With more than 100 opportunities available, finding the right activity for kids is an easy task for parents and caregivers. There is something for every child and interest as well as opportunities for learning and growth!

Here are a few helpful tips to keep in mind as you and your child are browsing Dubuque's many offerings.


Consider spending time outside! Did you know that fresh air contains high levels of negative ions, which have a positive impact on brain function and well-being? Kids who get lots of fresh air are also more likely to have healthier hearts and stronger lungs. Sunlight provides Vitamin D that kids need for strong bones and protection from disease. And, just like fresh air, it can improve mental and physical health. Whether your child wants to play sports outside, read under a tree, or engage in activities the city provides through their Rock in Roll Trailer, there is no shortage of ways for kids to be immersed in fresh air and sunshine.

Summer also brings opportunities to encourage healthy habits around physical activity. Regular physical activity reduces symptoms of anxiety and depression and reduces heart disease later in life. A 2023 report from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention states that approximately 5.8 million children live with anxiety, while 2.7 million suffer from depression. While there are many factors that play into brain health, helping kids to build healthy habits is one way to provide support. Physical activities like bike rides, yoga, nature hikes and kayaking in Catfish Creek are just some of the activities available to our kids to get them moving.

In addition to physical activity and fresh air, engaging in summer programs and activities provides a chance for kids to make new friendships and learn something new about themselves. Why not use this time to encourage kids to learn a new instrument or perform in a play? Maybe they could learn a campfire song to teach their siblings when they return from their camp adventure. Regardless of what they do this summer, the point is that they have a chance to have new experiences and embrace learning for the sake of learning. Summer is a gift just waiting to be opened. All you need to do to get started is look through this guide. The outcome will last a lifetime.

They offer a staggering range of creative classes, FREE neighborhood programs, youth sports, swim lessons, golf instruction, Bee Branch nature programs, and other programs available to Dubuque families as the cornerstone of youth activity in our community. Kids' recreation classes from Leisure Services cover the gamut and then the gamut beyond that. In fact, we counted more than 100 different titles for classes and activities offered. The selection is simply stunning. There is truly something for everyone through offerings from a great variety of experienced instructors and partnerships. Also find lesson schedules for swimming, tennis, T-ball, baseball, and softball.

Leisure Services Programs and Services Scholarships

The City of Dubuque Leisure Services Department is offering scholarships for low-income qualifying families living in Dubuque. Up to 300 families will each be awarded \$150 in scholarship "credits" which will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis, to pay for swim passes, general recreation programs, pavilion rentals, and other services provided through the Leisure Services registration system. New this year, an annual family scholarship to Creative Adventure Lab is also included with every Leisure Services scholarship. Complete and return the income verification form available online at CityOfDubuque.org/recreation and in person at the Leisure Services Office/Multicultural Family Center in the Ruby Sutton Building at 1157 Central Ave. to confirm the scholarship. 

Summer Academy is a free learning

experience designed to give students a reading-focused enrichment program.

Reading instruction is delivered Monday through Friday mornings by certified district teachers. In addition to fun and engaging reading instruction, an optional enrichment opportunity will be offered in the afternoons to keep kids involved in learning—all because DCSD believes that students immersed in learning are positioned to be better readers.
