When our sweet old man miniature rescue poodle Coco passed away in March, we were, needless to say, crushed. He was my first dog since my childhood and Christy's first dog ever. He was our only child, coming into our lives when he was nine and leaving us at nearly 16 from cancer. The loss left a big hole in our hearts and in our home. While our experience with Coco essentially ensured that one day we would do it again, I thought I would need about a year to decompress from his loss.

And then my lovely wife kept showing me adorable rescues she kept finding on Petfinder, like some kind of monster. Her heart was hurting too, and I think the healing sauce for her was going to be finding a new little fuzzy soul to pour her love into. So, I told her to go ahead and keep looking. With her allergies and our lifestyles, there were some limitations as to what kind of dog we could fit into our lives. And our first miniature poodle was so perfect that we, or at least I, wanted to stick with what was working.

When we adopted Coco seven years ago, I think it cost about \$150 to adopt a dog and little or no application process. What a difference a few years makes. Not only is the fee more than triple that now, which is not a big deal, but the application process at any given shelter has gotten kind of nutters. Page after page of online questions. What's the address of the groomer you will use? Give us three references we can call to verify that you are good owners. The first shelter we filled out an application with was in Cedar Rapids when we found a dog that fit our situation. They called all of our references... and never called us? Should I be slighted by this or outright raging? When Christy followed up with an email, they never even replied. We were just angry at the lack of professionalism we felt. So, when she applied at the second rescue, I was reserved with my expectations.

We were about to go on a cruise vacation, so we knew we could not pick up a new dog until we got back. So the dogs she saw at the second shelter that interested her may not be there when we get back, and indeed, they were not. But oh, there was a new little guy on the shelter website from Tipton, IA, and there was an immediate connection to him. How could there not be? He got us pretty excited, even as heavy as our hearts still were from Coco's passing. Are we doing this too fast? What would Coco think? Well, naturally, Coco would say, "Never get another dog and pine for my loss for the rest of time." So, I guess we can't listen to him. We just have to hope he'll forgive us for giving another little fuzzy man the same life we gave him.

Bucky is a blue merle toy poodle, almost six years old. He is a tiny 7.3 pounds of pure quiet politeness, a miracle considering that he came from a life spent completely in a breeding kennel in Missouri. As far as we know, until he spent some time with the recent foster home, he's never known a traditional home life.



He came with a severe wound on his neck from a bite from a larger dog, sustained during the transfer from Missouri to Iowa. It's treated, and we cared for it, and it's all healed up now, but it's just one more reminder of what he came from.

He's acclimating quickly but seems to have never had formal training. He's super good but doesn't know simple commands like "come" or "sit" or "potty" or "treat." But we're doing a great job of going potty outside! He sadly also doesn't understand what a dog bed is for. We're fixing that, right? Nope. The first night in his cozy little kennel next to the bed went fine (the foster home had been working on crate training him). But halfway through night two, he started crying, and Christy put him in our bed. You have to know her to understand what a big deal that was for her to let it happen. And, of course, he's been there every night since... with his little razor blade toenails.

He mostly just seems to want to spend the rest of his life in your lap, which is all good with Christy. We're going slow and learning new things together. Watching him get excited with his little air-paw maneuver will instantly fill your soul, and seeing him get so excited to see her when she gets home makes me exceptionally happy. Coco was MY boy. I'm hoping Bucky will be OUR boy, and so far that's just how it's playing out.

We were going to name him Buddy because Christy just always called Coco "Buddy" anyway, but "Bucky," which probably came from the rescue, just fit and was so close to Buddy that they're practically interchangeable. Sorry Wisconsin family, it's not a nod to your favorite university mascot.

And how handsome is he in his little badass harness?! We should prolly call him Buck when he's in uniform, out of respect.

I want to shout out Haylee, the young lady we met at Friends of the Animals Rescue in Tipton, IA. She was just a dynamo. She clearly lives to save these animals, and we were so impressed with her. We may have written the check for more than the rescue fee, and it was all because we loved her vibe. Thank you to her for bringing us together. If you have a few dollars to play with, throw them some love in Bucky's (or Coco's) name as they plan to move to a new larger facility. When it comes to summertime in the Bellevue area, it doesn't get much better than taking in the local rodeo. In fact, the Jackson County Pro Rodeo is ranked as one of the top five small rodeos in the United States by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association (PRCA) and people from across the Midwest come to enjoy the unique three-day event, which is filled with cowboys, cowgirls, queens, food, music and wholesome fun.

The PRCA/WPRA sanctioned rodeo runs for three evenings, June 20-22, at the Bellevue Horsemen's Club arena and grounds west of Bellevue, IA.

Gates open at 5 p.m. with the kids' corral at 5:30-7 p.m., (petting zoo; roping; bounce houses; face in hole pictures;

stick horse races; and autographs with cowboys, cowgirls, clowns, and Miss Rodeo Iowa), rodeo at 7:30 p.m., pig scramble before intermission, and fireworks and live music after the rodeo (River Moonshine on June 20, The Ditch Lilies on June 21, and Big John Hammer & The Rusty Nails on June 22). Hear from veteran announcer Roger Mooney, and be entertained by award-winning rodeo clown Austin Singley. Additional events include mutton bustin' on June 20 and 21 and a wild horse race on June 21 and 22, both after intermission.

Enjoy events including steer wrestling, team roping, bronc and bull riding, bareback riding, steer wrestling, and team and tie-down roping. Food stands, mechanical bulls, live music and beer are also part of the event.

# The Jester's Lounge Opens in the Millwork District

Local Dubuque entertainment entrepreneur John Ohnesorge from Top Billing Entertainment is reopening what was previously The Comedy Bar in the lower level of the Novelty Iron Works building in the Millwork District as The Jester's Lounge at 333 E. 10<sup>th</sup> St. The specifically designed comedy showroom in the building that also houses Gary Dolphin's Iron Bar and Backpocket Dubuque closed in late March of this year.

Ohnesorge saw a different approach working: A Dubuque approach instead of a Chicago approach. There is a difference, and he saw the benefit of testing out the theory and seeing if you agree that it's a great idea. Before I get all into the details of the new approach, let me tell you why John and, honestly, why I think the first go-round didn't quite click.

When The Comedy Bar opened in Millwork District a few years ago, I interviewed the Chicago-based proprietors about the new venue and their vision. While we were excited to see a dedicated comedy venue come to town, I didn't write about this, but I saw some red flags in their plans and wished the best for the venue but wondered if their "Chicago" plan for The Comedy Bar was going to work in Dubuque.

First of all, when they told me, "We're going to finally bring some great comedy to Dubuque," I wanted to ask if they even did any due diligence on our comedy scene before setting up shop. Around the time The Comedy Bar was opening, we had just had talent like Louis C.K., Lisa Lampanelli,

Rob Schneider, Bill Engvall, and others in town doing big shows with plenty of very well-known comics filling the Diamond Jo Casino and Five Flags stages in between... for years. What does he mean, "finally"? Dubuque has been a wonderful, live, stand-up comedy town since the days of Wednesday nights at the Brass Ring, may it rest in peace... as a Chipotle/Five Guys/Sport Clips.

Secondly, the pricing structure. Asking \$25 for a ticket was, well... Chicago pricing. Dubuque is not used to paying that much for comedians they don't know. Sure, if a big name is in town, then it's like a concert ticket. If not, it's a bit of a stab in the dark at whoever is on stage, and it's hard to ask for \$25 for every show in this market.

Third, the entire venue, even the bar outside the comedy room, was only accessible if you had a ticket. Why not make the bar open to anyone, comedy or not?

And lastly, promotion. What promotion? I'm clearly biased as the publisher of *365ink*, but being that we ARE the place to go to find entertainment in Dubuque, the fact that they never once used *365ink* to advertise their comedy venue was a mistake. A big one in my opinion. I don't know if they ever bought any radio either. I saw a billboard once. But what told me all I needed to know was when I asked them why they didn't promote their shows heavily Facebook, they said they use Instagram (not always, just sometimes) because that works in Chicago. They did a better job later, but even then, one post per show. Well, this is Dubuque, and maybe we're behind the times, but this is a big Facebook town, and to not use this free resource to promote your comedy was just asking for your own demise. And that's what happened.

John Ohnesorge has been doing events in Dubuque for many years, from big comic

conventions at Five Flags, to concerts, comedy, and more in multiple venues across Dubuque. He also owned the Southend Tap for several years until about a year ago. He's even working on building a new live music venue on the strip in East Dubuque. Most recently, he's been assisting to bring entertainment in at the Diamond Jo Casino's Mississippi Moon Bar. He's endeavored to see if the comedy scene in Dubuque can thrive under a model that better understands the community its operating in.

First up, comedy will not cost \$25. John's idea is to shoot for an average of \$10 per ticket and sell a lot of drinks to make up the difference from a much larger crowd. Second, open that front bar up to everyone whether they come in for comedy or not, especially on nights when the shows are sold out. Third, open up the bar even on nights when comedy is not happening to allow for a crew of regulars to decide to make The Jester's Lounge their preferred "hang." The plan is to be open every night from 4 p.m. to 2 a.m. Next, do an open mic every Wednesday, regional acts on Thursday, and then national touring comedy every Friday and Saturday, again, at a reasonable price.

Finally, open the great space up for private events on off nights for parties, receptions, catered events, etc. Why have a cool venue sit quiet half the week? And with Backpocket Dubuque upstairs serving great food from both the Bytes window as well as the soon-to-open New York and Detroit-Style Driftless Pizza on the corner where Gino's East of Dubuque previously operated, patrons can order and eat their food down in The Jester's Lounge.

It's not rocket science. But it's what has historically worked in the past in Dubuque, and John believes it can work again. It's his job to book great comedy, and he already has experience doing that. It's also his job to make sure we all know who's coming and when, and he knows where you smart and attractive people go to find out that information. He has to make the bar a fun, welcoming, and exciting place to spend an evening. All we have to do is give him a shot. Give this new take on a familiar comedy venue another try and see if you agree that he's doing things the right way this time around.

"When I sold the Southend Tap, I vowed that I would never get in the bar business again, but here I am," Ohnesorge said. "But it was a no-brainer. I have Dolph's, Backpocket, and Driftless Pizza right above me. Even if I get the overflow of some of that, I'll take it."

Local comedian Jeffrey Wilson, a.k.a. D'Licious, says comedians are committed to making The Jester's Lounge work. He will be hosting the Wednesday open mics which he'd like to call the "Jester's Court," an open-mic format in which the audience picks winners who will then get a chance to open for a featured comedy show on the weekends. He also sees The Jester's Lounge being a

hangout for local comedians and musicians. But it's good for everyone. "If you're having a bad day or week, spend a couple of hours around comedy and feel better."

Ohnesorge is also excited for local comedians. "They're helping with useful suggestions and assistance including staffing the venue. It's going to be good for the Millwork District and the entire community."

Another local comedian Todd Baysinger notes that the room is perfect for comedy. "When that room is full, it is magical. We are going to put everything into making it a success."

The Jester's Lounge did a soft opening on Wednesday, June 19, and live comedy is scheduled to start up this weekend, June 20-22. John the Jester has selected his first night of regulars that you will see at his court. Your host Dana-Moss Peterson is joined by feature performers The Wizard, David Collins, Brody Tupy, and headliner Chris Starman. The Jester will request a small pittance of \$5 at the door to enjoy some of the best comedy you will find in the Tri-State area. Showtime is 8 p.m.

Night two—Friday, June 21—welcomes back The Wizard as your host for the night with your feature performers Matt Ferry, Troy Rigdon, Dan McCulloch, and headliner, the one and only, Todd Baysinger. Once again, just \$5 on opening weekend, and showtime is 8 p.m.

For Saturday night, the Jester has ordered the roast of the venue's production manager, D'Licious. "It is his birthday, and we must roast him!" This is the final christening of the grand opening weekend of The Jester's Lounge. The fun starts at 6 p.m. with complementary food and birthday cake. The roast starts at 8 p.m. with comics coming from far and near. By order of the Jester, this will be FREE for all!

# **38<sup>th</sup> Annual Air Show & Fireworks Spectacular over the Mississippi**

**A**s a life member of the Dubuque Jaycees, I've certainly put in my years of parking cars and setting up barricades in the hot sun to prepare for the fireworks in Dubuque, and in that time, I also got to see close up just how much work goes into making the whole event work. Now, I'm old and tired, and I just sit and watch the show while younger, more energetic folk do the heavy lifting. Well, all but one.

When assigning credit for why the Radio Dubuque/Dubuque Jaycees Air Show & Fireworks Spectacular is the biggest, best show around, Radio Dubuque's Perry Mason will immediately point to the sponsors and the volunteers.

And while he has a point... without a huge host of very supportive and patriotic corporate sponsors, this part would never get off the ground—literally. And naturally, the Dubuque Jaycees are indispensable in getting thousands of people to the event site and parked safely while raising a lot of money for the cost of the event.

But make no mistake, the fireworks, and especially the air show, are as awesome as they are because of the diligent work of Perry Mason himself. With decades of experience and relationships with the men who pull the strings in the military and throughout the private air show world, he is the guy who keeps the big, rare, and incredible planes flying the skies over the Tri-States. But time is even catching up on his years at the helm.

"I'm getting to the point where I've got to kind of transition what I'm doing. The fireworks kind of take care of themselves as long as George [the pyrotechnician], is working on it. George has got a couple of special shells he's put in the program this year as he tries to change things up every year. Michael Kaye does our music for us, and we get that sent to George, and he does the buying and putting together that part of it. The air show part is one that takes a lot of time."

The relationships Perry has after decades are truly unique and personal connections across the military and aviation fields. You can't just pass those skills on. He shared his sadness at the recent loss of Apollo 8 astronaut Bill Anders who he came close with through this process. "You develop close relationships, friendships, even if you only see people once a year or so. But he was a guy that I had a few beers with, and he was a great, an American hero, and the

nicest guy you ever want to meet." And he points to pictures of planes and pilots on the walls of his office. One pilot of a red-tailed P-51 Mustang used to fly in our show but was killed at a show in Lake City, MN. Perry surely has a lot of stories to tell as he looks to pass the baton.

"Well, I'm working with two people here at the station. They've gone to the air show convention with me so they can start meeting people."

If the preparation and organization of Mason and his crew tell me anything, it's that he will make sure this patriotic party keeps lighting up the sky even after he joins me in the lawn chair as a spectator instead of a conductor. But honestly, I can't see him even just stepping away completely. Whether he wants to admit it or not, this air show is now in his blood and will forever be a big part of his legacy. But for now, the reigns are still fully in his control, so we can rest easy and talk about what we should look forward to and why it's not so easy to make it happen.

"Nothing against anybody at the airport or anything like that, but our greatest limitation is that our runway is 500 feet too short to accommodate some of the bigger jets we'd like to get here. But the last couple of years, we've worked with Battle Creek Michigan air combat command to send some airplanes or jets from there and coordinate with them on timing to visit our events as well as others in the Midwest."

Perry tells us this is the last year the A-10 "Warthog" will be flying as it's going to be grounded by the military and replaced by the F-35. So don't miss this last chance to see an active duty A-10 in the heritage flight with the WWII-era P-51 Mustang. The same pilot that flew the A-10 here last year is coming back, so hopefully she'll stick around to do some things in the future.

We have some great formation teams coming for the show, a smoke pilot, and the Chinook returns with the National Guard. And as always, there are a couple of things that could happen as last-minute additions from the Whitman Air Force Base or the Dakotas, but Perry doesn't want to jinx it. So, he's keeping it close to his vest until the day of the event. That's how tight scheduling can be with the Air Force. Naturally, you always come second to the greater need.

Aside from having to know the right people, there are also costs involved.

"With all the costs going up on everything, we're fortunate to have the corporate sponsors that help us. Does it cover all of our expenses? No. And the Jaycees have expenses as well, but this is a big, big event, and it's nice that everybody likes to come and view it. That's what it's all about. But if it wasn't for the businesses, big and small, to help support it,

Together, they represent the more than 1 million active-duty, National Guard, and Reserve men and women who serve around the world.

Due to the nature of the Army's mission abroad, many of our nation's citizens have limited contact and exposure to soldiers and their families. The Golden Knights serve to connect America's people to their Army by showcasing modern sport parachute exhibitions that pay homage to the Army's daring and historic airborne operations.

Their enhanced aerial demonstrations highlight the pinpoint precision of the ram air accuracy canopies, synchronized freefall and canopy formations, gravity-defying wing suiting, and high-performance landings. The team's modified DHC-8/C-147A and UV-18C Viking Twin Otters serve as the backbone of the team and provide perfect paradrop platforms to deliver jumpers on target anywhere in the country in plus or minus 30 seconds.

As they enter their 65<sup>th</sup> year of aviation and parachuting excellence, they extend their sincere thanks and appreciation for the trust Americans have placed in them to fulfill their mission of representing the Army and our nation with pride and distinction. The team has a long tradition of professionalism, teamwork, safety, and camaraderie that paves the way for future generations. They are excited and grateful to share that tradition of service with you at one of the over 100 events they perform each year.

On behalf of the entire US Army Parachute Team, they look forward to seeing us again in the Tri-States, which they refer to as their No. 1 event of the season. And the just returned from an emotional 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary jump in Normandy, France to commemorate D-Day during WWII. Feel free to talk with the team after any of their performances about one of the many ways you can Be All You Can Be! ■

we wouldn't be able to do it. It's something to do for our Veterans. It's definitely not a moneymaker for us, but radio is promotions, and it's a big huge promotion."

The U.S. Army Golden Knights have become a huge part of not just our Dubuque Air Show & Fireworks, but over multiple days, they make jumps and connect with Americans in the Tri-States across the region.

"Being able to go to different communities in the Tri-State area with the Golden Knights each year is a great way to connect these smaller communities with the military. This is really a patriotic area, and to be able to move it around and give people in different locations an opportunity to see it is very cool."

"Well, the neat thing about the Golden Knights is, and I've been working with them for 25 or 30 years, they love coming to rural America. They can go jump at Yankee Stadium, but they get here, and people really love to see them, and they can interact with them, and they can talk to the kids and have the kids help practice parachutes, and they really like that interaction. So, we're really honored that they choose to come back to Dubuque."

"At the annual air show convention this year, the Golden Knights actually announced that Dubuque is their premier jump site. Premier jump site. That's a big deal. I've heard, and I don't know how serious it is, but when they go to divide up jumps, the black team leader and the gold team leader arm wrestle about who gets to come to Dubuque."

"The Golden Knights' advance man, Mike Cook, is retiring. He is from just north of La Crosse. This year, the team leader is Morgan George with the gold team, and he actually married a local girl he met while doing a show here in the past, and they have three kids now. So, it's a little bit of a hometown. And obviously, the Golden Knights can go anywhere in the world. They were just over in Normandy for the D-Day commemoration, and that team will be here. It's amazing."

The team is also jumping at the Elizabeth Freedom Fest in Elizabeth, IL and the Galena Territories where an awesome World War II reenactment is also taking place. They will jump out of the Chinook helicopter for that one. They jump twice on July 2 in Dubuque at Q Casino + Resort and later at Kennedy Mall. They'll have two jumps, one in the light and one in the dark with flares at the Dubuque Air Show & Fireworks, and then they will jump in Cassville, WI on the actual 4<sup>th</sup> of July. They cover a lot of territory and make a big impact in just a couple of days.

So, let's get back to the Dubuque event. As a spectator, being a part of the Radio Dubuque/Dubuque Jaycees Air Show & Fireworks is pretty easy. Just come and enjoy yourself. But Perry would ask that you follow a few simple rules and take them seriously.

"Please don't bring fireworks to the area, not even sparklers. Kids get burned, and it's just a bad idea in that mass of people. Don't bring pets. Pets do not like fireworks, and there's too big of a crowd. Don't fly a drone. A drone will stop the show. The FAA will be watching for drones, and that WILL BE A FEDERAL OFFENSE. Don't bring them! This is active duty military. They don't take these things lightly."

Boaters should also take note that the Mississippi River will be closed to all boaters from the Iowa to Wisconsin shores from Lock and Dam 11 to the Iowa/Illinois bridge during the military air demonstration. A no-wake rule will be enforced through midnight from Lock and Dam 11 to the Julien Dubuque Bridge.

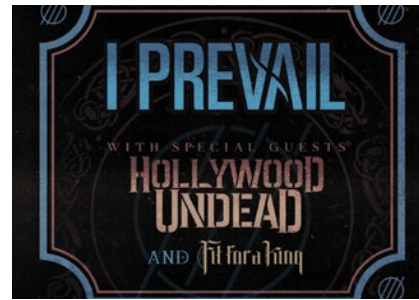

# Guler's Corner

Can I get a hell yeah for Wisconsin bars? They're unpretentious and welcoming in

everything, including the decor. (They'll replace the ancient wood paneling on the walls when they come crumbling down on their own, thank you, and not a second sooner.) They have all your big brewery brands along with some of the best small breweries in Wisconsin, and therefore, the United States, and therefore, the world. (Don't kid yourself, Europe. We've been outbeering you for over 20 years.) And the food! I wouldn't go so far as to call it gourmet (and "gourmet"

doesn't mean "good," anyway), but I'd call it delicious and comforting and proudly Wisconsin. Someone more pretentious and less welcoming might characterize a Wisconsin bar as a dive, but that ain't it. I don't know what those people's problem is. Maybe they're not Badger fans or something and can't just be cool. But let me make this clear: Wisconsin bars aren't dives. They're lazy rivers.

And so, for Father's Day, I was taken to Guler's Corner for the very first time. Guler's Corner is situated almost exactly halfway between Cuba City and Hazel Green. It's the kind of place where, if it were in Iowa or Illinois, it would be closed these past 30 years and showing every day of its neglect. But we're in Wisconsin. So Guler's Corner has been around longer than you've been alive and will likely be around long after everyone who loves you has forgotten the sound of your laughter. Everyone, that is, except Guler's Corner.

Folks, I feel I've missed out on some bits of culture by growing up so far away from a Wisconsin bar. Stupid Western Iowa. Nobody makes pasty over there. Nobody. Do you know about pasty and its cultural significance to Wisconsin? Just for clarification: "Pasty" is not pronounced "pay-stee." It rhymes with "nasty." But not "nasty" as in yucky. "Nasty" as in sexy. As in, "Ooh yah, baby. Let's get nasty with some pasty." It's a folded pastry filled with the meat and veggies a Southwestern Wisconsin miner needs to get through a hard day's work. My Annie, who took the food pics for me for this column, makes pasty from time-to-time. It's a family thing for her. And now it's a family thing for me, too. And it's awesome. That said, you don't find it on restaurant menus very often. Not even in Wisconsin.

But guess where you CAN order it? Yup! The absolute saints at Guler's Corner Bar & Grill are keeping pasty alive! It's not a regular menu item, but it's very often

a special, especially on Sundays. Like on Father's Day. I didn't order the pasty, though. I wanted to. But Ann ordered the pasty. Her dad ordered the pasty. Her mom ordered the pasty. My parents probably would have ordered the pasty, but they've both been dead for years. And while Guler's pasty is worth a visit all on its own, I can't JUST highlight the pasty. Not if I want to hit my word count, anyway. So instead of ordering the pasty, I settled for the prime rib and shrimp. Yes, instead of pasty, I SETTLED for Surf & Turf. I wanted pasty so bad that the only substitute was the most expensive thing Guler's served that day. Which was also awesome, and I'll tell you all about it, but I'm not done with the pasty.

Guler's pasty is of Cornish design with ground beef (some folks use stew beef) and all the accompanying veggies you'd expect in a similar dish like a pot pie. Then Guler's ladles a good measure of gravy over all that and puts it down in front of you. Mmm. Flaky pastry, ground beef that's easy to portion out with every bite, veggies that have given their all but haven't gotten all mushy about it. Hearty and savory and absolutely satisfying.

Pasty. Get it in you.

The Surf & Turf was also a Father's Day special. And let me just tell you now: Guler's has a pretty respectable menu. Their steak, fish, chicken, etc. are all supper-club quality. In fact, if you wanted to call Guler's Corner a supper club, not many would correct you. So, it's a good menu... but it seems to me, the menu is only there to provide the consistency you expect at a Wisconsin bar. Where Guler's Corner shines is in their specials. With them all written up for the day on the huge chalkboard, it almost looks like they have as many specials as regular menu items. And while I appreciate the consistency of a regular menu, I can guarantee that every time I go to Guler's Corner in the

future, I'm going to be looking forward to seeing what's up on the Specials board. The prime rib was succulent and seemingly made just for me to my liking. And the shrimp were fried up in a tempura-like batter. Nom, nom, nom. I filled up on other people's pasty and barely touched my prime rib. Fortunately, prime rib makes for awesome leftovers, especially Guler's.

My son ordered the bacon cheddar chicken sandwich. Look at that supper-clubbable bun and those housemade fries! Ooooh, those fries! Who doesn't appreciate a fry completely made in house? And the chicken was grilled to unquestionable doneness without being dry. I'm sure it's a tactic to ensure fast service, but if you don't like your food to touch, Guler's is your place. Look at that coleslaw and those pickles cordoned off from the rest of the food. It's there if you want to invite it. If not, it can't possibly crash the party. Even the sandwich's mayo comes on the side, ready to pass off to someone who wants it if you don't. I get the feeling that you hear people say, "If you're not going to eat that, pass it here!" a lot at Guler's Corner. Same with the Surf & Turf. I did NOT give away the pictured potato salad. I wanted it. And I ate the hell out of it.

Oh! And your choice of accompanying coleslaw, potato salad, or macaroni salad? They're all the creamy kind. Creamy to their Wisconsinite core.

I'm not sure what compelled Ann's lovely mother to order the fried cod when we all had so much food already, but it means I get to tell you about it, so make sure you thank her next time you see her. Look, I already told you that Guler's food is supper-club-esque. You know damn well what a supper club can do with a piece of beer-battered cod. Expect the same and maybe better from Guler's.

As is my custom, let me tell you about the bathrooms. It's an old building. So the bathrooms are old. It's a Wisconsin bar

bathroom. It's not "nice," but it's nicely clean. Pee and/or poop without fear.

Oh! I almost forgot about the beverages! Full bar, of course. Because it's a bar. For soda, you're looking at Pepsi products on tap, Coke products in cans. And when you order a lemonade, you're not getting the premixed stuff out of the fountain gun. You're getting a glass bottle of Calypso lemonade. You may recognize Calypso lemonade as the fancy lemonade sold in the produce section instead of the soft drink section of your grocery store. It's damn good lemonade, my friendlies, if you haven't experienced it. Honestly, the mix stuff from the fountain gun would have been fine. I don't think I've ever seen Calypso served in restaurants before.

But then, as you can see, Guler's is absolutely full of surprises.

And let me just say it one more time: Pasty! ■

## Cajun Veggie Packs

### All You Need:

As a registered dietitian, I love helping my patients have a more holistic view of their health, which can mean focusing on physical, mental, and social health. Camping can benefit your health in all areas, such as helping you have more joyful movement, promoting relaxation and reducing stress, and helping you build stronger relationships with family and friends. That's why I wanted to share three key essentials you'll want to pack for your next outdoor adventure to make sure nothing gets in the way of enjoying all those benefits!

The first essential to pack is food that keeps you fueled and nourished so you're ready for any activity. These nourishing foods include whole grains, vegetables, and protein. Whole grains, such as oatmeal, whole grain cereal, and whole wheat buns, help you have more sustained energy. Vegetables, such as peppers, mushrooms, carrots, asparagus, and zucchini, can help keep you full and satisfied without feeling sluggish. Vegetables can be eaten raw or grilled over your open fire. Last, protein is important to help repair your tired muscles from all the hiking and swimming. Lean proteins such as chicken, sirloin, or lean burgers are great on the grill or campfire or opt for shelf-stable protein sources such as nuts, low-sodium jerky, and roasted edamame.

Your next essential to pack is drinks to keep you hydrated and replenished! With the increase in physical

activity along with the often hot and humid temperatures, hydration is key to enjoying the outdoors. Signs of dehydration can include low energy, poor concentration, and dizziness. Water is always going to be the best option to keep you hydrated. The Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics recommends women drink at least 9 cups of water per day and men drink 13 cups per day. However, you will need more if you are sweating or breathing a lot (for example, when you are hiking). Liquid water enhancers, such as Mio and Stur, can also be a great choice to add flavor to your water without adding excess sugar or calories. If it's hot, humid, or you are sweating a lot, you will also need to replenish your electrolytes, which include magnesium, sodium, and potassium. Adding to your packing list items such as Liquid I.V. Sugar Free or BodyArmor Lyte can help replace those electrolytes.

The last essential you will want to add to your outdoor gear is supplies to promote food safety. These supplies will make sure foodborne illness doesn't ruin your outdoor fun. This includes a way to keep perishable food cold, such as an insulated cooler. Remember, you want to keep perishable food under 40 degrees Fahrenheit to prevent harmful bacteria from growing on food. You will also want to be sure to pack a food thermometer, as cooking over an open flame can result in uneven cooking temperatures. Just relying on food "looking done" is not the best plan; you will want to verify the internal temperature with a food thermometer. Another food safety essential is sanitizing wipes. Packing sanitizing wipes can be a convenient, portable way to prevent cross-contamination and keep food equipment safe.

# The Light Eaters

Every once in a while, humanity gets lucky, and a life-or-death experience happens to someone singularly equipped to describe it. Such was the case with *My Stroke of Insight* by Dr. Jill Bolte Taylor, a brain biologist who chronicled her experience of having a stroke. And such is the case with Sebastian Junger's new book.

Almost exactly four years ago, on June 16, 2020, an artery near Junger's pancreas blew out and began to flood his abdomen with blood. In his new, compulsively readable, book, *In My Time of Dying*, he tells this story in vivid detail, including the vision he had of his father when he was on the literal precipice of death.

Junger is the author of *The Perfect Storm* and a number of other bestselling nonfiction books. He has come close to death while being embedded as a journalist in war and conflict zones in the Middle East and Africa. But his nearest-death experience occurred while enjoying a quiet day with his wife at home.

He had had chest pains for a few months, off and on. But he's a tough guy, very active, always in great shape, so he wasn't worried, and didn't get checked out. On June 16, the pain was in a different location and more acute. His wife had to help him walk to the driveway. He started to go blind, then felt better, and when the ambulance arrived, he almost sent them away. Fortunately, they saw how compromised he was, so they put him on a stretcher and raced to the hospital—an hour away. For the next six to eight hours, he was in and out of consciousness, in pain that he described as 10 on a 10 scale, and skated on the razor's edge of death.

At one point, a gaping maw, black and bottomless, opened to his left while the doctors to his right tried to place a catheter in the jugular vein in his neck. Hovering above the pit was his father, who had died eight years earlier. "Hurry up," he told the doctors. "You're losing me now."

Spoiler: He lives. Just barely.

There are a fair number of books that relate stories of near-death experiences. (One of the most famous recent ones was by the aptly-named Alex Malarkey, called *The Boy Who Came Back from Heaven*. He retracted it, to the disappointment of those who thought it was proof of an evangelical view of the afterlife.)

Junger's story is different because he is a terrific writer—and also an atheist. No atheists in foxholes, they say. Junger didn't believe in an afterlife, or Heaven. But he's a thoughtful man and not reflexively dismissive of experiences that call his beliefs into question. He says, "The problem with rationality

is that things keep happening that you can't explain..." Skepticism runs in his family.

Junger's father "...didn't believe in anything as simple-minded as heaven or as extravagant as reincarnation, but he also never looked up at the stars because he said he found the immensity overwhelming."

It is a misapprehension to believe that atheists and agnostics lack a sense of awe or mystery. (Disclosure: I'm one of the latter.) Junger grapples at length with his vision, what gave rise to it, and what it all might mean. After all, atheists don't have visions, right?

"The overwhelming likelihood is that our sense of another reality is just a comforting illusion that helps us live our lives. But what appears to be likely or unlikely is a terrible strategy for finding out what is true. Our understanding of reality might be as limited as a dog's understanding of television."

Readers will learn a lot about the medical procedures and technologies that saved his life—French catheters for the win!—and about the common themes in near-death experiences across time and cultures. Junger's bibliography provides a great start for the curious who wish to know more. His discussion of quantum physics and physicists is a bit like describing a community of mystics—if the mystics engaged in soap opera-like behaviors.

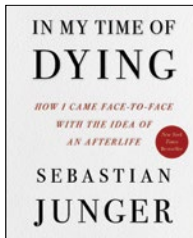
Those wanting to know how God's throne looks and what tune the angels are playing will be disappointed. Those who dismiss Junger's visions as merely the result of a lack of oxygen to the brain will also be frustrated.

But those who want a guide through the mysteries, presented by someone who has been there and back, who view life and death with awe and wonder, will find plenty to contemplate, regardless of worldview.

Junger's life was saved by the EMTs, doctors, and nurses. But also by 10 nameless people who donated the blood that ended up flowing through his heart. He ends with a plea to consider donating blood—a plea which we echo here, with the URL he provided: [DonatingBlood.org](https://www.donatingblood.org). 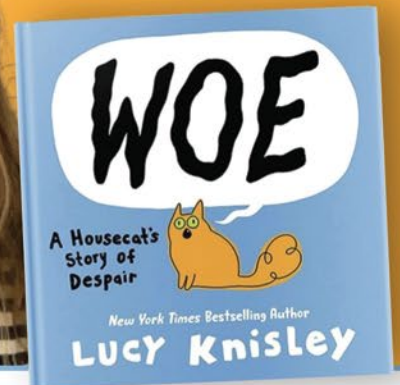

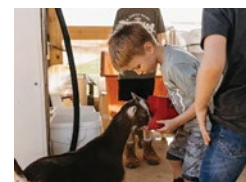
