



Live entertainment all afternoon include the Fever River String Band at 11:30 a.m. and Three Quarter Buzz at 3:30 p.m.



Captain Tammie Jo Shults

Captain Tammie Jo Shults, who safely landed Southwest Airlines Flight 1380 after it experienced an engine failure, will deliver the Fall 2024 Michael Lester Wendt Character Lecture on Monday, Oct. 7 at 7 p.m. at Heritage Center. Her lecture is titled "Habits, Hope, and Heroes."

Shults demonstrated perseverance and grit on her path to becoming a military pilot. As a child she was inspired to pursue aviation, but the lack of support for women in the industry delayed her entrance into the profession. After her application to the Air Force was turned

down, she persisted. She realized her goals with the U.S. Navy, earning her pilot's wings in the T-34 and eventually serving as an instructor, then as an aggressor pilot for naval aviators during Operation Desert Storm. She became one of the first female F/A-18 Hornet pilots and promoted to the rank of lieutenant commander in the Navy Reserve.

After retiring from active duty, Shults' extensive training for high-pressure situations came to her aid as a commercial pilot for Southwest Airlines when an engine exploded at high altitude on April 17, 2018, causing multiple system failures and rapid depressurization. Shults made a successful emergency landing, saving 148 passengers and crew. Her memoir, *Nerves of Steel*, became a national best-selling book.

Now retired, Shults continues to pursue her passion for aviation as a volunteer pilot and through her service on the Women in Aviation Advisory Board to the Federal Aviation Administration, Pearl Harbor Aviation Board, and the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation Board.



A Life Well Lived: Jac Tilton Memorial Art Show

A Life Well Lived is the theme of the Jac Tilton Memorial Art Show, to be held Friday, Sept. 27 at 5:30–7:30 p.m., at the Susan & Peter Smith Welcome Center on the University of Dubuque campus. More than 50 original pieces will be featured. The public is invited.

Tilton died of cancer on Feb. 18, 2024, and his family decided that a memorial art show—rather than a traditional visitation and funeral—was the most appropriate way to honor their husband, father, and grandfather.

"My husband was a life-long creative type so we wanted to commemorate his life in a way that truly reflected him. We were delighted that the University of Dubuque contacted us shortly after he passed, offering to host a memorial art show," Chris Chapin-Tilton, his wife of 41 years, explains.



This will not be the first Jac Tilton art exhibit at University of Dubuque. In 2014, his show *Things Forgotten, Things Discovered* was held at UD's Bisignano Art Gallery. Tilton was employed at UD for over 10 years, handling the University's web services until his retirement when he achieved his lifelong dream of becoming a full time artist.

Over the years, his watercolors and graphite drawings were featured in both national and international watercolor exhibits, adorned the walls of many Midwestern galleries, and published in numerous *Strokes of Genius: the Best of Drawing* coffee table books.

The Jac Tilton Art Education Fund has been established to support art education programming in select Galena and Dubuque-area nonprofits for aspiring artists of all ages. Work is underway on the first project to expand and refurbish the high school art gallery at the Galena Center for Arts in Tilton's name. This inaugural project was chosen to reflect the 12 years he taught in the Galena Public School system. Each school in Jo Daviess county has a monthly exhibit during the school year. Proceeds from future sales of Tilton's original work and prints will be put toward the educational fund in his name.

Additionally, solo shows are planned in 2025 at Voices Studios in Dubuque and the Iowa Artisan's Gallery in Iowa City, IA.

The Art of Outdoor Artmaking at the Bluff Strokes 2024 Paint Out

Convening more than 55 artists from across the country, the Bluff Strokes 2024 Paint Out returns to Dubuque on Sept. 29 through Oct. 5, with artists setting up their easels in and around the city, competing for \$15,000 in award money, and engaging locals in a unique display of live art making outside the studio setting. Starting Sunday, Sept. 29, artists will render natural landscapes and historical architecture in Dubuque and the surrounding areas with this year's paintings being judged by Nebraska artist Debra Joy Groesser, who is best known for her impressionistic landscape paintings, particularly her plein air work. Prizes being given out include themed awards highlighting signature Dubuque features such as Mississippi Overlook and Street Scene. "This is our seventh event, but new people are coming out every time," said Bluff Strokes founder Wes Heitzman. "This year we had 90 applicants, and we also have our regular attendees, but more people keep learning about us, so we're excited to keep reaching new markets."

By uniting the once forgotten art of capturing landscapes in an open air setting rather than inside a studio, and with Dubuque's rich natural environment of river scenes, Driftless area landscapes, and historic architecture, the plein air competition began with a desire to promote Dubuque and its enviable characteristics to a broader artist community. In its seventh Paint Out event. Bluff Strokes returns with a characteristic enthusiasm from artists, organizers, and community members alike, all excited to once again personally engage with artists from near and far amongst the area's rich landscapes. "When you go into a gallery, you almost never meet your artist," said Heitzman. "And many artists want to hear your story of why the work they made is meaningful to you, what your connection is. This event allows for that, which is unique."

Expanding on this sense of accessibility, this year they've added additional opportunities for the community to buy artwork. "Two of our days, Tuesday and Thursday, we have pop-up sales where we're selling the artists' previous works not painted during the week," said Heitzman. "It gives insight into what's coming and also connects local people to other places they may have been to that these artists have also captured."

Founded by Heitzman in 2014 in affiliation with the Dubuque County Fine Arts Society (DCFAS), Bluff Strokes initially

created workshops for artists to explore and utilize the city's singular natural offerings and rich architectural legacy. Having seen rapid growth since the mid-1980s, the plein air art movement's objective is to capture the mood of a scene in changing light. This idea of documenting a fleeting moment in time was one that intrigued Heitzman, whose wife Barbara is a painter. Knowing that those working in the plein air technique intentionally seek out unique locations to travel for workshops and paint outs, and that similar events have been growing in popularity throughout the country, the goal of Bluff Strokes has always been to share Dubuque's one-of-akind resources, while helping establish it as a significant stop on the plein air art circuit, something which it's already achieved by carving out a respected name for itself amongst artists nationally. "Bluff Strokes has a great reputation with important, topprize-taking artists who love coming here. and we're proud of that," said Heitzman. "This year we had a guy from California call us asking how to get to Dubuque. We seem to be getting our artists and patrons from further away, which I think is exciting, but our strategy is also to put buying and owning original art on local people's radar by developing a robust art market here."

Since 2014, Bluff Strokes has held workshops featuring master-level instructors from around the country, inspiring artists to pursue and develop their techniques. Participants have included roughly 40% local artists and 60% from outside the area. The group Plein Air Painters of Dubuque started as the result of one early workshop, continuing to meet and paint weekly throughout the Dubuque area, as did the Dubuque Urban Sketchers. Both serve as examples of engagement through artmaking that Heitzman and the others involved hope to see grow within the community. More recently, Bluff Strokes has set its sights on making the tradition more

accessible to a younger demographic by holding meetings and workshops geared at the 30-and-under crowd. During this year's event, they will hold a one-day outdoor painting workshop on Saturday, Sept. 28, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Artist Steve Putrich will lead the event, which is designed to introduce artists ages 16–30 to the art of outdoor painting. With a cost of only \$35, Heitzman and crew are proud to be able to bring world-class plein air talent that would normally cost significantly more to the area's younger artists so that new skills are fostered and the tradition continues.

To challenge and encourage artists to explore the varied painting opportunities that Dubuque has to offer, special Paint Out awards will be given for works in several themed categories: Mississippi Overlook, Riverfront Scene, Historic Dubuque (building or neighborhood), Industrial, Arboretum/Park/Garden, Rural Scene, and Street Scene (interesting alley, building sign, etc.). With a different judge every year, there is no set way in which works are judged. Instead, each year brings a different perspective to the process, with artists striving to grow in their creativity, and cultivating fresh pieces while using their personal aesthetic and visual interpretations to their advantage.

Individual events throughout the week include Nocturne Paintings, held nightly from Sept. 29 through Oct. 2, where artists paint evening scenes downtown, on the riverfront, and at other locations with interesting nighttime lighting. On Tuesday, Oct. 1, there is a Quick Paint event where artists have two and a half hours to create a finished and framed work. They will have their canvases time-stamped at 8:30 a.m., returning the framed paintings by 11 a.m., with a Public Preview Showing happening from noon until 1 p.m. at Steeple Square. Each artist will have two "prior work" paintings available for sale that day, with the morning's Quick

Paint works on display to preview before Friday's Parton Party and Saturday's Plein Air Art Sale. Another Public Preview Showing will occur on Thursday, Oct. 3 at noon-1 p.m. featuring the "prior works," with both the Quick Paint and Nocturn works up for preview. Each of these preview events is free and open to the public.

For many patrons, the highlight of the festival is the Patron Party & Art Sale on Friday, Oct. 4 from 6 to 9 p.m. This is a chance to "see Dubuque through an artists' eyes" in the beautiful Steeple Square Community Event Center. The Patron Party & Art Sale features complimentary wine, craft beer from Jubeck's, heavy hors d'oeuvres by Q Casino, and live music. The \$150 Patron Pass admits two to the event and includes a \$100 voucher applicable towards the purchase of a finished work The following day, Saturday, Oct. 5, is the final event, the Bluff Strokes Plein Air Art Sale from 9 a.m.-4 p.m. This event is free and open to the public and features paintings made throughout the week. Many artists will also be live painting at that morning's Dubuque Farmers' Market, adding those last-minute offerings to the sale, and there will be live music, with food and coffee drinks from Devour Cafe and mimosas and Bloody Marys from the bar at Steeple Square available for purchase.

With hundreds of paintings sold each year, Bluff Strokes uses proceeds from the Paint Out to underwrite the cost of the event and the development of future educational programs. However, this year's proceeds will also go to fund the new Bluff Strokes Art Center. As of May 2024, the Bluff Strokes Art Center, a 501(3)(C) organization, moved into and began renovating its permanent location at 12th and Locust Street. "Our goal is to have really good quality programming for all age groups and all income levels." said Bluff

Strokes Paint Out Chair Jillayne Pinchuk. "And to have another cultural offering for everyone in Dubuque whether you have a paintbrush or pencil in your hand." The center, which is set to open in 2025, will be comprised of both educational and gallery space with plans for the lower level to be utilized as studios that artists can rent and access when it's convenient for them. "Because for a lot of people, art is a parttime thing they might be trying to develop, we want to make it easier for them to the find time and space for it," said Pinchuk.

The most important aspect for Bluff Strokes' annual Paint Out event is the desire to truly enrich the Dubuque community through appreciation and participation in art and art patronage. "Ideally for us, visitors will come to Dubuque and take a piece of the area's history home with them," said Pinchuk. "We love having these mostly outside artists in our community and getting their perspective on a place we've often come to overlook."

Heitzman agreed, "That's probably one of the more unique things about Bluff Strokes, that most of the artists are not from the area, so they get to hear a story they've never heard before from a local who might buy a painting they made. It's that connection and interaction between artist and patron based on the place the art was created that makes this event so special."

Frank O'Dowd's (Irish) Food Truck

In late spring of this year, the Frank O'Dowd's food truck quietly debuted in the Tri-States. We at 365ink didn't even know it was out there when we did our huge local food truck cover story in early summer. Our bad. But we definitely got there eventually, a couple of times. And as fall weather sets in, it feels like the perfect time of the year to talk about the hearty Irish offerings of Frank O'Dowd's now that it's on wheels.

For decades now, Frank O'Dowd's restaurant and bar at the Irish Cottage Inn & Suites has long been a regional destination for great traditional Irish fare, often with a twist. And even though

Galena is just a hop, skip, and a jump from Dubuque for dinner, it's still a bit of a destination drive. So how great is it that some of the best dishes are now available at many of the region's favorite festivals and special events?

The decision to add a food truck to the offerings coming from the Irish Cottage sprung from their desire to build onto their existing on-site banquets and catering program according to Joshua Roberts, director of food and beverage for the venue. "A lot of the couples that we were talking to were also looking at outside venues, and we didn't have the capacity to offer quality off-site catering. So, we started looking at the possibility where we'd be cooking on-site so that meals are fresh as opposed to, you know, hauling from long distances where food sits in hot boxes."

And so the truck was born. Uniquely, it allows them to offer completely different menus depending on the purpose of the event, from more refined buffets and plated meals for receptions and private events to festival food fare, which we will focus on here.

"The food truck would also help us get involved in more of the local community events because we're not right on Main Street like a lot of the other restaurants in Galena," explains Roberts. Yep, and it lets them come to Main Street Dubuque, too—and they have!

They also really liked the idea of participating in festivals, especially Irish festivals and beer events, to introduce themselves to a new part of the public.

"It's been a lot of fun already," notes Roberts. "We've done everything so far from a five-course plated dinner that was outside at Orchard Landing in Galena to the Dubuque Irish Hooley and even to the lowa Irish Fest in Waterloo."

With ovens, range burners, grills, fryers, and the whole nine yards on the truck, they can accomplish anything that they need to right from the truck. And it's all made from scratch, fresh for every event.

Picking the items to feature for public events was a little bit going with surefire hits and also taking in public input.

"We gauge what exactly the customer is looking for. So, we have some refined options but with some of that pub familiarity," explains Roberts.

A best seller, Reuben egg rolls were something that they were offering already at the restaurant in Galena.

"We were looking for fun streetstyle food that we were able to put an Irish flair on," notes Roberts. "What do you want when you go to a festival, and how can we incorporate those onto our truck using some of the same ingredients that we use in the Irish pub? We make all those in-house ourselves, everything that's on the truck." He adds, "Having the brick-and-mortar restaurant and the prep kitchen at the hotel is a big help. Being able to brine our fish ahead of time in the restaurant so they maintain their flavor and moisture in the frying process, the Rueben egg rolls, we roll in house, the scotch eggs, we make those in-house as well."

And when they fry them up fresh on the truck, you know it's all going to be nice and crispy.

When they are at a real, traditional Irish Fest, you will see them hunker down with more true-and-traditional, pure Irish fare and likely a lot of options, while at a normal festival or event set up, you can see more creativity like the fish tacos.

Oh, hey. How about I actually run down a typical mobile menu offering while I'm torturing you by not talking about the actual food yet?

Look for Irish-style fish tacos, scotch eggs (hard-boiled eggs wrapped in pork sausage, coated in breadcrumbs, and deep-fried), fried cheese curds (because, duh!), Reuben egg rolls, stick ribs, poutine (curds and gravy over fries), curry chips, and side fries. You can also choose actual entrees including traditional fish and chips, corned beef and hash, and bangers and mash (sausages with an onion gravy over potatoes).

It's warm, filling, stick-to-your ribs kind of food that pairs so well with a cold beer and cool weather. That said, when they do a lot of summer winery events, they will pull out a very different menu that is more warm-weather friendly like open-faced French bread sandwiches, charcuterie, and marinated vegetables.

"We kind of play around with the catering based on where we're gonna be and what we're doing, but to the best of our ability, we try to maintain that brand standard of Frank O'Dowd's Pub." adds Roberts.

They want to be active throughout the entire year and are currently developing some Christmas party offerings for those who don't want to rent out ballrooms but instead want to host the event at their business or a bar with Frank O'Dowd's catering unique, fresh-cooked food from right outside. Not just a bunch of pizzas.

"The main focus of the truck for us is really to just be able to interject ourselves into the community and let people get to know us," notes Roberts. "We're excited to do everything from a 300-person plated wedding down to a 30-person graduation party at someone's house."

So far, they don't have regular spots where you can find them, but they hit a lot of festivals and have been fairly regularly out at Galena Cellars and Fergedaboudit Vineyard when they have live music throughout the season. And as the Irish Cottage is currently rebuilding their entire website where the food truck will have its own home, for now, you can keep up with where they will be next or, of course, book them for your next big event through their Facebook page at facebook.com/frankodowds.

Achieving Better Health with GLP-1

The Role of Nutrition and Weight Loss in Diabetes Management

Diabetes treatment is improving; one big change is using GLP-1 receptor agonists. These medicines help control blood sugar and weight management, essential for people with type 2 diabetes. GLP-1 therapy works best when combined with changes in behavior and lifestyle, especially with nutrition and weight management.

This article examines how GLP-1 receptor agonists, nutrition, and weight loss work together to improve the health of people with diabetes. It shows how combining these medicines with lifestyle changes can help people manage their diabetes better and improve their overall quality of life.

GLP-1 is a hormone produced in the small intestine that has several functions. It helps release insulin from the pancreas and stops the hormone glucagon, which raises blood sugar levels. What If We **Get It Right**

By John McAndrew

What If We Get It Right, the new book about climate change solutions by Dr. Ayana Elizabeth Johnson, is inspiring, ennobling, and enabling.

I've already purchased two copies for friends-one of whom just told me that's she's liking the introduction.

I hope you're still reading. Being jaded and discouraged about climate change is understandable. Who can tolerate more talk about a problem that has been begging for decisive action for decades?

Dr. Johnson interviews 20 people-diplomats, farmers, lawyers, and young organizers-about the work they are doing and what they want folks to know about it.

Teddy Roosevelt said that "Far and away the best prize that life offers is the chance to work hard at work worth doing."

Dr. Johnson and her interviewees show not just what's possible but what is already being accomplished. They explain in detail the complexity of the challenges posed by climate change, probably better than any other book on the subject. The difference is, those challenges are described in animated discussions with those who are working on them. These are problem solvers, not prophets of doom. Instead of making the problem more daunting, breaking it down into its components helps readers to see where they can get a grip on it.

Johnson loves solutions, and they come in all sizes. You can reduce your personal carbon footprint. Your group can write, or advocate for, better local or state policies. You can organize your community to vote for those who will make better, more informed decisions about legislation. You can join in international efforts. You can plant a community garden.

In short, there are a TON of right answers. Climate will define our future, like the creation of the internet 40 years ago continues to do. It will affect, and be mitigated by, people working within agriculture and farming: disaster response: migration: urban design; tech and AI; manufacturing; building codes; transportation; taxation and finance; international affairs; poverty, race, and justice issues; housing; leisure activities; entertainment and journalism; gardening, and more.

Interview subjects say that we already have all the solutions we need. We simply need to scale and spread them. New breakthroughs, like fusion energy, may help. But this is not a techno-utopian screed.

And no, we won't be abandoning a ruined Earth and moving to Mars.

It's daunting, and success (however we may define it) is far from guaranteed. But

haven't you always wanted to do something difficult with your life? Think of it

as the great undertaking of our generation and the next, like the building of the great

will the world look like, if we get this right? I don't think I've conveyed how FUN a read this is. Johnson's own story is delightfully told. She has known some of her interviewees for decades. We get to listen to old friends talking about their shared passions. There's a great deal of diversity

of voice, experience, and expertise to learn

from here. And a fair amount of playfulness.

Dr. Johnson edited the 2022 edition of Best American Science and Nature Writing. She earned her doctorate from the Scripps Institution of Oceanography. Wonder is where she lives and works. She understands that maintaining places of wonder requires drudgery. She frequently asks, "What is the nerdiest, least sexy, most esoteric thing we need to do now...?"

I understand cynicism about climate. For years, I traveled to lobby Congress in DC on behalf of a carbon fee and dividend policy. We were volunteers and spent our own time and money to do so. Over a thousand of us would descend on DC twice a year and meet with every member of Congress who would meet with us. We would meet them back in their district offices, too. We poured heart and soul into the effort.

The scale and reach of this crisis is unprecedented, and humanity's response has been inadequate, and late.

But consider holding your cynicism loosely for a bit. Meet some people who have created projects that are a helluva lot more intricate, effective, and satisfying than changing light bulbs. By the time you finish meeting them, you may think of ways to lend a hand, right where you are, with the skills you have. Feeling hopeful may be an option again. At least consider the possibility. Undertaking a great work in the company of good folks who share the same vision: Is anything better, more fun, more satisfying? Anything?





Mattel's *Matchbox*, an upcoming film based on the popular toy line of the same name, has found its



first actor in John Cena. Cena getting behind the wheel of *Matchbox* seemingly solidifies the film's status as the "macho" version of *Barbie*. At least four of Marvel's most powerful villains have been set up for Phase 6 of the Marvel Cinematic Universe,



perfectly replacing Kang the Conqueror realities and timelines, each with their own slew of heroes and villains. Beyond that, many of the villains expected to appear in the MCU's Phase 6 are returning from previous projects, finally beating the one-and-done villain rule. Marvel's Multiverse Saga is expected to end in a massive event, with 2027's *Avengers:* Secret Wars possibly detailing the destruction of the multiverse in the wake of epic incursions.



MY HIGHLY ARTISTIC BEETLE

Life is an Art

What is art? I've been trying to figure that out. Am I an artist? That's a whole different question. (Are you?)

I walked through a display the other day at the Dubuque Museum of Art, an extraordinary exhibition by 21 unique artists for Craft Invitational. If you haven't seen it, hurry before it's gone. These artists work in clay, fabric, wood, glass, sterling silver, beads, and shoe leather. You might have some of these things lying around the house. Can you make them into art?

When I was a child, I was urged to make art, now and then, in school. In kindergarten, we drew pictures to illustrate the Dick and Jane books we were learning to read. In fourth grade, we learned to create ink prints by carving—what was it? some kind of hard rubber?—into a shape, then rolling ink over it and pressing a piece of paper, which came away with each kid's design. Mine was a beetle; I have no idea why. In sixth grade, I drew a bird with a dark pencil. It was perfect.

After that, two things happened. First, in junior high, students were herded off into separate directions. Those with high grades in science took AP biology. Those with artistic talent took art. I was sent to biology, and afraid to try art again because my bird was so perfect.

My friend Jennee was an artist. A gorgeous painting she made hangs in our living room. Another junior high friend, Cindy, revealed her gift in a small but brilliant way. One day at lunch, she passed around a little box with two

things inside—clover from her yard, and a red heart—to evoke a popular song on the radio, "Crimson and Clover." I loved that. Why hadn't I thought of it?

In high school, I began making collages, not for any class but for my own pleasure. Cutting pictures from magazines, I assembled my favorite actors, singers, and writers—Collette, Frank Langella, Buffy St. Marie, Sam Waterston, the cast of The Waltons, Al Pacino as Serpico, even Geraldo Rivera. At some point, I let my posters go, but not after photographing them. Surely, that was art. I was expressing myself to myself.

Picture frames can be an inspiration. I use them to hang not only art but amazing photos from magazines—a black cloud over a corn field, a winged angel walking down a NYC street, a photo of me and my four besties from junior high. Our walls are covered with art by people I know—Stormy Mochal! Jenny Braig!—and broadsheet poems, in which poems are printed with a letterpress and sometimes adorned with a small drawing.

I made one of those myself, when my poem "Swimming in Lake Ada" was published in an Australian journal. It hangs beneath a small and beautiful watercolor of fish, made by my friend Alyssa, who is truly an artist.

So is my friend Beth. So are a lot of other people I'm privileged to know in Dubuque. They make art that can hang on a wall or stand on a pedestal. But I was talking about those big questions. "Am I an artist? Are you?"

My simple answer is, "Yes." Cooking can be an art. German artist Joseph Bueys said, "Even the art of peeling a potato can be art if it is a conscious act." I peeled two pounds of carrots for soup last night and did it artfully, with deep appreciation for the peeler's ease of use. Displaying your books can be an art; so can the act of collecting them. My

six-foot case of poetry books is an art, and so is the poetry it holds in its arms.

Long ago, I wrote a grant application to the lowa Arts Council for a show by visual artists. Reading their rules, I was astounded to learn that they considered writing an art. I came up with a show of poetry linked to family photos, inviting a Loras poetry class and a class of high schoolers to join me. Darned if we didn't get the grant, and those kids were so proud, especially when I handed each of them a \$10 bill.

After 9/11, the lowa Department of Cultural Affairs offered grants for responses to the tragedy. We had art on the walls of the Loras art gallery, music created and performed by local musicians, poems on the wall, and a one-act, one-woman play written by me, starring the amazing Melinda Titus, and directed by Lenore Howard, the woman who, with her husband Doug Donald, keeps Fly-By-Night Productions vibrantly alive. If only I'd reached out to the Dubuque Ballet.

Dancers, painters, poets, playwrights, sculptors, all of them are artists. And you, too, any time you tie a perfect bow in your granddaughter's pigtails, or set a table with just the right flowers and silver, or take a carefully composed photo of a

pelican by the dam, or write a beautiful paragraph about your favorite aunt for your memoirs, or weed your kitchen garden so the potatoes can breathe. Taking the time to do something with intention turns it into art, and art matters. Textile designer Anni Albers put it this way: "Art is something that makes you breathe with a different kind of happiness."

Renowned theater director Stella Adler said, "Life beats you down and crushes your soul, and art reminds you that you have one," while Stephen King declared, "Life isn't a support system for art. It's the other way around.

Dubuque has a vibrant arts community, a list I don't have room to compile. But my point is this: You can revel in other people's art, and I hope you will. But look at yourself. If I can make art, anybody can.

- All people ages 13-64 should be screened for HIV at least once in their lifetime.
- All people ages 18 and over should be screened for hepatitis B at least once in their lifetime.
- All people ages 18 and over should be screened for hepatitis C at least once in their lifetime.
- Pregnant women should be screened for HIV, hepatitis B, and hepatitis C during each pregnancy.

Talk to your healthcare provider about getting screened! Forgot if you've had a screening? Ask them to check your records!


