My wife has been Swedish Death Cleaning the house. But now during week two, more IKEA pieces arrived to replace our nightstands in the bedroom, and now I'm convinced that this whole Swedish Death Cleaning thing is just a big Swedish brainwashing scam to get us all to buy a lot of IKEA furniture... which is also Swedish. I'm onto you Sweden. And amidst all of this... not one meatball to be seen anywhere. Shouldn't there be something in this for me?

I also did a little purging of my own. I sold my motorcycle last week. It was almost a knee jerk thing. As it was almost July, and I had not ever taken the bike out of storage in the shed yet, and having ridden it a whopping handful of times last year (though cancer surgery didn't help that), I realized I was just hanging onto it because I liked having a motorcycle. I might go for one or two rides over 10 miles twice a summer. That's how pathetic it was.

When I got the bike, I was riding it to work everyday. It was so convenient, cheap to drive, and easy to park. But then two months later, we got a dog who went to work with me daily, and I started riding a lot less. That was about seven years ago. It just got worse every year. And in that time, I only ever bought two batteries for it. It still works perfectly and is in stellar condition.

So, I did what one does and put it up for sale on Facebook Marketplace and Craigslist. Oh man, what a cesspool Craigslist has become. In the days right after I posted the bike, I was contacted by at least three scammers trying to pull their financial scam on me. Each scam was unique. And for some of these, you have to go a bit down the rabbit hole to figure it out.

The classic scam is the offer to send you a cashier's check and say they are sending someone to pick up the item. Then, if you say yes, they amend it by offering to send you the price of the bike and the price to ship it and have you pay the shipper for them. Step three is the "shipper" taking your credit card payment. Soon after, you find out the cashier's check was fake and it gets rejected. So they don't get their money, but that was never the intent. The scammer was also the shipper who got the smaller amount of money for the shipping fee you now lost. And who knows, if

you're really gullible, they may have your credit card info now. At least Craigslist warns you never to take cashiers checks.

The second scam was a guy wanting to come pay cash for the bike, but first he wanted me to send him a vehicle history on the bike. I said it was all on the title. But he wanted a history and sent a link to a website that will provide a vehicle history. I don't remember the site, but it looked quite professional and legit, but you have to pay for the history report and give them your credit card info, so right away I was out. But I decided to look into the site a bit. Sure enough, the URL for the site was less than three months old. Total scam. And I let him know what I thought about him and people like him. Shockingly, he didn't ever reply again.

The only real contacts I ever got were from Facebook Marketplace. The first was a guy who wanted the bike and set up a time to come look at it. The next day, he backed out but was actually very nicely apologetic about wasting my time. And finally, the young guy who actually bought it. I actually knew his family which sure helped a lot, and he came right over with a stack of hundred dollar bills. THAT'S how you buy stuff on Marketplace. But man, overall, I would just not recommend it at all, at least and especially Craigslist. It was essentially all criminals looking to hoodwink you.

So as we keep Swedish Death Cleaning, AKA "The IKEA Scam," everything we're purging I'm just giving away on Facebook to friends. Furniture, electronics, decor, whatever. It's good stuff with value. But I'm not broke, and I'd rather have people I know and like simply just have the things I once enjoyed but no longer need than for some stranger, possibly and probably a crook, to offer to buy it from me for real or fake money. I just don't have time for that.

And finally, can I just point out in the greater scheme of life, that we sit here in the strongest economy in the world and the best economy America has seen in decades, with a stock market that's doubled in value in four years, food costs coming down, violent crime decreasing. and unemployment and historic lows. An old, feeble-looking, scratchy-voiced shell of a still-great man made that growth happen for our country. He did so surrounded by wise and honest support staff. He has never been convicted or even accused of a felony, let alone dozens, never been found guilty of sexual assault, never been banned from operating a business in the State of New York, and never tried to defraud the nation and incite an insurrection of the American government. He doesn't speak in loud, constant, and easily disprovable lies, and he doesn't face more pending criminal trials ahead. He's just "old." I'm good with "old." Considering the alternative, I've freakin' overjoyed with "old." I don't understand why this is even a conversation we have to have?



SUNDAY, JULY 21 @ 2 PM **CARNEGIE-STOUT PUBLIC LIBRARY** One man is taking to America's roads to say that all is not lost, and "we the people" have the power to rescue our democracy. Retired Vermont lawyer and businessman Rick Hubbard started his Walking to Fix Our Democracy quest from Pasadena, CA in October of 2022, and will be stopping in Dubuque on Sunday, July 21, to speak at 2 p.m. at the Carnegie-Stout Public Library. Hubbard wants to empower voters across the land to raise awareness and advocate in their own communities for proper representation.

R.R.S. Stewart will also be speaking about the Voting Rights Act of 1965 and the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 1923. Stewart is a teacher and the Treasurer for Dubuque Branch NAACP.





71st Annual **Dubuque County Fair**

Bring on the Fun at Fair 71

July 23-29 Dubuque County Fairgrounds (14569 Old Highway Rd)

Some traditions are as old as time, and you'd have to be a pretty old-timer at this point to remember a time before the Dubuque County Fair. In a day when social media and video games command eyeballs and hours of time, it seems there is still a yearning for simpler times and classic entertainment as the everpopular Dubuque County Fair comes around for the 71st time to entertain the Tri-State area with music, food, rides, displays, animals, and so much more.

"It's about 4-H, it's about FFA, it's about friends, and it's about having fun," says Dubuque County Fair Manager Kevin Kotz. "So to kick it off, we're going to start off Tuesday with our Free Admission Day."

Also, like last year, the fair is hosting a free concert that first night with a tribute concert celebrating Patsy Cline, Johnny Cash, and June Carter Cash.

A free day makes the fair truly accessible to everyone. All you have to be able to do is get to the fairgrounds. And it's a wonderful opportunity to introduce county living and traditions to the more urban lifestyle in Dubuque, so much as Dubuque is considered urban.

It's the Dubuque County Fair. It's really county-focused; it's not the "City of Dubuque" Fair. But that's the whole idea. If it was a city fair, they'd be downtown, and they'd be doing city stuff. But it's not. It's out in the county. And the idea is to focus on things that are important to the entire county.

"The original goal of the fair, their mission statement at the time," explains Kotz, "was to bring the agricultural community and the city together and celebrate our heritage, because none of us are going to make it without the farmers doing their job. And by having a lot of big agricultural focus here and having the kids from 4-H and FFA, these young kids are going to be the ones feeding us for the next 60 to 70 years. So it's nice to celebrate that."

Also intrinsically tied to the image of the fair is that oval racetrack and all of the action that it brings to the venue during the fair and beyond. Wednesday night brings racing to the fairgrounds in multiple auto classes. That day also celebrates kids special activities and prizes all day.

A second free concert comes to the grandstands for country night at 7:30 p.m. as rising stars Alexandra Kay with Haley Mae Campbell take the stage. That's right: No cost for a great country show. You just pay fair gate admission.

Generating millions of plays weekly on her videos, Alexandra Kay commands the attention of country music fans. With a voice reminiscent of Dolly Parton. Alison Kraus, and Leanne Womack, Alexandra Kay is bringing country music back to its roots. Since taking social media by storm, she has collaborated with some of the most iconic names in the music industry such as Randy Travis, Tim McGraw, Jo Dee Messina, Gary LeVox, Tracy Lawrence, and Scott Stapp of Creed. Alexandra made her Grand Ole Opry debut on Nov. 19, 2022, followed by her second and third times on June 5 this year with Jelly Roll, Cody Johnson, Warren Zeiders, and more.

With a big heartbreaking rainout last year, everyone is hoping for a great night to host a re-do on last year's huge rock concert night on Friday, July 26. Hard rockers Skillet and Theory of a Deadman return for a 7:30 p.m. show. Tickets range from \$25 to \$50 and, of course, you can sit on the hillsides for free. Tickets can be purchased at the fair office by calling **563-588-1999** or at **DBQfair.com**.

Skillet is a Christian rock band consisting of husband and wife duo John and Korey Cooper. The multi Grammy-nominated group has seven albums including the Platinum and double-Platinum albums *Comatose* and *Awake* with 10 songs selling Gold or better, four of which ("Monster," "Hero," "Awake and Alive," and "Feel Invincible") were multi-Platinum selling.

Theory of a Deadman includes traits of music styles such as country and acoustic in addition to their post-grunge and alternative rock foundation when they were the first band signed to Nickelback frontman Chad Kroeger's 604 Records. Nine of their singles have entered the Top 10 of the US *Billboard* Mainstream Rock chart including four songs that peaked a No. 1: "Bad Girlfriend," "Lowlife," "Rx (Medicate)," and "History of Violence."

Saturday brings a different kind of track competition with the return of the ECIPA/Badger State Tractor Pull.

And what would Sunday afternoon at the fair be without the demolition derby? Less awesome, that's what. Fortunately, they are bringing the awesome! And if you stick around, the evening concludes with more great track action at 6:30 p.m. as Julien Dubuque Classic Stock Car Racing takes over the oval. Enjoy IMCA late models, modifieds, sport modifieds, hobby stocks, stock cars, and open 4 cylinders.

The fair also always puts AG center stage. The kids, of course, have the dairy, the beef, the chickens, the goats, the sheep, the ducks, and all that. So it really gives everyone a chance to learn.

"We really encourage you to walk through the animal barns," encourages Kotz, "not around the barns, to get into the fair or when you leave to take time to stop and appreciate the animals. Have your kids ever met a calf or a sheep up close? Here's your chance."

There are no carry-ins, and leave anything like a weapon at home. Just come out and have fun. It's a family-oriented event, and there'll be all kinds of new things to keep the youngsters busy all day.

"Come out, enjoy it, and make new memories. That's what we're all about here!" adds Kotz.





It is more than a concert; it is truly a festival that lasts for six days (we'll explain why in just a bit). The festival grounds are located southeast of Strawberry Point, IA, 2 miles off HWY 3 on W-69/Dundee Road. Stage shows begin at 4 p.m. on Friday,

11 a.m. on Saturday morning and 6 p.m. that night, and 9:30 a.m. on Sunday.

The performers booked for the 2024 Backbone Bluegrass Festival include Grammy award nominees Donna Ulisse, Rick Stanley, Jerry Salley, and Special Consensus. The Rick Faris Band was IBMA New Entertainer of the Year and is a millennial generation favorite. The remaining lineup is made up of top regional and local bands.

See stage shows with professional musicians and open stage performances where amateurs get an opportunity to perform. There is a three-day music camp and songwriters' workshop plus featured workshops for guitar, banjo, fiddle, mandolin, and bass as well as harmony singing and instrument repair. There are scavenger hunts for the children, meet and greet artists autograph sessions, and campfire jams throughout the day and the night.

What was the second image I tried to evoke? Oh yeah! The Parmesan and red pepper flake shakers! Driftless Pizza has 'em. I know, big wow eh? It IS kind of a big wow. Because you don't usually see those at higher-end pizzerias. Certainly not like this with the dry-good shaker Parmesan you buy in the sprinkle canisters. That stuff is what Parmesan connoisseurs call "not real Parmesan." Whatever. We don't need to listen to them to know what tastes good.

As for the highbrow pizza offerings? Well... let's just say you probably don't NEED red pepper flakes on a pizza like their Figgy the White, which features "a garlic confit base topped with feta, prosciutto, caramelized onions, ricotta and a swirl of fig drizzle." Boy howdy does it stand alone without them. But Driftless doesn't make that decision for you. Because those canisters of sprinkle Parm and red pepper flakes I keep going on about represent more than just flavor. They represent possibilities.

Let's get back on those pizzas, eh? That's what you really care about, eh? Truth be told, I'm almost always underwhelmed by a higher-end pizzeria's specialty pizzas. I'm a pick-your-topping kinda fella. I've weirdly been into mushroom and banana pepper lately.

But I was fully on board with ordering Driftless's specialty pizzas anyway. Because if they can wrap me submissively around a pizza with ingredients an '80s pizzeria probably never even heard of... then we can sure as hell trust them with a classic pepperoni pizza.

Before I get into the specifics of these specialty pizzas we tried, let me preemptively answer a question you're sure to have: What the hell is Detroit-style pizza? Driftless serves their pizzas as vour choice of Detroit or New York style. I'm sure you have enough of a grasp on what New York-style pizza is. It's done battle with Chicago style for decades. But Detroit style? Huh? Well let me answer your question with another question: Do you like the burnt cheesy parts of a pizza? Because if you do, I'm telling you right now that Detroit style is your favorite style of pizza. Detroit style is a deepdish pizza, but not as deep as Chicago style. And it's made in a rectangular pan. And there's no margin between crust and cheese. By that, I mean the cheese is sprinkled over the entire thing to the point where it gathers around the edges and gets that burnt cheese goodness all around it. Driftless Pizza's Detroit-style is even more miraculous as far as burnt cheese goes because the cheese looks

If you like your pizza a bit more highbrow, maybe a pizzeria needs to be on point with its balsamic drizzle, caramelized onions, and non-traditional cheeses to deserve the name. And for sure you can't help but picture unobtrusive stands to set your pizza so they don't take up too much table surface area.

Folks... with Driftless Pizza now open, all those images of the platonic ideal

pizzeria and more are on instant recall. Plus! It's important to note that Driftless does have gluten-free cauliflower crust AND vegan cheese options. And in addition to their pizza, ice cream treats and sandwiches will be available soon.

First off, let's address the elephant in the room: How could the good people at Backpocket open a higher-end pizza joint right where a higher-end pizza joint just kind of fell flat on its face? Well... I don't know a lot about what happened with the previous place, so I can't assign blame. But I do know it wasn't the public's fault. You and me? It wasn't our fault. We deserve a higher-end pizzeria that reminds us why we love pizzerias. The Tri-States are worthy of that. Moving on.

Let's take that first image I evoked. The pizza arcade. Do you know what's also in the Novelty Iron Works building down in the Millwork District? A friggin' arcade. And it's a GOOD arcade, too. Because it serves beer. It's a beercade. Think of it as an old friend who moved away in middle school. And now that you've reconnected, it's just like old times. Except now you're both old enough to drink. That's what it's like. Pizza and arcade games. It's like I'm having my eighth birthday at Pucci's Pizza all over again. Except the pizza's better. And Guitar Hero has been invented.

like it climbs up the pan to create little peaks of burnt cheese yummy-yum that you can just snap off and eat. Hell yeah.

Now! Let's get back to Figgy the White. A figgy pizza isn't groundbreaking. It's pretty common in these types of pizzerias and for good reason. If you want to stray from your traditional mozzarella cheese into things like goat cheese or (in Figgy the White's case) feta and ricotta, fig is a great flavor to marry those cheeses into flatbreads like pizza. A pizza with a white sauce instead of red doesn't scream pizza to me so it's rarely my choice, but I always like it when forced to eat it. But I loved Figgy the White.

But let's get even more whimsical with our pizza, shall we? My son joined us, and he chose the Tie Dye served New York style. He ordered it because he's been really into pesto lately. A 12-year-old into pesto. That's my boy. The Tie Dye is a pizza with "a tomato sauce base topped with our cheese blend and swirls of pesto and vodka sauce." That swirl is what gives the Tie Dye its name. That swirl also guarantees a wonderful distribution of those different sauces. If you have someone who refuses to stray from the traditional red sauce, the Tie Dye might just be their gateway drug into pesto et. al.

The Works! The Works is Driftless Pizza's answer to the combo pizza. It comes with "a tomato sauce base topped with our cheese blend and sausage, black olives, pepperoni, green peppers, mushrooms, and red onions." I don't usually like an entire grocery list of toppings on my pizza. I want to experience each topping, and with an entire "Twelve Days of Christmas" on my pizza, it's just sensory overload. The Works, however, doesn't eat like that. The flavors are well-balanced and well-married. I don't get to enjoy all the ingredients on their individual merits, but all the ingredients combine to form a cohesive flavor profile that stands on its own merits.

This last one is going to be a bit contentious. People on either side of the debate have strong, strong feelings about Hawaiian pizza. They'll tell you pineapple doesn't belong on pizza. My retort is, "It's sweet and salty in pizza form. Why can't you just be happy about that?" Driftless Pizza has a much more convincing retort in the form of their Hawaiitalian. No, they didn't ditch the pineapple. Keep dreaming. They embraced the pineapple by giving it a bit of a char and pairing it NOT with your common Canadian bacon, oh no. They up the game by pairing it with prosciutto. Hence the "italian" in Hawaiitalian. Oh, but wait! That lightly charred pineapple and that prosciutto have too much love for just the two of them. So they form a throuple with some wonderful caramelized onions. A friend of mine made a point

about caramelized onions that I think is a good one. A lot of places that serve caramelized onions don't know what a caramelized onion is. Driftless Pizza gets it.

As for the restrooms, well... I don't get it. Driftless Pizza, a brewery tap room, a beercade, a comedy club, a sports bar, and I'm probably forgetting other things... ALL of them direct their customers to the same restrooms and somehow... SOME-HOW they still manage to keep it clean. I mean... I've been in the Novelty Iron Works building on a busy weekend, and MAYBE the garbage is a little too full, but I still have no trouble doing my dirty work there.

Driftless Pizza is the pizzeria the Tri-States deserves. And with all it has to offer, it's also the pizzeria the Tri-States wants, even if they don't know it yet.





Originally, Horizon: An American Saga— Chapter 1 was supposed to be followed up by the



Freewater

Amina Luqman-Dawson's Newbery Award-winning debut novel for young adults, *Freewater*, would have been a quick read if not for two things.

Especially early on, it seemed like on each page there was a beautiful line that demanded to be rolled on the tongue and savored before moving on. And sometimes I had to put the book down to pace the floor about a character in peril.

Unlike *The Eyes and the Impossible*, the Newbery winner reviewed last time, the characters in *Freewater* are human. Most of them are people who have escaped from Confederate enslavers on nearby plantations and taken refuge in a nearby swamp. But some were born in the swamp and have never known enslavement.

The story begins with 12-year-old swamp-born Sanzi, climbing a tree and looking at the world beyond the safety of her community, and wondering what adventures awaited her.

"The whir of the leather sling whispered in the air like children sipping hot soup."

We then meet Homer, also 12, and his little sister, Ada, who is 7, as they flee the Southerland plantation. Homer says, "I had my rules back at Southerland; the most important was being invisible. Invisibility was how I survived. I'd learned that all attention, even the good kind, could be dangerous. I'd go a full day without anyone or anything even knowing I'd been there."

He describes his little sister, "Ada had a way of soaking things up." And, "Sometimes Ada's dreams burned so bright I didn't have the strength to put them out."

Their plan had been to flee with their mother, Rose, and their friend Anna and head north. But Rose didn't make it. Before the swamp does to them what swamps do to strangers, Homer and Ada meet a stranger who leads them to the hidden community. The stranger is named Suleman.

"He was the most different person I'd ever seen. His skin was a sweet, deep, glowing hickory brown, with hair locked into long ropes that hung over his wide shoulders and down his back."

Luqman-Dawson creates a marvelous array of characters, in the swamp and back on the plantation. Each has their own history, foibles, and journeys. The reader feels as welcomed and relieved as Homer and Ada at discovering that such a community could not only survive, but thrive. In a brief afterword, Luqman-Dawson talks about the real communities that inspired her to create *Freewater*.

Like friends often do, they have rivalries, and find themselves depending on each other during crises, losses, mistakes, and adventures. Young people have their hero's journeys. We encounter echoes of Tarzan, Robin Hood, and Zorro. The Lost Boys. The Green Man. Katniss Everdeen. Harriet Tubman, David and his sling, and Moses, of course. And alas, Judas.

In the midst of the nail-biting swash-buckling is a portrayal of a community in exile. There are idyllic elements, but the relationships are realistic. There are diverse views and temperaments. People don't always get along. Even when they work together, they quarrel. Even when they're doing their best to have each other's back, they can be exasperated with each other. But it's still a community. Just like real life.

It's a great lesson to teach children in these polarized times: The people who get on your last nerve may not be your enemy. They may be the ones you end up having to rely on—or you may be the one they must rely on. You do things you regret that have a real cost. Your community may be able to deal with them and may choose to do so for your sake. Luqman-Dawson never strays into being pedantic. She writes prose that will sometimes leave you marveling that this is her first book and not her 20th.

There are bad guys, people intent on denying others their freedom. In that way, this is a fundamentally American and human story. There are always people who want to deny you your birthright, your freedom. Those who have had to fight for it best know its value.

Don't let the fact that *Freewater* is a novel for young adults keep you from reading it. Chances are that some of the most impactful books you've ever read were YA novels. There's plenty to chew on, whether you're 12 or 22 or 72.

Sounds Fishy?

Get the Facts about Omega-3s

In the past, you may have heard some facts about fish and omega-3 fatty acids but might be wondering just how reliable those facts are. For example, did you know that 95% of Americans, and 80% of people worldwide, are not getting enough EPA and DHA omega-3s through their diet alone? If you're interested in learning more about these essential nutrients, keep reading for the answers to some common questions about seafood.

One frequent question is, "What is the serving size of seafood, and how much should I eat a week?" A serving size of fish/seafood is approximately 4 ounces, or the size of a deck of cards/palm of your hand for adults. Each week, try to consume two, 4-ounce servings of seafood. This can be eaten at one time (8 oz serving)

or can be eaten throughout the week. However, not all fish are created equal when it comes to omega-3 fatty acids. Fish higher in omega-3s include salmon, mackerel, anchovies, sardines, herring, and tuna.

The second most frequent question is, "Why are EPA and DHA important, and do I need to supplement omega-3 fatty acids?" You may have heard of EPA and DHA before, as it is focused on during pregnancy. However, EPA and DHA are important not only for your heart or during pregnancy, but throughout your entire life. DHA is considered the neck up (eyes and brain) essential fatty acid and EPA is considered the neck down (heart and joint health) essential fatty acid. These nutrients help fight off inflammation in the body, leaving you feeling better internally.

While we recommend speaking to a physician about supplementation, the Recommended Daily Intake (RDI) of EPA and DHA for women is 1,100 mg and 1,600 mg for men. These are the minimum milligrams needed to support the body's health. The supplement brand Nordic Naturals uses a process that returns the fish oil to more than 90% of its natural form. This helps the body recognize and use these products faster and more effectively versus a synthetic (known as ethyl ester) omega-3 supplement. Check out this brand if your physician wants you to supplement omega-3s in your diet!

The last question frequently asked is, "How do I figure out my omega-3 levels?" The only way to know is to test your omega-3 level using an Omega-3 Index test. Screenings have been available at participating Hy-Vee stores. You can connect with me for more information.






