Town Clock Plaza is alive and well! Man, I spent time there the last two days, and each day impressed me in completely different ways.

As a Life Member of the Dubuque Jaycees, you can bet that I've got a few editions of Dubuque Main Street's Dubuque... and All That Jazz! under my belt. I was young, less sore, and active in the group in the late 1990s and early 2000s, which were the peak years for the venerable Dubuque festival series. Back then. believe it or not, there were far fewer outdoor live music festivals in Dubuque, and "Jazz" was the envy-worthy mother of them all, in my book. Thousands of people packed Town Clock Plaza four times a summer to see great live music with friends while pouring through thousands (and thousands) of dollars worth of cold Budweiser products. This was also back when Budweiser had about four flavors to sell. All, the simpler days! As a Jaycee, we sold and poured all of that beer and also helped to setup and manage a lot of the festival in partnership with Dubuque Main Street. Ah, the memories.

In the last 10 year or more, with so much competition and options on just about any Friday night of the summer, that festival got smaller and smaller. Eventually, to try to reinvigorate it, they changed the name to Music on Main Street. But it didn't work. So this year, they reverted to the old playbook and put all the chips on one singular edition of "Dubuque & All That Jazz," bringing back a longtime favorite band, The Business. And man, did it ever work! It felt like old times. Well done Main Street. The crowd was huge, the vibe was fantastic, and the beers were flowing (but still not like we used to crank 'em out in the day). Still, everyone involved should be proud and thrilled about the success! The old girl is back. I've not seen so much fun activity in Town Clock Plaza in some time.

And then there was Saturday. The very next day. Town Clock Plaza served as the new home of the Dubuque Pride Festival. And just hours after Jazz, I was blown away a second time in two days with what I saw and experienced. I've been to the Pride festival the last couple of years down by the Multicultural Family Center, and it was great. But this was next level. Wow! Just WOW! It was HUGE. Three full city blocks, from 5th to 8th on Main Street, were lined with great booths from area businesses and organizations, all supporting and celebrating the rights of every American, every human being, to be who they are, live happily, and love who they love. I was stunned at just how many participating groups there were represented.


So many Dubuque area churches were there in loving support, and it just makes your heart happy to see it. And all of the private business, including some of Dubuque biggest businesses and employers, proud to stand up and publicly resist that wave of oppression against LGBTQ+ individuals' basic human rights that has happened of late. There's been so much hate from voices on high that you almost get to thinking that people really feel that way. That is, until you get to events like this and realize that those who harbor those thoughts and undertake those actions are NOT the majority. Even if they might be in control right now and hold the microphone that the world hears when "America" speaks from its official soapbox, they are not speaking on behalf of the overwhelmingly vast majority of Americans who just want their neighbors and friends to be happy and live their lives with all of the legal and governmental protections as the rest of is.

The streets were busy with families and allies learning and experiencing aspects of culture that they might not be part of on a daily basis. And they were loving it. The stage under the clock, runway and all, featured music, dancers, and performances that celebrate LGBTQ+. Rainbows, stickers, costumes, freshly screen-printed T-shirts, food, and more were all around you. And the faces of our community and elected leaders happily showing their obvious support of something that is so easy for most people to understand and get behind.

And, while it's the last thing you want to bring up, realizing that as much joy and love that was filling the streets, I could not help but notice the specialized vehicle barricades placed at the entrances to the festival area where cars could enter. Because, after all, the reason for this event is to combat unwarranted hate, false narratives, and violent consequences of being publicly queer in 2025 that are all too real. Not often do you go to a party so filled with love and have to realistically take into consideration that there are people out there who want to hurt you for doing so, even as low as that probability may be. Still, there it is, a stark reminder of what the purpose of filling this wonderful public space with activity on a Saturday afternoon is all about.

My sparkly, multicolored hats off to the organizers who took a great event and elevated it to what might be the biggest collection of community groups in one space at any event all year. Not just a great day, but a great way to utilize Town Clock Plaza as the epicenter of our community's identity, to point out that we are all part of this community.

Happy Pride Month from all of us at 365ink. And also happy 4th of July to you all as we celebrate the freedoms that make us equal and make us Americans. May freedom reign... for all! ■







The annual Dubuque Independence Day celebration takes place, as always, in AY McDonald Park next to the Hawthorne Boat Ramp just below Lock and Dam No. 11. As you make your way down to show center, be sure to be apprised of traffic issues that may arise due to construction taking place at the end of Kerper Blvd.

This year's fireworks spectacular and air demonstration is dedicated to the men and women of our Armed Forces—Army, Navy, Marines, Air Force, Coast Guard, National Guard, Reserves—and to our "local" heroes—our firefighters, EMS personnel, and police force. Special recognition will also be given to members of our local units who were called to active duty during Operation Iraqi Freedom. Members of these units will be a part of our Color Guard. During the Presentation of the Colors, the names of Tri-State personnel who made the ultimate

sacrifice during operations in Iraq and Afghanistan will be read in memorial.

Stop by the Radio Dubuque broadcast tent and receive your free American Flag. As you enjoy the air demonstration, wave your American Flag proudly. The pilots who make this show happen cannot hear our thunderous applause, but they will be able to see you waving to them.

Salute to our Heroes Air Show

The Salute to our Heroes Air Show begins at 5:45 p.m. (subject to change) and runs until approximately 8:30 p.m. This year's air show highlights are tentatively scheduled to include Bill Walsh announcing the Window World All Veteran Group parachute team, Vanguard Squadron, and Heritage Flight which consists of a P-51 Mustang and an Air Force F-35/P, Galen Killam Air Shows, Britt Lincoln Aerobatics, and Craig Gifford Power and Precision. And, Perry Mason at Radio Dubuque tells us he has his fingers crossed for a surprise if logistics work out. We have our fingers crossed too! If you're wondering where the Golden Knights are, they were not able to come this year, but fear not, for the All Veteran Group that is coming has a nickname... "The Olden Knignts." That's right, most of these professional jumpers are retired

Golden Knights with vast experience. Most of them have jumped here for the fireworks in the past, including very recently. So the uniforms will be different, but the skills carry on as does the quality of the show.

Then, the fireworks light up the sky around dusk (approximately 9:45 p.m.) over the Mississippi River.

Traffic and Construction

The City of Dubuque is encouraging residents and visitors attending the annual air show and fireworks to plan for traffic and delays in the event area, especially after the event. That statement is nothing new, but this year has some new considerations.

Several construction projects in the area will require new detour routes and are expected to cause longer-than-usual traffic delays. Attendees are urged to be patient and cautious as event organizers and the Dubuque Police Department work to facilitate safe and efficient traffic flow before, during, and after the event.

The most significant traffic change this year is the closure of the southbound on-ramp to U.S. Highways 61/151 from Kerper Blvd. This is due to an lowa Department of Transportation bridge deck overlay project which will continue through August. Southbound traffic from Kerper to US 61/151 will instead be detoured to the on-ramp at E. 9th St.

Additionally, the southbound lanes of Kerper Blvd. near the 16th St. Detention Basin are closed due to a flood gate replacement project. In that area, traffic in both directions is reduced to a single lane of head-to-head traffic with southbound vehicles shifted into one of the usual northbound lanes.

Closer to the airs how and fireworks site, an additional portion of Kerper Blvd. also has a reduced traffic pattern due to construction of the Kerper Blvd. Sanitary Lift Station. Between the Roosevelt St. Extension and the Shiras Ave. Extension, northbound Kerper Blvd. traffic is being shifted into one of the usual southbound lanes.

Following the fireworks, vehicle traffic will be held in place for at least 30 minutes to allow pedestrians to depart the area as always. Police will direct southbound vehicle traffic leaving the area to both available lanes of Kerper Blvd. The traffic pattern will return to normal south of the Roosevelt St. Extension.

As in past years, Fengler St. will also be closed to vehicular traffic between Kerper Blvd. and Garfield Ave. following the fireworks. Pedestrians may still use the Fengler St. Bridge.

Vehicle access to the Shiras Ave. Extension will be significantly restricted, and those wishing to visit the area are encouraged to travel by pedestrian means.

Mud Lake Bluegrass Sundays Returns

July 6, July 20, and August 3 Mud Lake Park (22312 Golf Lake Rd)

The Mud Lake Music Society in partnership with the Friends of Dubuque County Conservation announce the return of the Mud Lake Bluegrass Sundays series for 2025. Promoted by the Dubuque County Conservation Board, this popular event draws music performers from all around the country and began as an effort to bring bluegrass music to an outdoor setting by the Mississippi River at Mud Lake Park.

The Mud Lake Music Society has presented more than 30 groups and countless individual performers, for audiences up to 2,000 per show!

"We started Mud Lake Bluegrass Sundays with three things in mind: family, music, and the Mississippi River," says organizer Jim Zmudka of the series. "People really love it." Zmudka, a Dubuque native, worked in Nashville as the agent for the legendary Bill Monroe, the "Father of Bluegrass Music," and has promoted the popular series since its inception. "It's the perfect picnic atmosphere, and with all we've been through lately, we need more picnics!"

With a focus on audience involvement, each event kicks off with the Pickers Pick-nic starting at noon and going until 2 p.m. It's the perfect setting to meet and play with other aspiring pickers. Guest instructors help with tuning, answer questions, and then organize the jam sessions.

Then at 2 p.m., the main stage fires up with a regional opening act (except on July 6) followed by a national touring act at 3:30 p.m., entertaining until approximately 6 p.m.

"The Friends of Dubuque County Conservation are very supportive of our efforts to put these shows together," notes Zmudka. "Their goal is to educate and promote to people, all the activities and opportunities available at our county parks." Asking attendees only for freewill donations, the society's goal is to raise enough money to cover costs and retain a small fund to continue Mud Lake Bluegrass Sundays the next year.

Camping spaces are available at Mud Lake Park, along with food concessions from Catfish Charlies and some other local vendors as well as special Mud Lake Bluegrass souvenirs (shirts, instrument raffles). No alcohol is served, but visitors may bring their own coolers, and it is recommended that people bring lawn chairs. Attendees are also encouraged to bring their own instruments and participate in the free music clinics prior to main stage acts.

Information on the musicians is available at **facebook.com/mudlakebluegrass**. Look them up and give them a listen. The series features a super lineup this year. Don't miss a show!



THREE SQUARE MEALS OF BREAKFAST, LUNCH/DINNER, AND DESSERT KOLACHES FROM SOUR JOE'S KOLACHES

Sour Joe's

After playing hookie from work to go see a 3-hour long Tom Cruise movie one day, I was planning to stop and grab a sub on the way to, um, "work," when I was stopped at the light in front of PetSmart on JFK and looked over and saw a food truck I'd never seen before. With my gazelle-like reflexes, as Rick Dickinson would say, I changed my plans and pulled in to see what was cookin'... literally. It's my job after all, right? I do it all for you!

With only a small menu sign next to the open serving window on the red trailer, I had to get close to see that it was called Sour Joe's food truck, and they were serving kolaches. If there's anything I love more than finding a new food truck, it's finding one that is serving up things no one else is. I'm in!

It was 3 p.m. The 11:45 a.m. movie was Illoonnnggg, man (but good). So there was no line at this off-peak time. I strolled

up to the window to see what the story was and met Sour Joe himself (right) waiting to serve me. Joe Loeffelholz, an East Dubuque, IL native who now lives in Galena, thought his love



of what he called "Texas kolaches" would be shared by people like you and me. He first had them when he was doing commercial HVAC work in Denver and found that, as a hard working guy, a dozen of the little kolaches they were serving up down there were the perfect food to start his day. Delicious, easy to eat, even on the go, and sharable in a pinch. So now we get to see what it was he liked so much about them.

Technically a kolache is a Czech and Slovak term meaning cake or pie, a type of sweet pastry that holds a portion of fruit surrounded by puffy yeast dough. A klobasnek is the word for a kolach filled with other fillings, usually savory, and is chiefly an American Czech savory finger food. Klobasneks are much more commonly known as kolaches in Texas. Klobasneks have become a significant element of Texan culture and can be found everywhere from gas stations to specialized kolache shops throughout the state, even outside areas with large Czech Texan populations. This has been my TED Talk.

Sour Joe's kolache offerings run the gamut, including breakfast, lunch/dinner, and dessert-filled versions. Each starts with the same dough ball, baked fresh in the trailer, and stuffed with delicious flavors to get you through your morning, lunch, or dinner. Or, I would think, the perfect food to share with friends at an event in the Tri-States.

Being a thorough sort of journalist, I told him to make me one of everything, so very close to a zen "make me one with everything" joke, but no cigar. He had some ready to go, so my wait was non-existent. For the sake of some photos, he even cut them open for me so you could see inside. But even then, the insides do not come spilling out when I picked up halves to enjoy. So I would think biting into a closed one would be even easier.

The menu featured two breakfast kolaches, a breakfast sausage and gravy version (think biscuits and gravy turned inside out, or is that outside in?) There was also a bacon, egg, and cheese with hollandaise sauce version. Both were very tasty.

I told him later that I might have liked a little salsa or sour cream to accent, but the flavors were great as is. I was just thinking of adding even more moisture to it. But no complaints here. Just looking to take a very new offering to even higher heights.

The lunch/dinner offerings included a cheeseburger kolache that I swear tasted like all the best things about a burger. All the elements were there in this magic little ball. What I expected to be the most basic kolache was probably my favorite, with a ton of flavor. The Italian beef and cheese was just as advertised, and all of these items feature locally-sourced beef from Mulgrew Meats just outside of East Dubuque. And if you are looking for savory but avoiding the meat, look no further than the cream cheese spinach and artichoke kolache to satisfy your taste buds.

And you could also just skip to dessert with either the strawberry or blueberry cheesecake kolaches. A dollop of cream cheese and a dollop of pie filling hiding inside that lovely golden brown baked bread shell. How can you go wrong?

As for the kolaches, the lovely little things are \$3.99 each, and I highly suggest going for the mix-and-match three for \$10.99 special. For a big hunger, I'd double up and go for six, but three will cover most appetites. You might go for two savory entree options and cap it off with a dessert or just get three of the same thing if you find a favorite. But how do you choose?

I love the idea of this new local option, and I think he will do especially well the more festivals he can get to. I know Sour Joe's was at Kickoff to Summer at Q Casino + Resorts' Back Waters Stage already, so you might see him at the other local events there this year too. I posted my photos to Facebook, and someone

from the Dubuque Arboretum & Botanical Gardens' Music at the Park commented to say they wanted him there. So the demand is out there. You just need to keep your eyes peeled for his little red trailer. Or hey, how about you just follow them on Facebook @sourjoesfoodtruck. And, you know, tell Joe that Bryce sent ya!



Is a River Alive?

Is a River Alive?, the new book by Robert Macfarlane, poses more searching questions than just the one in the title. (Macfarlane has won too many awards to list; I only have 550 words!) Some are explicit, some implied. But this is not an ivory tower inquiry. He leads us to these questions the way a person who has seen war or survived a tsunami does. We are reminded that many questions are easily answered in the abstract. The challenge emerges when they overwhelm us.

Starting in his own backyard, with his children, he explores the source of a local stream that is in danger of being buried, paved over, and forgotten. Or killed, whether you understand that as a literal or metaphorical fact—as many rivers have been since the Industrial Revolution. He sets himself a quest, seeking out endangered rivers and local guides and guardians who know them. He hikes in Ecuador, where a river may be sacrificed to the mining industry. To India, where the river has been drowned in industrial and household waste. And to Canada, where rivers have been pinned down like Gulliver, for electricity. He vividly portrays his guides, each of whom is navigating a grief in their personal lives, in addition to their battles for these rivers. He is a learned man-you may want to keep a dictionary within reach—but fearless and

not blinded by hubris. His books come from living. They aren't a substitute for it.

Some of the best questions are sneaky. You ask if a river is alive. But before you can answer or defend your answer, you have to define river and life. You sense that the question, and its implications, are far more complex than you suspected. If you ask what it would take to really answer those questions, you'll understand why Macfarlane went trekking and kayaking. You may remember the books of Barry Lopez and Peter Matthiessen. You may remember that you, yourself, live next to one of the world's great rivers. If you inquire into the health of the Mississippi and go to the National Mississippi River Museum & Aquarium for the first time in ages, good. If you wonder about the role played by rivers in history and myth—the first story, the Epic of Gilgamesh, makes multiple appearances here—in different cultures; if you wonder how other societies, especially indigenous people, have lived with their rivers; if you wonder about how we use "our" rivers, and what protections they have or need. Then you may awaken to a sense that we depend on these entities, and that we should be careful about their welfare, because they also depend on us not to abuse them. Or kill them.

"Cities grow along riversides, then slowly forget their ecological, hydrological genesis. Later they slowly collapse under their own weight—unless perhaps there is a powerful re-invocation of what birthed a city in the first place: a river."

Good questions, like life, sometimes insist on being answered in person. They won't be answered unless we have skin in the game. Canada's Mutehekau Shipu River ("the river who flows between square, rocky cliffs") heard Macfarlane's question and asked one of its own: "Are you?"

The answer to the title is, of course, Yes. Now ask yourself what that means.

A Gift to Your Future Self

Why Starting with the Why Makes Change Stick

Change is hard. Always has been, always will be. Most of us resist it—sometimes loudly, sometimes silently. We get comfortable. We settle into habits and routines that feel safe, even when they're not helping us. But here's the truth: If you want to grow, improve, and live a better life, change is required. And the best way to make change stick is to start with the why.

In his bestselling book *Start with Why*, Simon Sinek explains that great leaders and successful organizations don't begin with what they do or even how they do it. They begin with why. Your why is your purpose, your cause, your belief. It's the reason you get out of bed in the morning. When it comes to personal or professional change, understanding your why is what turns a difficult decision into a powerful direction.

And when you commit to that kind of change—motivated by a strong why—you're giving a gift to someone very important: your future self.

Let's say you want to lose weight, get stronger, or feel better. That's the what. The how might be joining a gym, walking the dog more, or drinking less soda. But if you don't have a strong why, those habits probably won't last. If your why is, "Because my doctor said I should," you might hang on for a few weeks. But if your why is, "I want to be alive and active for my kids' weddings," or "I want to wake up feeling good instead of groggy," that gives your efforts purpose.

A shift in attitude makes the difference. If you see movement as punishment, it will always feel like work. But if you see exercise as investing in your future energy, mobility, and joy—then it becomes a gift. Every time you show up, you're helping the version of you that will exist in 6 months, 1 year, or 10 years.

Workplaces change constantly. New policies, new software, new leadership. And what's the most common reaction? Resistance. Eye rolls. Grumbling in the break room. I once worked with a company that was introducing a new software system. Employees were frustrated. It felt like a waste of time. They didn't see the point and were convinced the old system worked just fine. But once we clearly explained that the new software would eliminate duplicated tasks, reduce data errors, and free up time for more important work—people came around. When the why was clear, attitudes shifted.

As Sinek says, "People don't buy what you do; they buy why you do it." That doesn't just apply to business. It applies to change. When the purpose behind a change makes sense, people can get behind it—even if it's uncomfortable at first.

Change starts in your head before it shows up in your habits. A negative attitude sees change as a threat. A positive attitude sees it as a challenge—or even better, an opportunity. If you face change with crossed arms and closed eyes, you'll likely stay stuck. But if you lean in with a curious mind and a hopeful heart, you unlock the possibility of something better. And better is what your future self is counting on.

What's Your Why?

Before you try to change anything—your health, your job, your habits—pause and ask yourself: Why am I doing this? Make it honest. Make it matter. Tape it to your mirror or your fridge. Keep it close.

Because change isn't about becoming someone else—it's about becoming a better version of yourself. And when you lead with why and stay committed with the right attitude, you're doing something powerful: You're giving tomorrow's you a better shot at success.

So go ahead-make the change. Your future self will thank you.






300: Social Sciences

This week in my volunteer shelfreading adventure at Carnegie-Stout Public Library, I've been traveling through the 300s, a section that ranges all over the social sciences, from anthropology and political science to economics, law, and, yes, etiquette. Every kind of social institution is covered here—criminal law, military science, adult education, inland water transportation, and all kinds of customs, from the respectable to the loony. Today's books are from 306 (Culture and Institutions) and 323 (Civil and Political Rights). Fascinating!

306.9 EHR Natural Causes: An Epidemic of Wellness, The Certainty of Dying, and Killing Ourselves to Live Longer, by Barbara Ehrenreich


The author of a stack of brilliant social critiques, Barbara Ehrenreich (Ph.D. cell biology) deals here with the futile and unpleasant attempts many of us undertake to avoid the undertaker. From expensive dietary fads to agonizing "senior fitness" routines, she kindly (and often hilariously) explains just how easy it is to become obsessed with



putting off the body's natural and inevitable breakdown. Her rationale to forgo, even after surviving breast cancer years ago, any kind of medical testing—even mammograms, even colonoscopies—is worth the price of the book. (But you get to read it for free!) The idea that "we are each individually responsible for our own health" can be a cruel lie, she shows, and yet this wise book ends with an assurance that peace and acceptance can accompany us to the end of our days, however many we get. Remember: quality beats quantity.

323. 1196 SOR Driving While Black: African American Travel and the Road to Civil Rights, by Gretchen Sorin

Buying a car and taking off on a road trip is every American's right, but Black people have historically endured trepidation about any journey. As one woman growing up during Jim Crow recalls, this involved "packing enough food for the entire trip (no restaurants), using the bathroom on the side of the road (no gas station restrooms), and sleeping



on the side of the road (no motels)." In her book, Sorin shows how early car ownership made it more difficult to enforce "racial apartheid," as well as how entrenched racism along the highway made travel not only difficult but dangerous for Black families. Eventually, guidebooks like *The Negro Travelers' Green Book* pointed the way to Black businesses, and some enlightened white ones, that welcomed them along the way, but we all know that even today, a flashing police light can descend into violence. This book is enlightening and at times humorous, and above all, a testament to the bravery and smarts of anyone who drives while Black in America.




