

WHICH ONE OF THESE COSTS MORE TO SHIP?

A few days ago, I spent \$365 to mail a UPS package, and that reality has been living rent-free in my brain ever since. I had no idea that was a thing. Also... 365... irony?

You see, I had a beautiful piece of stained glass in my Toys for Tots Facebook auction, and it went for a lovely \$450. While we said we're not shipping items larger than an envelope outside of the city, I made an exception because the extremely kind and generous donor who won the auction prize for \$450 actually donated \$1,500. Actually, he gave \$1,530, covering he costs of the credit card fee too. And that, my friends, it worth doing a little extra work to figure out how to get him the glass to Wayzata, MN.

I called UPS Pack and Ship and asked if they could make it happen, and they said yes. So, I carefully transported the 24" x 36" stained glass picture of an eagle flying out of a brilliant sunburst to the store. The very nice girl at the counter looked at box sizes and thought she may not have one big enough for the glass. They thought it might work in the box that I believed was 28" x 36". The shipping cost before the actual cost of the box and insuring it for \$500 was about \$35. Sounds good.

But then they realized that they could not make it work in that box. It would need a couple of inches of padding at the top and bottom to keep it safe, and I agreed. So now they had to look for a larger box. I don't know how big, actually. I just agreed to whatever they had to do to get it in the mail, so to speak. So they re-rang up the sale and now, in a 4" longer box, the price to ship before the costs of the packing materials and \$10 of insurance to cover \$500 of value... \$310! That is not a typo. A box that's four inches longer increased the cost to ship 900%.

After all the materials and insurance, it was \$340. What could I do? I had to ship it. So I said yes. I'm still getting a \$200 tip from the buyer. So I ran my card and

left the building with my tail between my legs. I was so shell socked, I had to go next door to Crumbl Cookies and buy a 4-pack. While waiting for them to box the cookies up, I managed to muster the cringy Karenlike energy to go back and nicely ask the manger if he could confirm if the price was accurate. I felt like such an annoyance doing that, but I mean... \$340 to send one 8-pound UPS package. And... price confirmed. There is some magical line you cross when packages get bigger where the pricing flips into the upside-down and the world no longer makes rational sense.

I run Toys for Tots and I remember sending entire pallets of toys weighing 500 pounds or more for \$250. A whole pallet. (Update: Today I ordered a semi-electric straddle stacker... a small forklift of sorts, and shipping for that was \$257). This is one rather large box one person can carry. Am I on *Candid Camera* or something? Where's Allen Funt? Twenty-five years dead? Okay, it wasn't him. But I keep going back to it. What in the world?

I could have paid someone \$34 an hour to get in their car and drive, five hours there and five hours back, for the same money. I keep thinking now that I should have. Can the new upside-down world government coming in January put Elon Mosk on this issue? Maybe Trump will put Hulk Hogan in charge of whoever oversees private courier companies. I smell a conspiracy. Maybe that guy with the crazy hair who's seen aliens. I feel like I've just seen an alien.

And here you were all bent out of shape about \$4 eggs when this conspiracy was underfoot. Maybe the defence department set the shipping rates and I somehow stumbled on the secret rate that they usually use when they pay \$10,000 for toilets and \$2,000 for hammers. Okay, thanks for letting me rant.

However, what happens inside is extraordinary. Children who struggle with reading can come here for one-on-one tutoring and resources that can help them and their caregivers on their literacy journey.

A place like this didn't exist in Dubuque just a year ago. In fact, the services provided here weren't available within a 90-minute driving distance of Dubuque, creating an additional barrier for families already stressed about how to support their children outside of school.

The tutoring center is more than just a resource—it is a testament to the generosity of our community. Everything from the space itself to the office furniture to funding for tutor training is thanks to partnerships between nonprofits, gifts from donors, and volunteer time from individuals.

Our job at the Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque is to connect these generous community members with issues that people in our region face, which means we have a front row seat to our community

The Dubuque Food Pantry is serving more community members than ever. Each month during 2024, more than 2,200 individuals were served at the location. They also have almost 300 low-income senior community members who receive a monthly delivery.

Weekly hours for the general public are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday at 1–3:30 p.m. and Tuesday at 9–11:30 a.m. The pantry is closed on Thursdays, holidays, and weekends. Shoppers are allowed to choose items based on the size of their family. Each household is allowed to return in 39 days if needed. In order to help working families, there is an evening shop every second and fourth Monday of the month at 5–6:30 p.m.

The Dubuque Food Pantry receives donations of groceries and produce items throughout the year as well as monetary donations. A Top 10 list of supplies that are kept in stock at all times includes peanut butter, macaroni and cheese, soup and ramen noodles, cereal, canned vegetables, canned fruit, potato mixes, pasta, pasta sauces, and canned tuna and meat. They also include eggs, milk, meat, paper towel, and toilet

paper in every order, which need to be purchased with monetary donations.

The Dubuque Food Pantry has had many successful partnerships over the years including Scouting America and ECIA Realtors. Their annual appeal letter is sent out each year at Thanksgiving. People and organizations can donate through the Dubuque Food Pantry's website via PayPal or they can drop off or mail a check to the Dubuque Food Pantry. Many schools, businesses, and organizations do food drives throughout the year. Please call when you will deliver or need the pantry to pick up.

At the end of this school year, the Dubuque Food Pantry will have their third annual Launch into Summer Party on the last day of school. It's a great time for parents and children to get together with food and games. It's also a good time for the Dubuque Food Pantry to remind families that they are here for them.

The Dubuque Food Pantry appreciates all the support from their community supporters. With the continued generosity, they will be able to help those in need of good, nutritious food. ■

Resources Unite is a Dubuque-based nonprofit organization that serves as the resource and volunteer center of the Tri-State area. In short, there are two different types of people that walk through the front door each day. The first person is someone looking to volunteer and make an impact in our community. Resources Unite connects that individual, group, or organization to opportunities based on their interests and the needs of the community at any given time. The second person that stops by is the person that needs help. Roughly 20 people stop in each day looking for assistance with housing, utility assistance, food, addiction, abuse, and a variety of other reasons.

Although Resources Unite has a number of programs that help provide people with food, baby supplies, housing, and much more, their primary focus is building meaningful relationships with the people they serve. Resources Unite believes that if they can understand why someone needs help-what got someone into a position needing help—they can possibly help create a path that leads to independence.

For the past 12 years, Resources Unite has learned that the second week of November marks the beginning of their busiest time of the year, and it doesn't slow down until the new year. The weather begins to change, housing becomes even more difficult, holidays bring up mixed feelings for many, and parents worry

about having something under the Christmas tree for their children.

This is also the time of the year in which the witness absolute remarkable generosity that is unmatched throughout the rest of the year. Resources Unite recently started meeting with families needing help with Christmas, learning of a child's two needs and two wants. They then ask community members to shop for that respective child. For the past five years, Resources Unite has had just over 1,000 children on their Christmas list, which means someone in our community made sure that each child woke up to unwrap that new winter coat, snow boots, maybe some socks and underwear, and their favorite superhero or Barbie doll.

Resources Unite's Christmas program started years ago when the foster care system reached out, sharing that foster care parents often struggle during the holiday season. The system wanted to make sure all 99 foster care children in Dubugue and Jackson Counties at that time had what they needed during the holiday season. Not knowing where to start, Resources Unite went to Facebook and asked people to help. What happened next was inspiring, to say the least. Within three days, all 99 children were sponsored.

The Marine Toys for Tots Foundation provides toys and a tangible sign of hope to economically disadvantaged children at Christmas. Dubuque Toys for Tots is one of nearly 900 campaigns in America and annually recognized as one of the best run campaigns in the county.

The Dubuque campaign is notable for dedicating 97% of funds raised on the procurement of toys and books. Overhead costs and supplies are donated by generous local corporate benefactors so Toys For Tots can focus its funds directly on serving the kids.

The organization serves more than 5,000 Tri-State youth every Christmas in four counties. But the organization also works year-round to support

educational and community building efforts addressing the same populations that they serve during the holidays. This included donations of nearly \$1 million worth of books to Eastern Iowa schools and libraries since 2020 as well as prizes for library reading programs, community engagement events like National Night Out and the Dubuque Arboretum Spring Party, and more. The success of Dubuque Toys for Tots has allowed the group to expand beyond Christmas to work on supporting kids in the Dubuque area year-round.

And don't forget that 231 Coffee Bar is a BAR! They got your classic shots like the Cherry Bomb or the Salted Nut Roll. They've got your big-name beers in bottles with delightful craft beers on tap. They've got at least four different specialty Long Islands. They've got your frou-frou cocktails like an apple pie martini or the PB & J martini. Look folks, what I'm saying is it's a full bar. Anything's possible. And... I guess what I'm also saying is that if you want to put a shot

of another kind in your espresso drink, well... like I said, anything's possible.

Ultimately, though, I'm just saying that 231 Coffee Bar is just a helluva place to drink. Pretty chill atmosphere, too. KIND of hipster, but not DIRECTLY hipster, know what I mean? I don't know you, but I think you'd feel comfortable there.

I'm going to go ahead and talk about the bathrooms now because it's just the natural progression after talking about drinking. All clear on that front, friends. 231 is the place to be AND the place to pee. I'd feel comfortable doing a two-sie in the men's room. How many bars can you soberly say that about?

If slots are your thing, 231 does you happy there, too. Full disclosure: In my bill-paying life, I'm an advertising copywriter for a casino company, so I'm going to avoid any conflict of interest by doing my journalistic duty of telling you that 231 Coffee Bar has slots. This is a dining column anyway, right?

Oh yeah! Dining! I haven't talked about the food yet! Let's do that now.

As 231 Coffee Bar IS a bar, they got your bar food well covered.

Let's talk about their flatbreads, otherwise known as pizza shaped in a rectangle. We got the Carnivore flatbread. The one with all the usual pizza meat suspects. Pretty darn good. At one point I fumbled my slice and I lost all my toppings. Luckily, they landed on my plate, and even MORE luckily, the toppings stayed perfectly together. I just flopped the whole yummy mess back onto the flatbread and got back to business. I like the way 231 Coffee Bar cuts their flatbreads, too. They cut like a zig-zag of slants across the flatbread so that even though it's called flatbread, you still get pie-shaped slices.

As far as bar food goes, 231 Coffee Bar even throws together a garbage basket with... well... everything you want in an appetizer garbage basket. Chicken strips, fries, mini tacos, jalapeño poppers, onion rings, and cheese curds. I don't need to get too descriptive here because you know what a garbage basket is. 231 Coffee Bar's garbage basket is comfortingly familiar. there's no such thing as "authentic." No, not even for street tacos. Because unlike the garbage basket, the street tacos at 231 Coffee Bar are almost certainly NOT what you're picturing in your head. 

# The Serviceberry

Robin Wall Kimmerer, best selling author of Braiding Sweetgrass, has a new book. The Serviceberry: Abundance and Reciprocity in the Natural World is a greatly expanded version of Kimmerer's essay published in Emergence Magazine, enhanced with illustrations by John Burgoyne. If, by the time you're a quarter of the way through this slim volume. you're not searching out Amelanchier alnifolia in garden catalogs, I'll eat my hat. The timing is perfect, arriving at the beginning of the gift-giving season. It shows life as a succession of moments in which we receive gifts with gratitude—and a desire to return the favors.


If you've read *Sweetgrass*, you know how grounded Kimmerer is. A botanist of Native American heritage (of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation), her writing is not academic or complicated. She avoids using hyperbole and fancy flourishes for effect. A teacher, her goal is to be clear and readily understood. Yet, I wrote seven pages of notes and ruminations on this 100-page essay because she's just that thought-provoking.

Kimmerer lives in the same world we do, but it looks very different through her eyes. Immersed as she is in natural systems and a mutually supportive community, she conveys an ease and confidence in a world that is peopled with hoarders and cutthroat competition. She shows us an alternative and speaks to its allure. It's up to us to decide if and when to use it. What is an economy *supposed to do*, anyway? Make billionaires, or meet needs and foster a sense of belonging?

I wondered, as I read, if we could replace our destructive extractive economy with a sustainable gift economy. Kimmerer anticipated this reaction—we sometimes can see only the shortcomings of what's familiar and the strengths of its alternatives—and had a wise response ready:

"The question that's often asked is how do we take gift economies from individual relationships and scale them up? I have to say that I'm not sure that's the right question. Why does everything have to be expanded? It is the small scale and context that make the flow of gifts meaningful."

That takes the pressure off; we don't have to reinvent the entire economy. Most gift



economies are small and local. She invites us to notice how the gift economy already exists within the larger economy and how else we might use it to good effect. For example, her neighbors have a farm, which is their livelihood. But sometimes, when they have a bumper crop, they invite the neighbors over to help themselves.

Man, if you want a contrast to the way things are, this is it. If you yearn for a more neighborly and generous, less cynical and reflexively defensive, society—take heart! The seeds of such a world are already among us, sustaining us. We only need to receive and reciprocate on a small scale.

It would be easy to dismiss these beautifully composed observations as pale nostrums up against the hard, harsh realities of the real world dominated by capitalist go-getters. But "the violets in the mountains have broken the rocks," as Tennessee Williams said. Whereas our international economy requires gigantic infrastructure to sustain it, the gift economy will always endure, somewhere, among friends and neighbors. It simply perseveres.

Now, if you'll excuse me, I have to go give my copy to a friend. And you need to look up serviceberry in your garden catalogs. Yes, they grow here.

# Interior Painting in December

# Tips and Considerations
