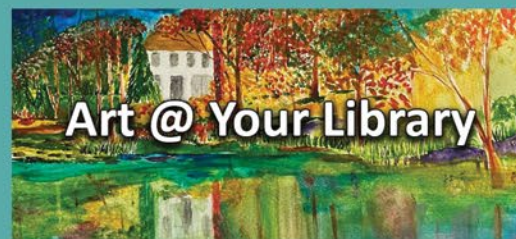

Old God's Time

By John McAndrew

Irish author Sebastian Barry's new novel, *Old God's Time*, is a searching mystery of betrayals, secrets, and the ripples of damage they do. This is not action driven like a *Mission Impossible* film or a *Jack Reacher* novel. It has more in common with one of Hillerman's Joe Leaphorn novels: driven by character, set close to home (Ireland's coast in this case). This is not a wrist-snapping page-turner, but a story with which to take your time. You're going to want to pay close attention: there are roses in the rubble here.

A word of caution: this book deals with some reprehensible behaviors against children with some harrowing, but not gratuitous, particulars.

Tom Kettle is a widower and a recently-retired police detective. Nine months into retirement, he receives a visit from a couple of young detectives seeking his help with a long-unsolved murder. (Old detectives never retire for long.) They are pursuing a case against a local pedophile who was a colleague of the murder victim. He has made certain allegations. Tom is torn between his duty to his colleagues and his community, and a secret he is keeping.

It's Ireland. Everyone—Tom, his colleagues, his wife June, their grown children, his landlord and neighbors—has lived with the hard bony parts of life. Tom “knew there was almost always comedy stuck in the breast of human affairs, quivering like a knife.” He was “the guardian of his own silences, had been all his life.” The Irish have long been an occupied country and people. They've seen their most cherished institution, relied on to give them comfort in violent times, betray them in the most heart withering way, generation after generation. Almost everyone was either abused or knew someone who was, killed in guerrilla warfare, or knew someone who was. And so many knew abusers, and had trusted them. Occupied and betrayed. For decades.

Be patient. It may feel like a lot of scene-setting at first. But soon you're going to wonder if you've been paying close enough attention. Sometimes Tom's reminiscences, like our own ruminations, step through streams of consciousness. Sometimes they float downstream a bit.

What does it feel like to be a cop, a father, a husband, in such a society? Where your every role is rich with the expectation of being a protector, but you live in a society where so many have been betrayed by supposed protectors. How do you... detect... when surrounded by survivors with secrets they must keep? When you're a secret-keeper, too? How does a person, much less a community or a society, heal while keeping such secrets?

Sebastian Barry enables us to hear the thoughts of a man hobbled by grief and rage, whose mind and heart

are tattered, like shredded sails, by the force of all that has pounded him. Barry is one of those writers who can paint portraits of characters, warts and all, and leave you thinking, well, that's just the way people are: we have our strengths and weaknesses, temptations to which we succumb, character flaws. We know such people. They're friends and family. Tom Kettle is no omniscient male in the Liam Neeson/Tom Cruise/Iron Man tradition. He's hero as wounded neighbor. Not the trusted representative of an institution; just the retired colleague, the husband, father, next door neighbor. That guy.

The mystery is how any of us survive, and for how long, all the repeated betrayals—not just of ourselves, but of those we love. Sometimes we are defeated. Sometimes we find an opportunity for redemption. For atonement.

This review is dedicated to Shuhada' Sadaqat/Sinéad O'Connor, who survived so much, for so long, and who stood watch and gave warning. Wounded. Imperfect. Trustworthy. ■



Stop The Meeting Madness!

I know you've been there, sitting through another mind-numbing meeting. It started late, you don't have a clue why you are there or what you're supposed to do. What would you like everyone to think after the meeting? Everyone should leave knowing what the purpose was and what was expected of them. When the purpose is clear, people become passionate and creative.

To build structure into a meeting, set an agenda. Start on time and end on time. It helps all those involved to focus on what they're trying to achieve and how best to reach that goal. Remember the opportunity cost: every minute a person spends in your meeting, is a minute they can be doing something else. A structure can show how meaningful the purpose is, and how well the team is working together.

Finally, a successful meeting contains effective communication. Healthy disagreement and debate are signs of passionate people and productive meetings. It is therefore crucial to get honest input from everyone. No one should feel afraid to say what they think, and no one person or group should dominate the discussion. People must feel like their opinions are valued and taken seriously. Many people think a meeting is useful based on whether or not they were involved. When people participate, they take ownership and become responsible for outcomes.

- How can you make sure your meetings are successful?
- Have a clear purpose and hit them over the head with it.
 - Provide a structure and stay on schedule using an agenda.
 - Gain participation and get everyone involved.

These three points characterize a good meeting. A successful meeting doesn't come from coffee and donuts (or even pizza and beer). Productive, valuable, and engaging meetings require a clear purpose, structure, and participation. ■

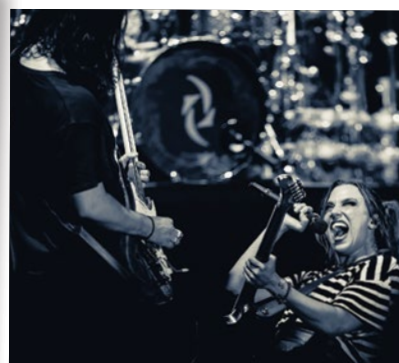

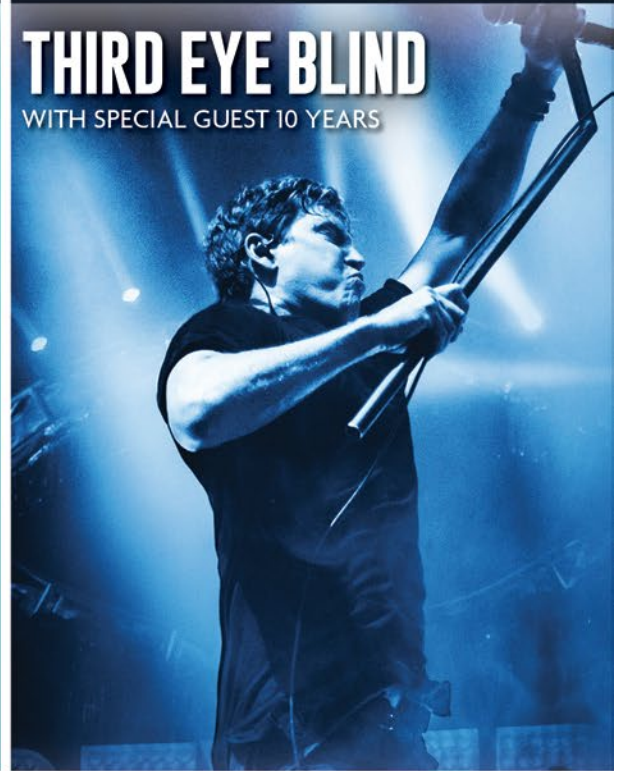
