





Dubuque **County Business Competition** Deadline **MONDAY, JANUARY 6**

For the second consecutive year, ambitious entrepreneurs will have an avenue to help launch their business or help it grow. The Dubuque County Business Competition, organized by The Innovation Lab and powered by Dupaco Credit Union, is set to bring together startups, existing businesses, funders, and mentors under one roof, providing a unique opportunity for them to kickstart or scale their ventures.

Entrepreneurs will be selected from applications to participate in the competition taking place on Feb. 6, 2025. Each participating entrepreneur will receive \$250 in seed funding, and an additional \$20,000 in funding will be awarded to

help fuel business growth. In addition, each participant will have the invaluable opportunity to gain insights from industry experts who will help them refine their strategies and fine-tune their pitches, giving their business ideas the best possible chance of success in the competition.

The competition will start with a Funding Fair on February 6 at 5 p.m. where the finalists will each have a booth to display their business information and concepts. Attendees will listen to pitches from each business and vote for their favorite concept. A panel of expert judges will also listen to and score pitches. The businesses that garner the top five judges' scores will be selected to pitch at the live pitch event. The business that generates the most crowd votes also earns a spot in the live pitch event.

Six finalists will take the stage at 6:30 p.m. to deliver their compelling 5-minute pitches to the crowd. Their pitches will be evaluated by a panel of expert judges with the top three businesses receiving seed funding of \$10,000 for first place, \$5,000 for second place, and \$2,750 for third place.

Sun Tea

What if I told you that some of the best fried chicken in the Tri-States doesn't come from a Colonel, a sailor man, or a supper club? What if I told you it doesn't come from a place typically known for fried chicken at all? What if I told you it came from a boba tea shop?

Actually, you'd probably believe it. I mean... you tell me. Do you believe it? Probably. Because if there's one thing we can all agree on as humans, it's that fried chicken is friggin' delicious. I mean, look at us. If there's a culture that doesn't have a comfort food recipe for fried chicken, it's probably because that culture doesn't have a lot of chicken. But that doesn't mean their poultry is paltry. If they don't have chicken, they probably have an analog of chicken to fry up good. And so, it should be no surprise that Korea (specifically South Korea, for reasons I'm not qualified to discuss) has a pretty rich fried chicken tradition.

That's where the boba tea comes into play. And that's where Sun Tea Boba Tea Shop comes into play.

Korean boba or bubble tea generally means milk tea with chewy tapioca pearls, but you can pick from a variety of toppings such as popping boba (think balls of juice that "pop" when you bite them), flavored jellies, and red bean. Not everybody likes boba tea. I'll cop to being one of those people. Texture thing. But if there's someone who doesn't like fried chicken, I haven't met them. Even vegans and vegetarians, even though they don't eat meat, would likely agree that the taste of fried chicken is delicious. They just choose not to partake.

Before WE partake, let's talk about the vibe of Sun Tea Boba Tea Shop. It's very cheerful but not cloyingly sweet. It's a cool hang with a positive feel. A feel that includes a mystery. Sun Tea sets out sticky notes with markers to make a little note or piece of art and stick it to the wall. Our own Kristina Nesteby has far more experience with boba tea shops than I do, and she swears that she's seen boba tea shops throughout the country that do this same thing. Like, it's a part of boba tea culture. But I can't find anything online that talks about it. I asked someone who works at Sun Tea about it, and as far as they knew, it was just something they do to engage the community. Maybe Kristina's lying? I don't know. In any case, one of the cool things you get to do at Sun Tea is draw your muscle-memory drawing of Bulbasaur and stick it to the wall. Or a note asserting your only half-kidding

belief that birds aren't real. Or that boobs are good. It's a living meme wall. Enjoy.

The bathroom? It's labeled All-Gender, I'm happy to say. If that pisses you off because you suck, then take comfort in the fact that it's just a single-occupancy bathroom. Whatever you're afraid of won't happen. So take comfort. Take comfort in that and then die. In any case, the bathroom is clad in all white and therefore easy to tell that it's clean. I didn't have to go, so I didn't put it to a full test, but I'd definitely go boom-boom there. Ok. food.

What sets Korean fried chicken apart from the fried chicken we're familiar with here in the United States? It kinda depends. Usually, KFC (not the Colonel kind) has a lighter coating and is double fried for double crunch. And here in the states, you're probably getting a once-fried thicker batter. Both delicious. Both acceptable. When it comes to fried chicken though, most cultures

eventually figure out the same thing. Seasonings traditionally available might vary by culture, but most eventually land on breading or battering cuts of chicken and then frying them to crisp, greasy-gold perfection.

So what would be a good comparison for Sun Tea Boba Tea Shop's fried chicken? Breading-wise, I would say it's most similar to a certain extra-crispy restaurant. But texture is where the similarities stop. If there's one thing more universal than fried chicken, it's sauces. I mean, duh. Nobody is unique for saying, "Hey, I bet it tastes good when I slather this on that." That's at least 65% of all culinary history. But while you might expect a tangy barbecue or a mild sauce with the fried chicken, you forget that you're messing with Korean fried chicken. You can get just their basic-but-not-in-a-basicway Original Korean Fried Chicken and be perfectly satisfied that it's a suitable chicken dinner. You can turn things up a little by ordering the Salt & Pepper Fried Chicken, which is just what it sounds like. From there you can quickly get into some Korean flavor profiles like Sweet & Spicy. Or Hot & Spicy. Or Garlic Honey. And it's so friggin' good. Amazing, really. Again, some of the best in the Tri-States. Again, from a boba tea shop.

There's yet another surprise about this fried chicken served up delicious and hot out of a (checking my notes again to make sure it's not a mistake...) boba tea shop. We ordered the boneless fried chicken. Boneless made sense for us at the time, but there's bone-in, too. So I expected our boneless chicken to be something similar to a chicken tender off the Sysco truck. Whatever. It's a classic for a reason. But no. It wasn't a chicken tender. It wasn't white meat at all. It was a boneless chicken thigh! Now... my world has changed for the better since my dark-meat-loving butt discovered that boneless chicken thighs were commonly available. I haven't seen that love reflected on restaurant menus. Until now. It's what chicken tenders would be if the tenders came from the bottom half of the chicken.

Detour to tell you about the bubble waffles served at Sun Tea. I hadn't heard of these before. But you can waffle me anywhere, and I'll be happy. Had to try it. What is it for those of you as ignorant as I was? You know how your typical waffles have like a... well, a waffle pattern? Bubble waffles are what would happen if the pattern fluffed out instead of dented in. It's essentially a reverse waffle. And cuz we got the brown sugar bubble waffle, we found tapioca pearls in it, but in a waffle, it's just like blueberries. No texture issue for me at all. I have to tell you, it's fun to eat. You kind of pull the bubbled portions apart like monkey bread and eat it piece-by-piece. Dust some powdered sugar on it, and I'd be ready to walk around the county fair.

I took that detour to tell you this: If you combine the Korean fried chicken with the bubble waffle... you have yourself Korean chicken and waffles. And you can't tell me that doesn't sound good. Because I know for a fact, it does. As of this writing, Sun Tea doesn't have chicken and waffles on their menu. But Sun Tea is one of the best places around to get chicken and waffles. I said what I said.

We also tried Sun Tea's Korean fried chicken in sandwich form.

Everybody has their opinion on the best chicken sandwich around. You'll likely find me in Sun Tea's corner.

I haven't said a word about Sun Tea's Korean corn dogs. Oh! Do I have your attention? Picture corn dogs that don't just have a cornmeal breading on them. Picture them also breaded in Flaming Hot Cheetos. Or French fries. Or even sweet potato fries. And try to picture that it might not be an all-beef frank that Sun Tea uses, but a friggin' stick of mozzarella cheese. Like a string cheese. Now imagine that this "corn dog" has both all-beef frank AND cheese. I know it's not difficult to imagine. You've probably dreamed of it. I've had the same dreams. I'm here to tell you that our dreams have come true. The corndogs are a meal in itself, so don't expect much room for other things.

What other things? How about I talk about the crab rangoons? Look, it's an Asianinspired restaurant in the Midwest. They're practically required by law to serve crab rangoons. They are definitely worth the order. The wonton wrapper looks like it's going to be thick, hard, and pokey on your soft palate, but the crispiness gives way easily. Delicious. A little on the sweet side, but not as sweet as other crab rangoons 'round here.

In fact, Sun Tea's fried food game in general is strong, even with the butterfly shrimp. Light and crisp. Not rubbery at all. Bursting on your tongue. I tell you, if they have any Lenten specials coming up, they could finally make the Tri-States forget all about the loss of Long John Silvers so long ago.

Good vibes and good food at Sun Tea. Go there, give it a try, and put a fun sticky note on the wall. ■

Sweet Potato and Beet Chips MAKES 8 SERVINGS

All You Need:

- 1/4 cup Hy-Vee Select olive oil
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 teaspoon chopped fresh rosemary
- 1 teaspoon lemon zest
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon Hy-Vee black pepper
- 2 medium sweet potatoes, 6 to 8 oz each
- 2 medium beets, 6 oz each

All You Do:

- Position oven racks on the center and top tier in the oven. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line 2 large baking sheets with parchment paper; set aside.
- In a small bowl, combine olive oil, garlic, rosemary, lemon zest, kosher salt and pepper; set aside.
- Peel sweet potatoes and beets; cut into ¼₆-inch slices using a mandolin or sharp knife. Arrange slices in one layer on prepared baking sheets. Brush the tops of the slices with the olive oil mixture.
- 4. Bake for 30 minutes, rotating baking sheets after 15 minutes. Turn slices over and brush with the remaining olive oil mixture.
- Bake for 15 to 30 minutes more or until golden and crisp, rotating baking sheets and turning slices over as needed.
- 6. Cool chips on a wire rack. Store in an airtight container for up to 3 days.

- Bake 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes. Spread on paper towels to cool for about 15 minutes. Stir in optional add-ins. Store in an airtight container at room temperature.



The Bright Sword

Sometimes, you need a long story in which to lose yourself and forget the mess of the world. Lev Grossman's new best seller, The Bright Sword, perfectly fits the bill. As readers of his Magicians trilogy well know, Grossman has the pacing and focus necessary to bring a long, interesting trip to a satisfying conclusion. Former Dubuquer George R.R. Martin gave The Bright Sword a rave endorsement.

Collum, a young, ambitious lad of uncertain parentage, travels to Camelot to fulfill his dream of being found worthy to join the knights of the Round Table. For all his virtues, he has one flaw: bad timing. Camelot is adrift, its most glorious knights scattered. Not much remains but the table itself. Collum imagined fitting into a certain storyline with certain players-Lancelot, Guinevere, Merlin, Morgan le Fay, and Arthur. He wanted to continue the story's glorious arc. not to improvise. Who is he. to help create Camelot's next chapter?

Grossman's story is symphonic, rich in overall effect, melding strong individual components into major themes. As the tale unfolds, he sometimes inserts backstories of the new major players. These tales within the tale show their characters, histories, and relationships with the world in which they are steeped. It is a new world

that they must navigate. This isn't the world they expected. It's just ... life. Regular life. But with witches, gods, grails, enemies and friendships—all the stuff of magic.

Principalities and powers beyond their control challenge our heroes to reveal or change themselves. There are political rivalries between kings and their heirs. The influences of long-gone empires continue to be felt. As in every Arthurian tale, the spiritual and magical worlds make promises and demand loyalties and sacrifices. This remains a world hosting the war between the Christian and old gods. Who is guiding events, to what end?

In short, this remains Camelot: a tale rich with secrets, quests, heroes' journeys, death, and glory. There are blessings and curses here-and it's not always clear which is which. Individuals seek or assert their identities, as a kingdom seeks its own. Was Camelot ever what it seemed?

Was it really flawless and shiny? Was it a good faith effort by flawed people trying to serve high ideals? What does its next chapter hold, after le morte d'Arthur? With apologies to Langston Hughes-Let Camelot be Camelot again (it never was Camelot to me)?

Treat yourself or a friend to this quest. Stay a while. Have some mead. You can linger here, with good companions seeking the means to make the world as magic and good as its promise. This is a different Round Table, Camelot, and Arthur. In an afterword, Grossman provides a justification for taking liberties with the story. It has always been so: Camelot changes as we need it to. It may ask us to reciprocate. "It's like Bedivere said, we're in a

new world now. We must divine its nature. And we must show it that our own nature has not changed."

Now where is Sir Kay? I need a horse, and armor! By all the gods and gremlins, I have stuff to do!







My Tribe

My cousin Bob died on Nov. 11, only fitting for a Navy veteran. He was my last cousin on my Dad's side, and boy, was it a loss.

I wasn't the only girl cousin to have a crush on Bob. He could have been the big brother I always wanted—someone to keep the creepy guys away, take me fishing, teach me to drive. But his family lived on the other side of town, and we mostly saw them on holidays.

I wrote about Bob and his sister Sue just last month, in my column begging for someone to teach me to swim. (Still waiting!) Bob was the one zipping around the lake on water skis and swimming across the lake, one memorable day. His sister Sue followed in a boat, just in case, but we knew he'd be just fine.

Bob joined the Navy after high school, serving almost four years as an electrician's mate aboard the USS Coral Sea and the USS Hunterdon County in the waters off Hong Kong, Australia, Hawaii, Guam, the Philippines, Midway, and Vietnam. Whenever he came home on leave, his parents flew a flag they'd made declaring "BOB IS HOME" in big letters, so neighbors and friends knew they could visit.

In 1970, he married his best friend, Sarah, who was also his sister's best friend. She was already a part of the family, coming to Lake Ada many years. Bob taught their two girls everything he would have if they'd been boys—fishing, hunting, and taking care of nature. My dad was an outdoorsman, too. I wonder if Bob's family grew up eating not only venison but squirrels, rabbit, and pheasants, like we did? We all feasted on fish at the lake.

I hadn't seen my cousin for decades. A career telephone man, he moved to Mason City long ago. But we wrote emails, especially when I began constructing our family tree on Ancestry. When I grew frustrated with the dearth of information about our Grandpa Kress—who had been placed in an orphanage right here in Dubuque after his mother died—Bob sent me everything he had, including the funeral registry. What a gift that was.

Sarah's Christmas letters held news of their kids, their grandkids, and Bob's failing health. It was hard to imagine this hale and hearty—not to mention handsome—man growing debilitated first by diabetes, which had killed his sister, then by Parkinson's and cancer. Fate can be so arbitrary, and so unkind.

At the funeral, we learned that Bob had been the lifeblood of his church, serving as a deacon and elder and, most importantly, at the head of the Building and Grounds team. A eulogist recalled how Bob changed the bulbs in the dizzyingly high chandeliers. Not afraid of heights in the least, he would lay a board over the pews, place a ladder over the board, and climb on up. Putting up the lights on the family's tall pine tree was just as easy.

My family tree used to have five cousins on Dad's side. Four died of diseases, and one was murdered by her husband who also killed himself. One—Bob's sister Sue—died too young of her lifelong diabetes, but not until she disobeyed her doctor's orders and had a daughter, Amy. I follow Amy and her sons on Facebook, but it was a comfort to hug her at the church.

I feel like the last person standing, but of course I'm not. Nearly everyone on this branch has children—15, counting my own. Amy is the only one I know, but it's good to remember all the others out there. I know I could walk up to any of them, should fate bring us together one day, introduce myself, and receive a joyful smile and probably, a hug.

That's what happened at the visitation. I had already sent a message to Sarah, letting her know that my Bob and I would be there, and she responded, "Awesome!" As the line shortened and she spotted me, it was glorious to hug her, and to be hugged back. A hug is an amazing thing, you know? Holding a person you care for and being held in return. After we talked for a moment, she turned to a group of people nearby and said, "Hey guys! This is, um, this is Bob's—oh, this is Pam Kress!"

My heart was full. I knew why I had come. I was with my tribe, and they knew who I was by just my name, even if we'd never met. Her daughters hugged me and pointed out their own kids with pride, and I felt deeply welcomed.

Finally, I turned to Amy for a hug and saw an older man eying me quizzically. This was Harry, her father, who had married Bob's sister Sue so long ago. She had died when Amy was just a child, and a year after Sue's death, Harry went missing. He was in what psychologists call a fugue state, lost in his thoughts and unaware of his identity. Two weeks later, he turned up in Texas, okay and just starting to remember who he was. He is fine now, remarried, and as funny as ever. I reminded him of how he sang at his wedding to Sue, and he groaned and said my Aunt Louise has made him do it. But it was lovely.

I wore my heart locket to the funeral, a gift when I was young. Long ago, I had placed tiny photos of my mom and dad, lona and Harold Kress. I wanted them to be there, too. They were there in spirit, with our family. Family is everything.
