


Now to see how much of this office I can get packed up, sold off, given away, recycled, stored, or trashed in the next two weeks. Wish me luck! ■




# Parade of Homes Tour






# David Thoreson THE NEW AGE OF EXPLORATION

Join Clarke University in uncovering "The New Age of Exploration" with David Thoreson on Wednesday, Oct. 18. The photographer, author, sailor and explorer will share some of the greatest insights from his world travels as part of the Mackin-Mailander Lecture Series. The event begins at 7 p.m. in Jansen Music Hall.

David has worked as a professional photographer, author, sailor and

explorer documenting the outdoor environment locally in the lowa Great Lakes region, and globally, sailing 75,000-miles across the world's oceans and polar regions. Exploring the Arctic Ocean led David to the issue of climate change, altering his life and work forever. Thoreson hopes to inspire others to explore their own connections to nature, especially water quality issues. David is the author of the photo book *Over the Horizon*, a TEDx presenter, National Fellow of the Explorers Club and lectures at universities and institutions across the globe.

"I heard David speak at a climate conference a few years ago, and I was amazed by his passion for the issue of climate change," said Michael Knock, Associate Professor of History and Chair of the Mackin-Mailander Committee at Clarke. "He has seen the impact of this issue firsthand in his voyages through the Arctic, and the fact that he is a native Iowan makes what he's accomplished all the more impressive."

The Clarke University Mackin-Mailander Lecture Series was established in 1997 after Clarke received gifts from two alumnae, Mary Mackin '34 and Verna Slattery-Mailander '20, to establish an endowed lecture series. The annual series consists of three lectures, including a prominent outside speaker, a faculty lecture, and an alumni lecture.





Michael Cavanaugh, star of Billy Joel's Broadway musical Movin' Out, performs the greatest hits of two rock piano legends on Saturday, Oct. 21 at 8 p.m. in John and Alice Butler Hall at Heritage Center. The performance, titled The Music of Billy Joel and Elton John with Michael Cavanaugh – Homecoming at UD!, is part of the 11th annual Live at Heritage Center Performing Arts Series.

Grammy- and Tony-nominated vocalist and pianist Michael Cavanaugh is a charismatic performer and musician famous for his piano/lead vocals in the Broadway musical Movin' Out. Handpicked by Billy Joel to star in Movin' Out, Cavanaugh evokes a style rivaling the Piano Man. He appeared in the show for three years with over 1,200 performances and received multiple accolades.

With the close of *Movin' Out* at the end of 2005, Cavanaugh began touring in his own right by creating a show that reinterprets the modern pop/rock songbook. His's interpretation of the modern rock/pop songbook led to *Billboard* calling

him "The New Voice of the American Rock and Roll Songbook," and he was recognized by Reuters as "Entertainer of the Year" for the private events market. Broadway World referred to Cavanaugh as "The New Piano Man."

A free pre-show reception for Bagatelle: Recent European Drawings by Alan Garfield will be held from 6:30 to 8 p.m. in the Bisignano Art Gallery before the show. The exhibit is open through Oct. 27.

"Beethoven created some of his most beautiful pieces as short, piano sketches. We call those bagatelles. My black and white drawings are small pieces of paper that I stuff in my carry-on when I bring students to explore **England or France or Spain or** Italy or Greece. I sketch these when I have a moment, usually late at night with a fresh cup of Earl Grey tea, my favorite. I hope, like the musical bagatelles, these are light, mellow, unpretentious compositions of what I took the students to see that day," said Garfield, director of the art gallery.




Copland's inspiring Fanfare for the Common Man, written during WWII in


The tour provides art lovers, especially those interested in clay work and ceramic processes, a chance to visit multiple art studios in the area and buy work directly from local artists.

Celebrate the bounty of fall, the power of community, and the opening of new exhibitions at the Dubuque Museum of Art on Saturday, Oct. 28 at 10 a.m.-6 p.m. The day includes family architecture workshops, artist and author conversations, and a block party. Admission is free with donation of a non-perishable food item to the Dubuque Food Pantry.

Community Day begins with a children's architecture workshop with Az Rashidi and Paul Schulhof, the architects designing the new museum campus. Participants will share their ideas for the new museum with Az and Paul and build their own models that describe their vision.

At 1 p.m., join *Long Time Passing* artists Roberta Condon and Lorraine Ortner-Blake inside the Falb Family Gallery for a conversation with Beth Hoffman, author of *Bet the Farm*. The three women will discuss the changing rural landscape, the struggles and joys of life on the farm, and how their experiences inspire their art.

At 3 p.m., artist Katie Schutte will discuss *Distorted Recollections* in the Kris Mozena McNamer Gallery.

The afternoon culminates with a block party from 4 to 6 p.m. on 7th Street that includes food trucks, a community workshop with Schulhof and Rashidi, live music by Joie Booth Wails, and autumnal décor from local farmers.

# Long Time Passing: A Visual Chronicle of Farm Life in the Midwest, Past and Present

On display Oct. 21-Feb. 4, *Long Time Passing* is both a celebration of regional talent and an elegy for rural communities. In this joint exhibition, works by Roberta Condon and Lorraine Ortner-Blake evoke the stories, memories, shapes, and colors

of Midwestern farm life. The title is drawn from the song "Where Have All the Flowers Gone" by Pete Seeger, which similarly evokes a sense of inexorable change and lamentation for what has been lost.

The Wisconsin-based artists use different visual languages in their respective 26 works to communicate the subtle and readily apparent shifts in farm life. Ortner-Blake's paintings are rooted in her mother's and her own reminiscences of life on their family farm. DuMA is the final stop of *Long Time Passing*, which has toured throughout the Midwest over the past three years.

### Distorted Recollections: Paper, Paint and Fiber Works by Katie Schutte

On display Oct. 28–Feb. 11, Katie Schutte is a Wisconsin-based artist who uses a wide variety of techniques to explore the vagaries of memory. For the 15 works on view in the gallery, Schutte sprayed paint over and through antique, vintage, and artist-made crocheted doilies, then stitched and crocheted found fibers onto the substrate. In the process, the hand-made doilies—themselves a vestige of an earlier time—are reconfigured and remade. Outside the Museum, Schutte installed two additional works: Barn Doily on the exterior of the building and Recursive on DuMA's grounds.

# Rural Life: Dubuque Camera Club Annual Exhibition

On display Oct. 21–Feb. 4, 65 photographs, from over 120 submitted by Camera Club members, were selected for an exhibition that showcases a range of perspectives on rural life around the region. Some photos highlight the compositional rigor of fields of crops, others the melancholy tinge of harvest, still others portraits of the Midwesterners that call this area home. The Dubuque Camera Club is a local group open to photo enthusiasts of all skill levels.





# Pulido's Tacos

As I've said before, I don't like describing cuisine as "authentic." I think "traditional" is the better word to use. Yes, foods have their own history, and that should be honored, but foods have a present and future, too. Foods change even in the geographical region they originate. And that's a good thing. Who wants to cook in the missionary position all their life? Calling an older version "authentic" and not a newer version denies cuisine's ability to change and grow. And that's a bad thing.

That said, it's just semantics. When people say their food is "authentic," I think most people hear "traditional." And as far as I'm concerned, if Pulido's Tacos, a new taco truck prowling around Galena, IL, keeps making food this good, they can describe their food any way they want.

The Pulido family describes their food as "Authentic & Fresh," and I have absolutely no guff with that. Especially since Pulido's Tacos offers both traditional street tacos AND American-style tacos. What? Are you going to call American-style tacos "inauthentic"? Shut up, you sound like a hipster jerk. It's not even a hot take, you just sound like an ass. You don't get to be the taco gatekeeper here. The Pulido Family claims to have "carefully preserved the traditions of Mexico" with their cuisine. If you think they can't possibly do that while offering a version of a taco with sour cream on it, then that tells me one thing: You haven't tried their food yet.

Do it. This cute little taco truck is a gem. A treasure. A welcome alternative to waiting for a table in a claustrophobic restaurant in downtown Galena (as much as I love them).

I caught up with Pulido's Tacos out by the Galena Walmart. So, I didn't even have to drive clear across town to get to them from Dubuque. They're often stationed there, but their Facebook page is the best place to find out where they're going to be on a given day.

I did a bit of a test with my food. I ordered one of each kind of available street taco and a torta. I also got some chips and queso. I taste tested everything while it was fresh, right from the comfort of my car. Then I made the half-hour drive home and tried them again to see how they would travel. What follows are my results.

First of all, I'm going to sing the praises of the torta. We white people need to

stop sleeping on tortas. Tortas are Mexican sandwiches, and they're wonderful. Sure, we can have the conversation as to whether or not a taco is always a sandwich. That's always fun, and I can argue either side. But nobody can argue that a Mexican torta is NOT a sandwich. It's served on a bolillo roll for one thing, which is about as far from a flatbread like a tortilla as you can get. Bolillo bread is most comparable to a baguette. And who doesn't love a sandwich made from a baguette? Sad people, probably. Bolillo has the structure to hold up to wetter ingredients while adding a yeasty toothiness. And it feels so good and hearty in your hand. While a tortilla wraps the filling, a torta contains the filling. And you can fill it with pretty much anything you would put on a taco. The same meats Pulido's makes for their tacos are also the same meats they make for their tortas. If you don't believe that tacos are sandwiches, then think of a torta as a taco sandwich. I got myself the torta al pastor. Pastor is spit-grilled strips of pork, carved off kind of like gyro meat. Delish. So damn good. Pulido's left a back hinge of the bolillo roll connected so I could pick it up without getting too messy. I still wouldn't drive down the street while trying to eat it, but when people talk about "crushing a sandwich," tortas are among the most crushable. Just get your

face up in there, and take a huge damn bite. It's wonderful. Oh! And by the time I got home, set everything on the counter, got distracted by something shiny, got some work done around the house, and finally made my way back to the torta, it was still solid. Not a mooshy mess like one would justly assume. No surprise there. That's just what tortas do. So wake up, my fellow honkies. We've ignored tortas in favor of tacos for FAR too long.

That's not to say that tacos don't deserve all the attention heaped on them. They deserve it all. I'm not saying you should turn your back on ANY taco. I'm just saying give tortas a chance, you fools.

On my adventure to scope out Pulido's, the chorizo was already all gone. I'm somewhat of a chorizo connoisseur, but I can't speak to Pulido's chorizo because again... all gone. But I think it's sufficient to say that Pulido's chorizo is so good it sells out within a few hours. So, get there earlier than I did. But I DID get to sample the steak, pastor, and chicken street tacos. If you DO miss out on the chorizo, you won't be disappointed with any of the other options.

They came served double-tortilla and open-faced in a styrofoam clamshell, lime wedges ready to be put to use. Plus, it comes with those cute little plastic ramekins of both green and red salsa so you have

a choice or can mix and match. Such fun to play dress-up with your food, isn't it?

And it's all so good! The chicken was moist and beautifully shredded to allow for easy bites. The pastor was probably my favorite and am glad I had it on my torta too because I can't get enough of it. The steak taco was right on. Easy, flavorful bites. And they all have such a brightness of flavor even before you mess with limes and salsa. Throw those into the mix and you have three street tacos worthy of the word "authentic" or "traditional" or whatever well-meant adjective you can conjure. So good! And, true to their roots, the tacos also traveled pretty well. The tortillas remained in tact and structural enough to get all that yum to your mouth incidentfree even after getting them home.

And don't forget the chips and salsa. Oh! And queso. 'K, so, the queso is exactly what you want from a queso at your favorite Mexican restaurant. But 'cept this is at a taco truck where you have no right to expect such a thing. Expect it, yo.

So yeah. There's a taco truck sweeping the Galena area that deserves to be recognized and sought after throughout the Tri-States. More importantly, there's a taco truck in the area that you likely haven't tried yet. That can't stand. Get yourself to Pulido's. They're good people with great food.

# **Chicken Sheet Tray Nachos**

### Ingredients

- 1 (5-oz) bag Siete Grain Free Sea Salt Tortilla Chips
- 2 lbs chicken thighs, bone-in


- 1. Preheat the oven to 400°. Heat a large skillet over medium-high heat on the stovetop.





# Musk Redux

Errol Musk to his son Elon as he left South Africa for college in Canada: "You'll never be successful."

"You can feel whatever you want about Elon's behavior, but there is no one in our time who has done more to push the bounds of science and innovation than he has." Bill Gates.

That Elon Musk, man. Whew.

Walter Isaacson—author of bestselling biographies of Steve Jobs, Benjamin Franklin, and many other books, and the former managing editor of *Time* and CEO of CNN—knows a newsmaker when he sees one. He shadowed Elon Musk for two years. He had access to his family and many employees and friends during a tumultuous period in Musk's life. Walter must be exhausted; Musk works day and night, slamming Red Bulls and Ambien, and sometimes sleeps under his desk or on his factory floor.

Isaacson writes in a compulsively readable just-the-facts style. Occasionally he launches a popper, and you may take a short break to chortle over what he said and how he said it. It's a gentle reminder that someone gifted, who doesn't need to show off, is writing.

This is a good thing because his subject is both controversial—people *loathe* this man—and complex. If you spend any time on social media, you will find diehard fans who will not tolerate any criticism of Tesla, SpaceX, or Musk himself and people who would spit on the ground he walks on. Both devotees and detractors will find support for their views here.

Elon Musk is not an easy man to like or be with, whether as wife, employee, family member, or friend. He had a very rough child-hood—not uncommon for a socially awkward child, with or without Asperger's. He was once beaten to a pulp by classmates, and his father took their side instead of comforting his son. (Musk's father is not so complicated. He is not a nice man.) Musk misses social cues, can be wildly insensitive and immature, and, like his parents, he courts risk and drama. The most inhospitable environment for him is when everything is going well.

He thrives on crisis and pressure and uses that to push his employees to do the impossible—sometimes breaking them in the process. He drives all of his businesses to the edge of bankruptcy or failure. PayPal was plagued by tons of unaddressed fraud; SpaceX had three failed launches and may have gone under if the fourth had not gone well. Tesla was near bankruptcy, and its board gave Musk an ultimatum: Meet these nearly impossible benchmarks and become rich beyond imagining or fail to meet them and get paid exactly \$0. And

now Twitter/X, for which he impulsively overpaid, is bleeding advertisers and users.

Additionally, the Boring Company has ground to a halt, Solar City's prospects are cloudy at hes

are cloudy at best, and Tesla's much-ballyhooed full self driving feature remains a dream. Or a fraud.

People forget that Tesla's Model 3 sold more than every other luxury car combined, gas or electric. And that SpaceX not only returned the US to space but sent more cargo and astronauts to space than any other country.

Musk continues to drive innovation in each of these industries. On the same day in 2014 that NASA awarded SpaceX a contract, NASA gave a competing contract—worth 40% more—to Boeing. By the time SpaceX had successfully launched in 2020, Boeing was still ground bound. Now, SpaceX is launching new Starlink satellites almost monthly, providing internet to hard-to-reach areas of the world and embroiling Musk and his company in geopolitical crises like Putin's war against Ukraine.

Meanwhile, Tesla is not only selling tons of electric cars but is revolutionizing the way cars are manufactured. Tesla sees cars as not just hardware but software too. Tesla owners watch software updates make their cars better than when they first bought them. Stainless steel Cybertrucks have been spotted on the streets in recent months. There are rumors of a \$25,000 commuter vehicle the works. And the Tesla charging network is becoming the de facto American Charging Standard, with GM, Ford, Nissan, and others planning to adopt it for their new EVs—creating a new revenue stream for Tesla.

The old saw about not wanting to know how laws and sausages are made holds with any Musk business: It's going to be ugly, but it may change everything about that industry. Musk said it would take at least five years to turn around Twitter/X. He wants to end its bot infestation and make it the place where online identities are verified and banking is done. If past performance predicts future developments, expect Twitter to get at least very close to bankruptcy before its rebirth. Right now, bots and misinformation have the run of the place, and competitors are proliferating.

Musk adores his family—wives, friends, mother, and kids (10 and counting). He embraces his experiences of losing, seeing them as evidence of pushing limits—and boundaries. His errors in judgment are sometimes small and human, sometimes grandly disastrous.

Love or loathe him, he's changing our a world that fears and resists change. Isaacson's book is just a start at getting a handle on this intense, chaotic world mover.


